Missing turtle transmitters sought

JAKARTA, Indonesia — Satellite transmitters glued to the back of a turtle released into the South China Sea last year are beaming signals from an Indonesian coastal town — and scientists are offering \$500 to anyone who can find them.

They believe the turtle — one of 12 released as part of an experiment to monitor their behavior — was illegally captured and killed for its meat. Still, scientists want to retrieve the devices to learn more about the threatened sea creatures.

"We are interested in bringing closure to this case," said C. H. Diong, a Singaporean zoologist taking part in the study. "We are only interested in the science, not the legality. We don't want to frighten anyone."

The Olive Ridley turtle, which can grow up to 2.5 feet long and weigh nearly 100 pounds, had two satellite-tracking devices about the size of a cigarette packet attached to its shell.

One gave out a final signal several weeks ago from a port town on the southern tip of Sumatra island, while the other continues to transmit from the coastal town of Krui, about 149 miles away.

The 12 turtles from three different species were raised in captivity and released to see how they would adapt in the wild. Findings will help in efforts to protect the creatures.

Diong said early data suggested that the animals did well in their natural environment: They had not lost their ability to swim long distances or dive deeply, and were headed in the direction of other populations of their species.

"We put them out there and they knew instinctively that it was their home," he said. "It was great to see them swim off speedily without hesitation."

The reward offer for "information on and return of the two transmitters" has been passed to wildlife officials in Indonesia, who plan to post flyers around Krui.

Drop in pirate attack cases in Malacca Strait

However, increase in raids in East Malaysian waters causes concern

WHILE pirate attacks in the Malacca Strait for the first six months of the year have dropped to their lowest level since 1999, incidents have surged in East Malaysian waters, triggered by thefts of tugs involving syndicate thieves disguised as crewmen.

The latest report from the International Maritime Bureau (IMB) issued yesterday called for the littoral states to guard against complacency as coun-

tries may compromise in the wake of fuel costs involved in frequent patrols.

The low incidence of attacks in the Malacca Strait will not change its status as a war risk area for the time being under Lloyd's categorisation for insurers.

Mr Neil Smith, the London-based secretary of Joint War Committee of the Lloyd's Market Association said: "We always take an interest in what the IMB reports say but we also get independent advice from third parties on what is going on in the Strait.

"We look at all aspects of the Strait and review our lists regularly."

Worldwide, there were 127 attacks, the same as for the first six months of last year.

There were 156 crew taken

hostage, 13 were kidnapped and six killed.

Indonesia recorded the highest number of attacks with 33, followed by Bangladesh which registered 22 incidents.

Although there were only three incidents in the Strait for the first six months, the sudden flare-up of three attacks early this month has caused concern.

Captain Noel Choong, director of the IMB's Kuala Lumpur-based Piracy Reporting Centre said there was serious concern as the pirates involved were heavily armed and appeared to be targeting hostages for ransom.

Two of these attacks involved UN aid relief ships and it is understood the marauders may have restricted their loot to some equipment and 14 million rupiah (\$\$2,500) when

they learned of the humanitarian mission of the vessels.

Capt Choong said that regular patrols were the key to deterring pirates and keeping the Strait incident-free.

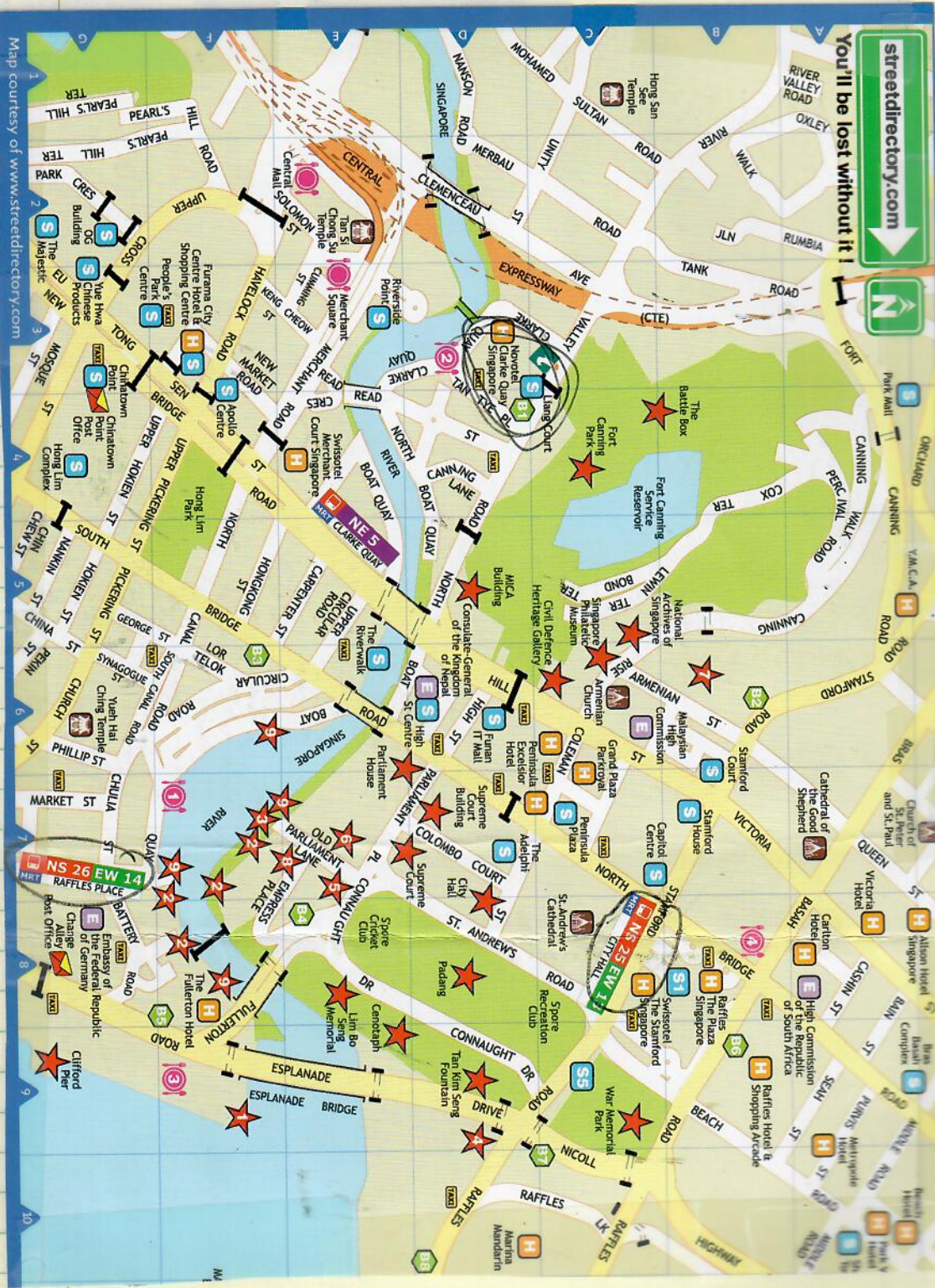
Since June last year, sustained Indonesian patrols under Operation Gurita helped keep the peace but it is unclear if fuel and resource costs have slowed down the pace.

Jakarta-based Navy spokesman Slamet Yulistiono said recently that the Indonesian military had no intention of reducing its daily patrols which replaced Operation Gurita.

But Indonesia has voiced a need for swift patrol boats with appropriate radar outfits to equal Singapore's capability in securing the Strait, the Antara news agency said last week.

ウミガメ回遊経路調査で名港水族館

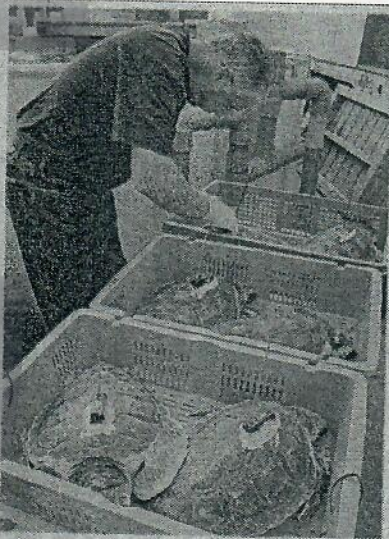
機送信にガメ子

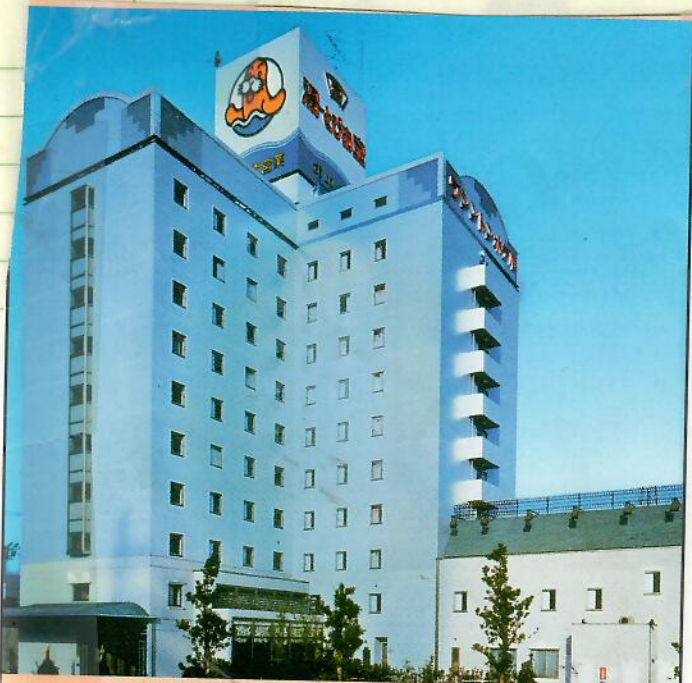

送信機を付けたウミガメの放流は昨年始まり、今回で四回目。同水族館生まれの一歳のアカウミガメ（甲長約三十センチ）十六匹と、昨春に八丈島沖で漁船の網にかかり、

同水族館によると、昨年四月に放流したアカウミガメ七匹のうち、ハワイの北西にいる一匹が最も遠方から情報を送り続けている。日本で生まれたアカウミガメは、米国西海岸に到達して成熟しながら戻り、その後は東シナ海で過ごすと考えられていたが、再び太平洋に向かう若い親がいることも分かり、生活圏も謎が多いという。

KEEPING TABS ON TURTLES

Twelve marine turtles from Sentosa's Underwater World will be released into the South China Sea today for a study on their migratory patterns. They will be tagged with satellite-tracking

devices for this project by the National Institute of Education (NIE), Nanyang Technological University and the United States' National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

The study will shed light on three turtle species. Of the 12, eight are green turtles, two are loggerheads, and the remaining two, Olive Ridley turtles.

The turtles will be released from a container ship north of Indonesia's Natuna island.

MAJAMI - Bebe is a message from my friend in Hong Kong. Maybe there is extra information here that will be helpful to you. George

Dear George,

This is what's written in the Chinese newspaper, I translate it as below:

The turtle was released in mid January 2007 by a Chinese nun of 82 years old. She knew from a businessman on 16.1.2007 that he was going to sell the turtle to a restaurant. She then spent RMB4500 (US\$560) to buy the turtle and bought it back to the monastery Puxinan in Xumin Town, Tsankong City, Guangdong. The turtle is 90cm in length and 256lbs in weight. The carapace was etched with the Chinese characters "Guangdong", "Puxinan" and "Xumin". It arrived in Chichijima on 14.5.2007 but could not lay eggs due to paucity of sand there. It was then transferred to the Ogasawara Marine Centre and laid 77 eggs. The Marine Centre recognized the etched characters with the help of a Chinese friend. They have used the Internet to find the characters and identify the Puxinan monastery in Guangdong, and later found out that it was released by the nun who is called "Xiw enjing" ("Xi" is the same first character of Buddha's name - "Xijiamouni", "wen" means "literal", "jing" means "respect"). The turtle was released by the nun in the presence of all members of the monastery in the afternoon of the following day. Puxinan has released a number of green sea turtle, but this is the biggest one they have saved and released. When Xiw enjing knew the whereabouts of the turtle, she said: "I am very happy to see that the turtle is safe in Japan". The Japanese researcher said that it is rare to find sea turtle released in China arriving in Chichijima, they will keep the turtle for observation for the time being and release it in August.

comment from my friend in HONG KONG:

I think the monastery is a traditional Buddhist monastery for nuns. The Xumin Town is a poor small town in Tsankong City of Guangdong. Tsankong is coastal city and from literature it was frequented by sea turtles. As the article said, they have released a number of sea turtles before, I think that this is a traditional way of doing something good as Buddhists by releasing wild animals back to the nature. And this kind of activities also happen in Hong Kong, in which Buddhists buy fish, insects, turtles, birds, frogs for release in the wild, especially around the time of Buddha's birthday.

Gifu Shouhouji Daibutsu (Great Buddha)

Kinpouzan Shouhouji is a temple affiliated with the Ohbakusan Manpukuji Temple in Uji City, Kyoto Prefecture. The 11th generation head priest of this temple, Priest Ichyuu, highly respected the Great Buddha of Todaiji Temple in Nara and thus around 1790 decided to erect a large image of Shaka Nyorai (Great Buddha) in hopes that large earthquakes and famine would not occur thereafter.

The central pillar of this Great Buddha is 1.8-meters in circumference and was constructed with ginkgo tree wood. Its framework was built from various types of wood while the Great Buddha's body was knitted together from many types of bamboo material. The surface of the Great Buddha was hardened with clay and covered with many great Buddhist scriptures.

As a final process, the surface was applied many times over in lacquer and plastered with golden leaves. Because priests and many others prayed for people's happiness by using Buddhist sutra scriptures, placing the many scriptures onto the body of the Great Buddha was very important in its construction.

However, a significantly large amount of Buddhist scriptures were necessary to completely cover all of the Great Buddha. Since Priest Ichyuu had very few students, he traveled by himself to collect sutras asking for contributions all around Japan.

Even the most distant trip to Shin-estu region (Nagano & Niigata Prefecture) was carried out on foot.

Although he spent 25 years working on the Great Buddha, he passed away in 1815 without seeing its completion.

With his predecessor in mind, Ichyuu's successor, the 12th generation head Priest Kohshuu completed its erection 13 years later. Thirty-eight years had passed since his predecessor's decision to construct the Great Buddha.

The noble messenger of the Owari feudal clan attended the completion ceremony of this Great Buddha. The turnout for the completion ceremony was as grand as when the famous 16th century ruler Oda Nobunaga gained control of Gifu and first moved into Gifu Castle.
