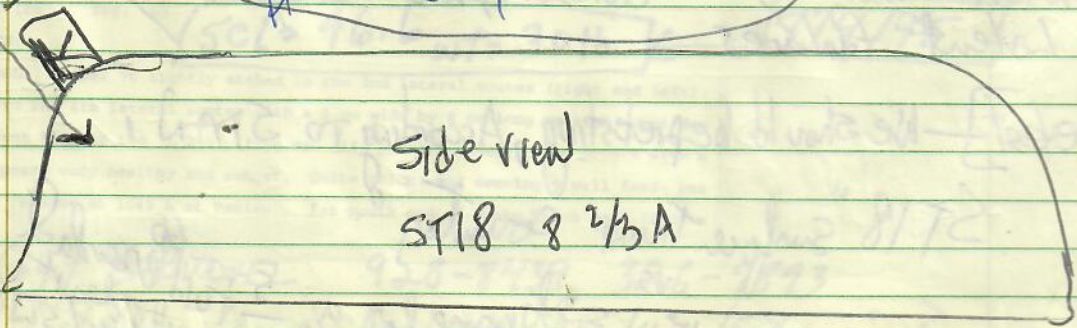

FIBERGLASS HAWAII SURFBOARD RESIN is specially formulated to prevent the yellowing of polyurethane foam surfboards.

SURFBOARD LAMINATING RESIN should be used in the application of the one or two layers of fiberglass cloth. The surface will remain tacky, and be difficult to sand.

SURFBOARD SANDING RESIN is used after the laminating resin to build up the resin thickness in preparation for sanding. It will dry with a hard surface, which can be sanded.

SURFBOARD FINISHING RESIN is used for the final gloss coat. It is sometimes thinned with styrene or acetone in order to flow out better. Any dull appearance (wax) may be removed by buffing with rubbing compound.

REPAIRING SURFBOARDS. .Sanding or finishing resin may be used for repairs. If more than one coat is needed, the wax must be sanded off before the next coat is applied.

MIXING THE RESIN. .To avoid waste, never mix more resin than can be used in a few minutes. Once mixed, it must be applied immediately. Use approximately 10 drops of catalyst per ounce, 1/4 ounce per pint or 2 ounces per gallon. Set-up time will vary depending on weather conditions, thickness of the layer of resin and materials added to the resin for coloring and thickening. Tests should be made before each use to determine amount of catalyst to use for desired set-up time. The final or gloss coat generally requires more catalyst. One gallon of resin will cover approximately 45 square feet of Fiberglass with three coats.

CAUTION. Contains organic solvent. Use with adequate ventilation. Avoid prolonged breathing of vapor. Avoid prolonged or repeated contact with skin. Keep cool to prolong shelf life.

We are proud to announce that the first SeaTurtleCam with live streaming video linkage to the Internet is now operating via microwave signal from a remote location in the Hawaiian Islands. Green turtles commonly crawl out at this special site to warm themselves by basking along a rocky shoreline. Two spherical cameras that we've named Maka (eye) and Mele (song) capture images daily as the turtles come to sleep ashore. Web browser software gives us remote control of pan, tilt and zoom capabilities for optimum observations. We envision that this experimental project will usher in exciting new approaches to research, monitoring, conservation outreach, and even classroom teaching. All of these avenues are currently being explored as uses for our SeaTurtleCam.

We will soon place another portable camera nearby at an underwater site used by turtles to be cleaned by fish. Longer term plans envision infrared cameras installed on an existing 15 m pole at East Island, French Frigate Shoals, to monitor seasonal nesting at this important Hawaiian green turtle rookery. Signals to earth-orbiting satellites will be the link to the Internet from this remote location.

Our SeaTurtleCam was brought into being through a partnership formed by the NMFS Honolulu Laboratory working with colleagues and friends Marc Rice of the Hawaii Preparatory Academy and Daniel Zatz of SeeMore Wildlife Systems. Also, Peter Bennett of <www.turtles.org> played an essential advisory role during the planning stages.

On May 11 my family was in Maui on a fishing boat. Although the fishing aspect of this event was not memorable we were lucky enough to find the "catch" of a lifetime.

At one point during our outing I thought I saw a sea turtle. I pointed it out and the first mate said it was most likely not a turtle because a sea turtle would have dived when we approached. The captain turned the boat around anyway so we could verify what it was we saw. It was, indeed, a sea turtle. However, when we approached a second time we could see that the turtle was having difficulty diving - and it was definitely trying to dive.

The first mate managed to pull the weighty turtle onto the boat. Our 9 year old daughter immediately named the turtle "Fred".

After the captain called ashore for instructions, we covered Fred's head and body with wet towels. A hose was run between the layers of the large towel so that we could keep Fred cool and wet. Every once in a while Fred would decide to trek around the small deck, at which point we all kept our digits at a safe distance.

When we came ashore we were met by several people from the National Marine Sanctuaries. I asked for a card or email address so that we could stay atop of Fred's recovery. Joylynn Oliveira was kind enough to share this information with me.

Yesterday I received an email from Joylynn with a status on Fred. It appears that Fred is not a green sea turtle, but an olive ridley. It also appears that your organization has been assisting Fred with his recovery and that he may be set free again in the next few weeks.

I shared this information with our children and they were so happy for Fred they almost cried. This experience has enriched our lives and taught us how important it is to take note of the world around us. It also taught us that everyone can make a difference.

I am writing this note for several reasons:

- 1) I took some pictures of Fred, but my camera was malfunctioning and the pictures did not come out at all (completely black). If at all possible I would like to see if it would be possible to get a copy of a picture of Fred. Email would be fine.
- 2) I wanted to share our families experience. Maybe you can use it in some way to help others know what a wonderful feeling it is to help any creature in need.
- 3) Finally, I wanted to thank you for sharing information about Fred and for nur-

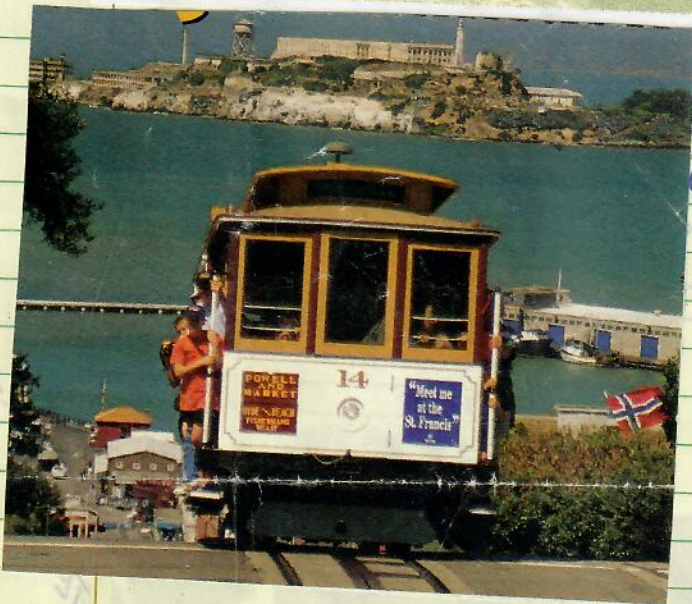

I agree that being first is important. (It was a prime motivation for us getting Trax online, and was instrumental in its success.) I think that focussing on the basking turtles is the best alternative, since it is daytime activity and unusual behaviour. Costs will be much lower than East because the communications link will be comparatively inexpensive. Once a good CoconutCam project is in place, I think you'll gain leverage for East at some future date.

Myopathy mean pathology of muscle (heart or skeletal). Capture myopathy is usually in skeletal muscle and consists of rapid necrosis of this tissue due to build up of lactic acid. This is most commonly encountered capture of ungulates and large game birds.

What are the sea turtles doing at a little lagoon named Wawamalu

Years ago people were killing turtles for food and for their shell. Since my dad started the Marine Sea Turtle Research Project more turtles have been appearing.

The purpose of my project is to find out if the sea turtles at Wawamalu are sleeping and/or feeding there by observing the water to watch for turtle heads and seeing what they are doing.

.Well, I told my dad that I was doing a sea turtle research project. So my dad told me that a study of Wawamalu would help him learn more about the place and the turtles. So that is why I did this project, to help my dad.

I crossed the road and went to the lagoon. I did this ten times altogether from October 1999 through January 2000. I watched for turtle heads in each section for 20 minutes. I recorded each turtle head I saw in my data entry book. I also recorded the time I saw the turtle head and the section that it was in.

The results of my project were that the turtles at Wawamalu are mostly feeding in Section C and resting in Section A. They are feeding in Section C. In Section A they are found resting at the bottom that is muddy and doesn't have algae to eat. I found seven kinds of algae in Section C by going in the water and looking through my Look Box.

Turtles at Wawamalu are just living their lives. The place where they sleep is like their bedroom.

Section C is like their dinner table. The little lagoon is like a house. The algae is their food.

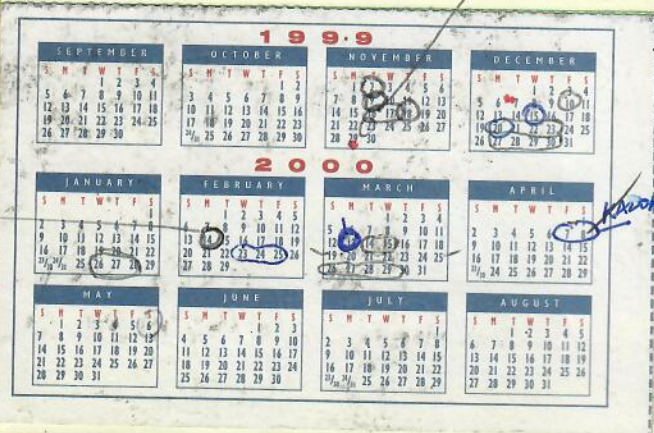

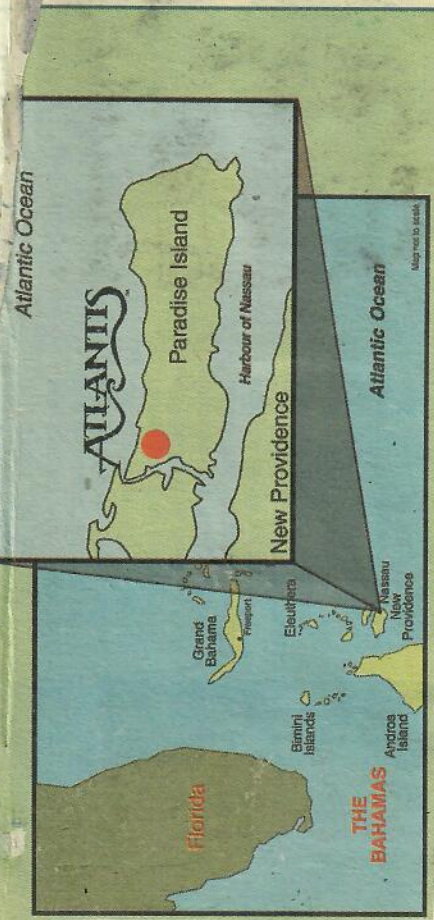

Sorry, I didn't answer your fill-in-the-blank message/question. No, I didn't have to think about it, even for a minute. I just decided not to answer. Not to tell you right away. The answer is now, as it always has been: ~~the~~ one, which are actually a number of days compressed by years into one. And those are: Tahiti, District of Paea, 1963-4 something like that, Balazs spear fishing, juvenile flies out from resting place on old concrete pier, 10 ft depth (never fired, turtle was too fast-- Only turtle seen while spear fishing/in the water there over a 5 month period); Bora Bora, month or so later, juvenile in wire pen on reef flat, wife and I walked out (100 yards or so) to see what the heck was in the pen (nope, didn't release it. Don't assume someone was going to or did eat it- people have them for prized pets all over the Pacific Islands; 1973- seeing them, their eyes, in the dark of night, alone on a lonely islet, 100's of miles from anywhere, moaning birds howling; 1969 Lahaina boat ramp- turtles being tossed into a pickup truck headed for restaurants to feed you tourists-- but you already know that story; circa 1974- staring at the petroglyph on a special boulder at a special location in Hawaii (see, they don't have to be Living Alive turtles, they can be their spirits- their mana)- that ones tattooed on my back now; 1976 walking Punaluu Black Sand Beach- realizing Kauiila still lives; and, 1992- being taken by a beautiful 40+ year old Tahitian woman to the 'mother of the island' stone in the interior, impossible to find without a guide like her, where many are fearful to go because of ghosts- tupaupuas. See the petroglyph turtles carved (living) on the stone, that I had stared at for years in Kenneth Emory's BP Museum book.

Swim with turtles, trumpet fish, uhu (parrotfish), moorish idols, several types of tang, moray eels, and many, many more, right off the shore at Kahalu'u Beach Park. The waters teem with marine life, and a mask and snorkel opens up this underwater world to even the most inexperienced swimmer. The waters are very gentle, protected by what remains of a breakwater built by early Hawaiians to aid in fish farming.

One day a turtle came all the way in to the "lava wading pool" area of the shoreline, delighting children and adults alike. Please don't touch; these endangered creatures existence is a delicate matter and you could be subject to fines. A little further out, you swim through schools of fish that barely move out of your way. For the experienced

divers, snorkelers, and swimmers, the shelving sand near the breakwater provides access to the open waters of the bay.

Kahalu'u became a beach park in 1966, and has all the amenities one needs. White sand, showers, restrooms, three pavilions, mask, snorkel and fin rentals, a lunch wagon, and of course, lifeguards. Normally a safe haven, high surf conditions can create a devastating rip current. In front of the pavilion is a mapped layout of the bay and its currents, and a key to some of the marine life within. When in doubt feel free to ask one of the friendly and ever alert lifeguards for assistance. Kahalu'u is a busy beachpark, but once you enter the underwater fantasy world of this tranquil bay, the clamor of humanity recedes to the distant background. Kahalu'u Beach Park is about 6 miles south of Kailua on Alii Drive

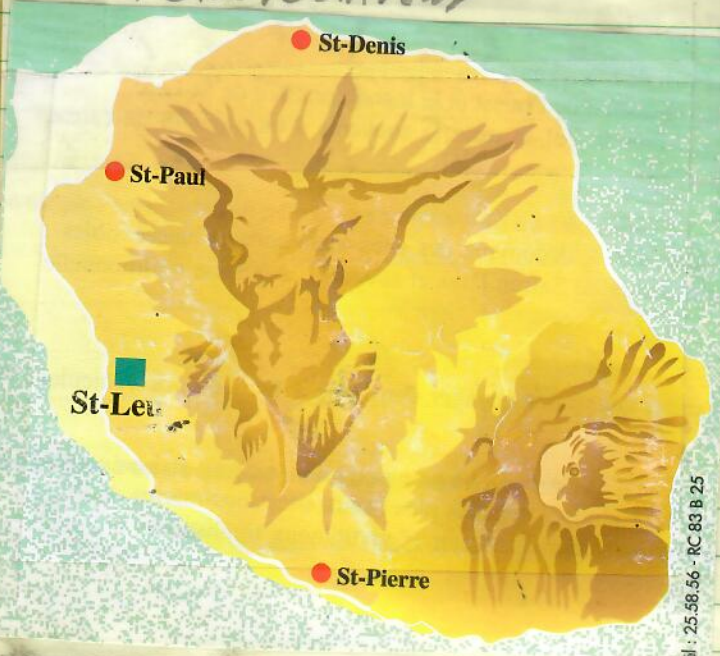

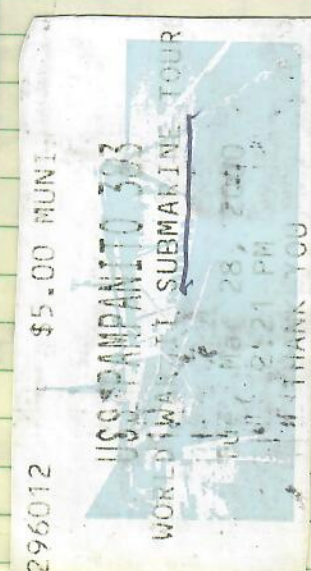
