
LIHUE - A federal official aided by fishermen and volunteers Sunday removed a large ulua hook from the mouth of a young female Hawaiian monk

The seal swam near shore after the operation without apparent fear of the humans, said William Gilmartin, leader of the Marine Mammals and Endangered Species Program at the Honolulu Laboratory of the National Marine Fisheries Ser-

Gilmartin said campers, fishermen and others helped restrain the seal during the 10minute operation on a Kauai beach. The hook measured 2.75 inches by 1.75 inches. Gilmartin used a large pair of pliers to get it out.

Lihue veterinarian David Haas said he had heard stories that a shore fisherman had accidentally hooked a seal, and hauled it close enough to cut the wire leader.
