HISTORY: This turtle was found with missing head and front flippers at Makai Pier. Person reporting turtle saw a monk seal interacting with a green turtle ca. 1 mile north of the site and believes this particular turtle was the same one.

FINDINGS: Accession 1-green turtle immature male in fair body condition. This animal was missing both front flippers, the left rear flipper and the head. There was also bleeding in deep skeletal muscle and clotted blood near the stomach wall. The nature of the trauma indicated maceration of skeletal muscle with absence of evidence of classical shark-induced trauma such as jagged clean cuts of flesh and parallel scrape marks on the carapace.

MANAGEMENT:

COMMENTS: Gross lesions pointed to predator-induced trauma as cause of death. The nature of the lesions were not compatible with shark bite as evidenced by lack of clean lines of severance of tissues, lack of parallel scrape marks on the carapace, and lack of parallel scrapes on bones. The appearance of the tissues were more akin to a maceration-type action that would be effected by a large mammal (dog, seal). The fact this was a benthic non-nesting turtle and the absence of dogs in the immediate area argues against a dog being responsible for this trauma. The immediate history of seal-turtle interaction surrounding this death would implicate monk seal predation as the most likely cause of death.

HISTORY: This turtle was spotted thrashing in the water just offshore at Makaha Beach Park, Oahu on 29 July 2014. It was brought to shore and had many scrapes and bruises on the ventral and front head, both ventral front flippers and on the carapace. The turtle expired by the time MTRP personnel arrived. It is thought that this is the same turtle that was attacked by a monk seal two days prior. The MTRP ID date is 7/29/14.

FINDINGS: Accession 1-green turtle immature female in excellent body condition. Significant findings included multiple scratches and abrasions on the dorsal head and both front flippers. Internally, lungs were collapsed and histology revealed collapsed airways with accumulations of fluid.

MANAGEMENT:

COMMENTS: The animal had collapsed lungs suggesting of forced submergence but there was no immediate history of entanglement. There was evidence of external trauma (multiple scrapes) the origin of which could not be confirmed. Although it was thought this animal had interactions with monk seals previously, this could not be confirmed on necropsy.

 ${\tt HISTORY:}$ These green turtles were found dead between 4 March and 22 April 2017 on Oahu.

FINDINGS:

MANAGEMENT: Continued vigilance for animals with characteristic flipper lesions to better characterize monk seal turtle interactions.

COMMENTS: One turtle (4) likely died from shark predation. Two turtles (1 and 3) had lesions on the front flipper (partial traumatic laceration or amputation of caudal edge) compatible with those seen in other cases of monk seal interaction. The last turtle (2) had trauma but the lesions were not as characteristic as those of monk seal or shark interactions.
