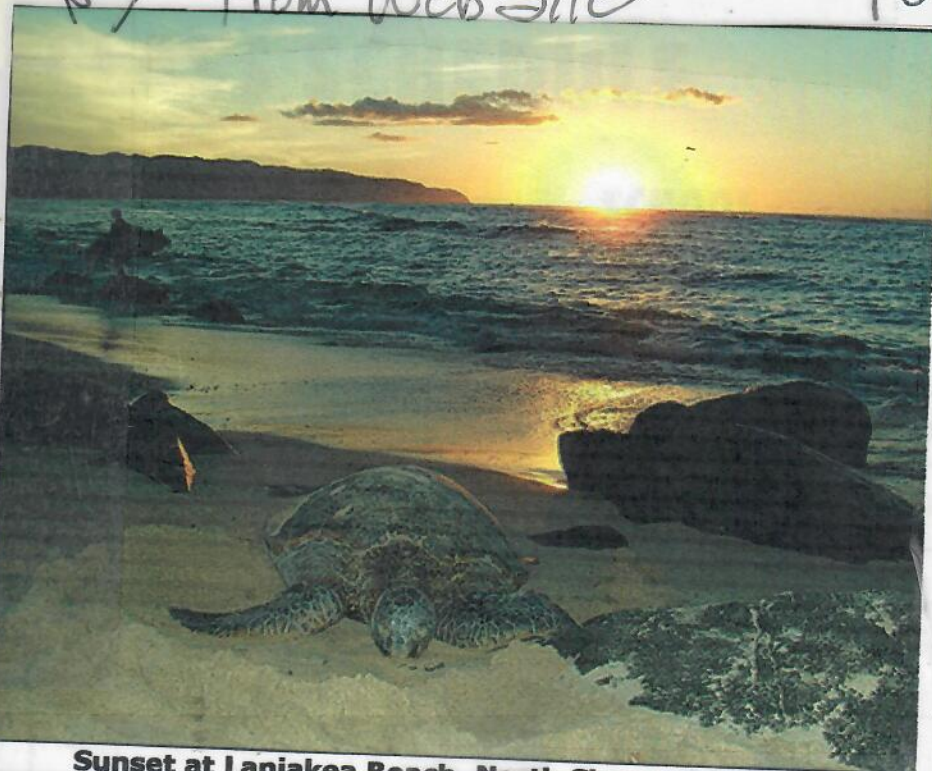

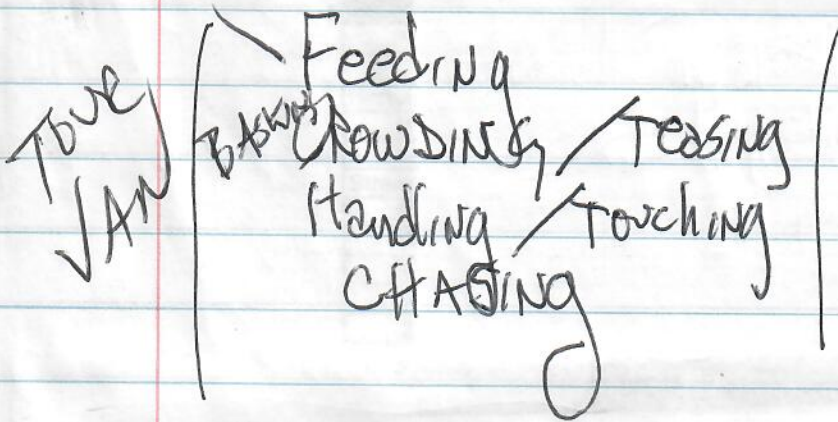

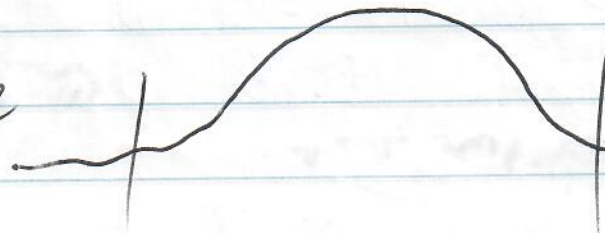

## Common Misunderstandings Revealed & Rectified

- When basking on the beach a turtle will lift its head to breathe every 4-8 mins. This is normal behavior and does not mean the turtle has been disturbed.

- When basking on the beach a turtle will often use its <sup>FRONT</sup> FLIPPERS TO TOSS SAND ON ITS BACK. THIS BEHAVIOR HELPS TO COOL THEM WHEN THEIR <sup>SHELL</sup> GETS TOO HOT. SAND ON A TURTLE'S BACK DOES NOT MEAN CHILDREN HAVE TRIED TO BUILD A "SAND CASTLE" OR HAVE THROWN SAND ON THE TURTLE.

- Turtles can often be seen swimming in shallow water very close to the sand beach at Laurika. The reasons for being there include 1) feeding on pieces of seaweed that <sup>naturally</sup> accumulate in the water column, 2) TRAVELING from one side of the cove to the other, and 3) <sup>CRAWLING</sup> preparing to come ashore to bask. People standing on the beach watching the turtles do not
