## Hawaiian Uses


Shell used for bark scraping, hair combs, and jewelry. Also harvested to be eaten.

Listed as endangered in 1986

Size: nesting females has declined by 48 – 67% in three generations

Peoples influences: small boat collisions, recreational fishing, nitrogen footprint causing fibropapillomatosis
