

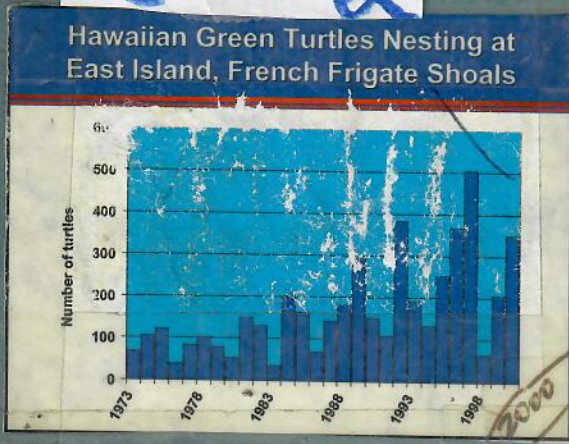

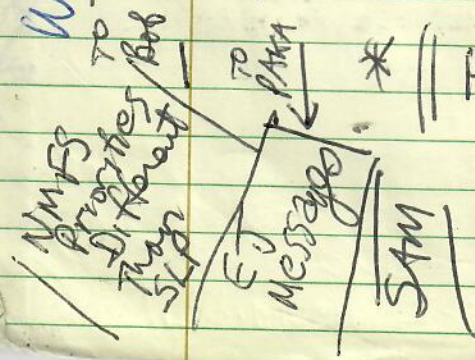

INVITATION EMAIL RE March 8 Meeting SLP

<< During the past several months all of you receiving this email have been aware of certain health concerns in captive hatched, captive reared Hawaiian green turtles at Sea Life Park and the Mauna Lani Bay Resort. In the past, young turtles judged to be healthy at these two facilities have been regularly released into the wild on the Kona Coast. This practice has been on-hold since last June, and existing animals have been in quarantine.

In an effort to scientifically address the health issues that have arisen, we invite you or your representative to attend a special meeting to be convened here at the NMFS Southwest Fisheries Science Center, Honolulu Laboratory on Thursday, March 8, 2001 starting at 800 am. The purpose of this small gathering of experts is to exchange and discuss clinical information and data relevant to the past and current health status of the turtles in question. It is the goal of this meeting to make recommendations, based on the best available data and expertise assembled, for the diagnosis, treatment, and future disposition of affected and other turtles. This goal has been established with the ultimate objective of promoting the safety and health-welfare of wild populations of all species of sea turtles in Hawaii and the Pacific. I am pleased to say that Dr. Bob Braun has agreed to guide the meeting discussions of veterinary medical issues, in co-leadership with Dr. Sam Pooley of our laboratory, a skilled facilitator of interactive planning sessions of this nature.

With the goal of sharing information and creating a comprehensive data base on this important issue, we ask that copies of all written

information relevant to the current and past status these turtles be sent to us by February 26th. This would include laboratory results/reports (including normal laboratory values for performed testing), medical records, including images as well as written observations/animal locations. The materials will be duplicated and complete sets distributed to each participant, hopefully by March 1st.

Please contact me as soon as possible to let me know if you or your representative(s) will be participating. We look forward to working with you.

I just wanted to give you a summary on my activities this morning as well as notes on other items:

LANIAKEA:
I headed out to Laniakea around quarter to nine and arrived around 9:30am. It was good weather, sunny with a few clouds. There were already some people on the beach (not too many), all locals from what I could tell. There was a family (wife and husband) with three kids in the water, two boys walking along the beach looking for fish, and a woman who had about four fishing poles in the sand. There were no turtles where the family was playing in the water (toward the right side of the beach).

After getting settled, I walked along the beach and went up to the woman fisherman (after picking up some tangled fishlines on the sand) and started a conversation asking how the fishing was going. I introduced myself and explained what I was doing there and gave her copies of both the Susan Scott article as well as the stickers (extra for her friends and family who also fished there). She was very friendly and told me that whenever she saw turtles that she brought her lines in. She said there were tons of turtles in this area.

I was about to return to the beachshore to do some turtle counts when I got a call from Shawn about a turtle stranding at Haleiwa beach park.

Distinguished Hawaii insect expert Jack Beardsley dies at 74

John W. "Jack" Beardsley, 74, died Feb. 5 at the Bishop Museum while in town to do the work he loved — studying insects.

The world-renowned Hawaii entomologist was distinguished as a researcher, teacher, mentor and author who contributed his expertise and assistance to the state and other countries.

Colleagues at the museum, University of Hawaii and state Department of Agriculture said his death leaves a "giant" hole in Hawaiian entomology.

"He took a lot of information with him," said museum entomologist Frank Howarth. "It takes a lifetime to become a world authority on a group of insects, then you hope to have a few years to write it all up." He said Beardsley, a specialist on parasitic wasps and scale insects, was working on several manuscripts about Hawaiian fauna.

"We're really going to miss him,

not only those of us here at the museum, but the entire state has depended on him so much," said Gordon Nishida, collections manager for natural sciences at the museum.

Beardsley joined the UH in 1963 as an assistant entomologist and professor. He chaired the Department of Entomology in the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources from 1981 until shortly before retiring in December 1991.

He had been a Bishop Museum research associate since 1955. After retiring, he moved to Arca-

dia, Calif., where he built a laboratory and continued to identify and describe insects. He loved Hawaii and returned often to work on projects, his colleagues said.

He had been working with Howarth and the agriculture department on an alien pest species risk assessment at Maui Airport and with Nishida on identifications for many insect groups in the Northwest Hawaiian Islands.

"He was quite an encyclopedia, not only on insects for also on plants," said Lyle Wong, state Plant Industry Division administrator. He was lead consultant on the Maui Airport study and arrived Feb. 4 to work on the project. He and Howarth spent the morning of Feb. 5 at the agriculture department. They then went to the museum's entomology department where Beardsley planned to eat a brown bag lunch and work.

"I had a long talk with him while he was getting ready for lunch and left to go back to the Department of Agriculture," Howarth said. "He was in wonderful spirits when

I left. He apparently passed away moments after I left."

Beardsley studied insect pests in many countries and was internationally known for his research on pineapple and sugarcane mealybugs and natural enemies.

He was from California and came to Hawaii in the U.S. Navy from 1944-46. While doing graduate work at UH, he served as entomologist for the U.S. Trust Territory of the Pacific (Micronesia), Korea, Balaui and Caroline Islands. Returning to Hawaii, he worked as an entomologist for the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association.

"He was an exceptional entomologist and one of the old-time naturalists," said Larry Nakahara, another of Beardsley's students, now chief of the agriculture department's Plant Pest Control Branch. "They are few and far between."

He was a prolific author, with more than 650 scientific articles and published notes on new immigrant insects and records.

He received the society's first Award for Outstanding Service in 1991 and its Lifetime Excellence in Entomology Award in 1995. Survivors include his wife, Peg-

gy; sons, John of Hawaii and Steven of Utah; daughters Laurel Breault of Utah, and Claire Leary of Hawaii; sister Nancy, and brother Edward, both of the Morro Bay area, California.

Memorial services will be held from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday in the Bishop Museum's Atherton Hall, 1525 Bernice St. Casual attire. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested donations be made to the John W. Beardsley Fund to be established at the University of Hawaii Foundation, 2444 Dole St., and the Bishop Museum to advance his efforts in entomology.

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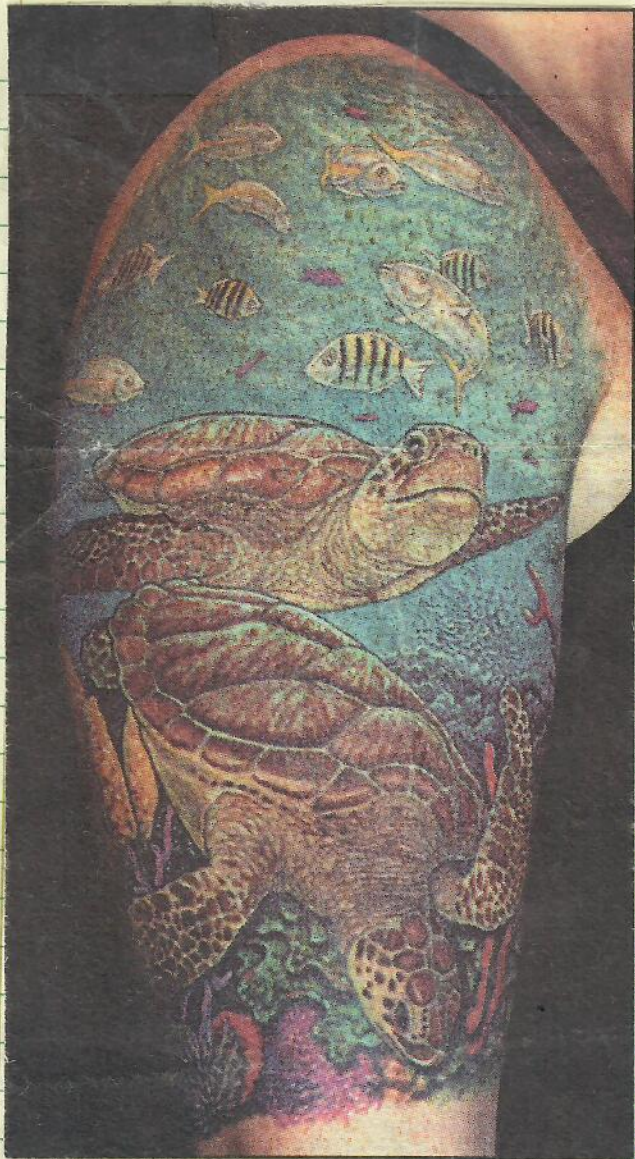
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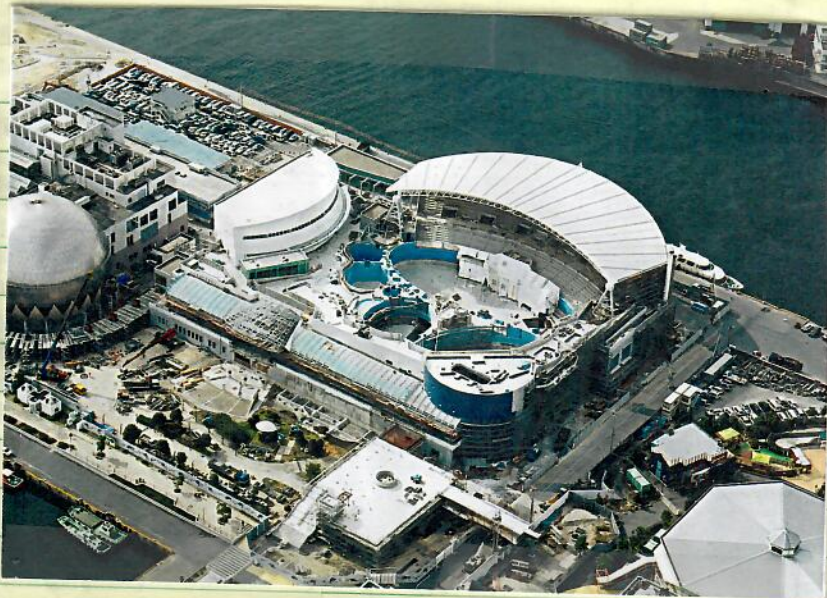
Shell Game

On Australia's Mast Head Islet visitors engaged the local fauna in a "turtle derby" by climbing upon the shells of sleeping green turtles. "Thus surprised, they scrambled over the sand, plowing quaint furrows with their flippers. . . . Once in fairly deep water, the turtle won the game. A dive unseated the rider, who splashed ashore for another little joyride to the sea," wrote Charles Barrett in our September 1930 article "The Great Barrier Reef and Its Isles," where this photograph was first published.

The riders' reins did less damage than another local specialty, according to the article. "A turtle-soup factory, established . . . many years ago, still carries on business. During a recent season 36,000 tins of soup, representing about 1,000 turtles, were manufactured in this lonely place."

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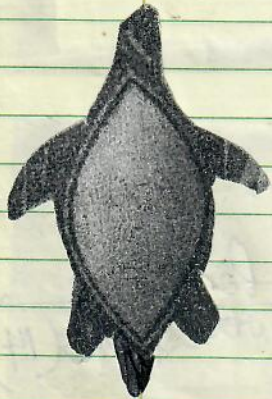
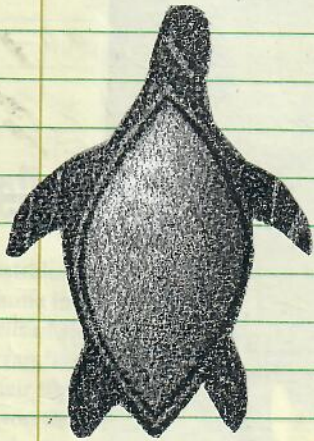
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hard work and talent finally won Cousteau's respect and admiration.

If the experience of diving with Cousteau was exhilarating, it could be equally frustrating. Underwater photography was in its infancy, and equipment was crude. Marden used a camera locked in a watertight box and used up more than a thousand flashbulbs, which often imploded under the pressure, twice gashing his hands. One implosion at a hundred feet, he wrote, "drove the glass through my heavy leather glove with the impetus of a shot from a gun." His diving partner pulled out the shard. To protect his hands on future dives, he bought a pair of chain mail gloves of the kind used by butchers.

His story "Camera Under the Sea," which ran in February 1956, was the first full-length underwater feature illustrated in color, and in his words and photographs you can feel his love of that blue world. "The luminous transparency of the warm water bathed me in light. Fish, corals, even my own body, were outlined with a soft lunar effulgence; I seemed to hang suspended in the heart of an enormous liquid sapphire," he wrote.

LUIS ALWAYS MIXED his fantasies with reality," commented Bates Littlehales. "He would just hunt those fantasies down and make them fit the situation. In another era he could not have done it. It takes a tremendous amount of trust and support from your editors."

Soñar no cuesta nada, dreaming costs nothing, he might say. One of his longest held dreams was of finding the remains of the *Bounty*. He thought Bligh's trip across 3,618 nautical miles of Pacific in an open boat without losing a single man the greatest feat of navigation ever. He'd seen the rudder in a Fiji museum in 1954 and learned it had been dug out of waters off Pitcairn Island. He was sure there was more of the *Bounty* to be found.

To see and savor the Earth—and to take generations of readers along for the ride—were the gifts of Marden's inquisitive mind and prodigious talent. Readers relished those journeys, and editors had enough sense to give slack rein to the lead rider. Luis Marden was the quintessential NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC journalist.

For two years he badgered the editors to let him go to Pitcairn and search, and finally in 1956 Melville Bell Grosvenor, who understood enthusiasm when he saw it and who knew how to say "yes," sent him off.

Day after day he dove near the spot where the rudder had been found. "For six weeks we nearly plowed furrows in the bottom with our chins, but found nothing," he recalled. Finally, late one afternoon near the end of his stay, he was diving with Len Christian, one of mutineer Fletcher Christian's descendants, and swam over a sandy trench with wormlike squiggles. In "I Found the Bones of the *Bounty*" (a title the self-effacing Marden would never dream of writing), he describes the moment of discovery:

"I thrust my face closer, almost touching the bottom. My heart gave a jump. The squiggles were encrusted sheathing nails, *Bounty* nails—dozens of them. I looked up for Len. He was just above me, staring questioningly. I reached up my hand for his, pumped it violently, and pointed. He looked up grinning and nodding, and we shook hands again. We had found the resting place of the *Bounty*."

THE LINE BETWEEN Luis Marden's life and the NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC blurred early; the two soon became a seamless whole. Love is not too strong a word to describe how he feels about the magazine that engaged his head and heart for half a century. "The GEOGRAPHIC has been my father and mother, my residence, my castle," he told an interviewer.

We may chart our life. We may sail for distant ports, finding fresh wonder in the far reaches of the world. Eventually, the rudder slips from our hand. Time weakens us. Fate overtakes us. We drift, becalmed. These days Luis Marden lives in a nursing home.

"I've had the best of it," he recently told a close friend. "It's time to zip up and shut the rest of the world out." And he had tasted the best of it, through sheer force of will, an intellect of extraordinary breadth and depth, and an imagination that soared.

"One lifetime isn't enough," Marden once said. "Just when you start to learn, it's time to go." □

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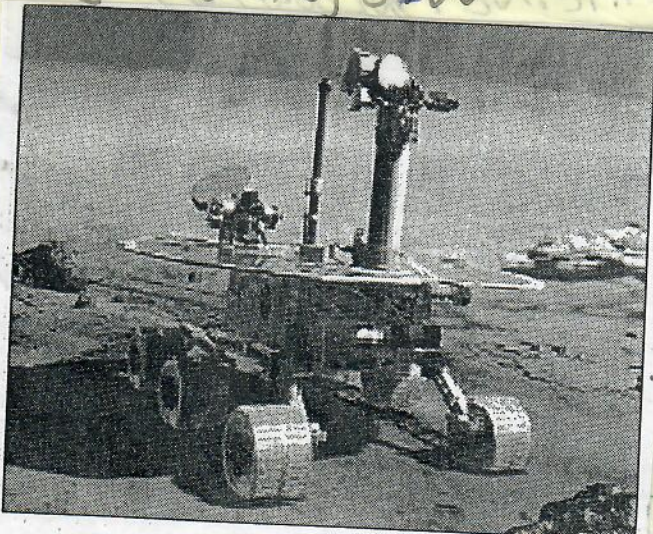

Hilo Bay survey shows more artillery rounds

over the next two weeks, fishing and recreational activities will be redirected and an 800-yard safety zone will be established once the ordnance has been corralled for demolition. The explosives are scattered over an area of the ocean floor 360 yards wide by 160 yards, about a third of a mile beyond the breakwater.

Commercial shipping lanes should be unaffected, Coast Guard officials said, causing no impact on Big Island commerce. The cleanup also is unlikely to affect surfers, kayakers, canoe paddlers or fishing enthusiasts in the inner harbor or at Honoli'i surfing beach on the north end of the bay.

The rounds are at a depth of 40 to 80 feet and sit on top of a thin layer of sand and silt covering a Mauna Loa lava flow. There are some small coral deposits in the area but not much marine life because of the heavy surge that typically pounds the breakwater.

Navy crews from San Diego and Pearl Harbor are working with state, federal and county agencies on the project. The tug boat USNS Navajo from San Diego is providing a staging platform. Detonations will be conducted in clusters of four or five rounds at a time over five or six days. That schedule is seen as less disruptive than trying to set off large explosions or destroying the rounds one piece at a time.

Robert Nishimoto, a state aquatics resources expert, said he believes the plan provides the best compromise possible for the safe disposal of the ordnance with the least amount of upset to the offshore environment.

NORTH SHORE 9-18-00 2 rescued in high surf

North Shore lifeguards and firefighters from the Sunset Beach station rescued two bodyboarders yesterday afternoon at Three Tables.

Fire officials said a man and woman were bodyboarding near shore around 2:30 p.m. when they were swept out by currents. A bystander reported the emergency at the fire station at Three Tables. The bodyboarders were brought to shore safely.

At Waimea Bay yesterday afternoon, a man dislocated his shoulder in the shorebreak, and another may have broken his leg jumping from the rock in the bay's southern corner.

North Shore waves reached 8 feet over the weekend, marking the start of the area's surfing season.

son. Lifeguard Lt. John Hoogsteden reminded beachgoers to listen to media reports on wave conditions and to be careful. "Ask the lifeguards about conditions at any particular beach," Hoogsteden said. "Be aware that they can change rapidly, and we can have this kind of surf activity for the next nine months."

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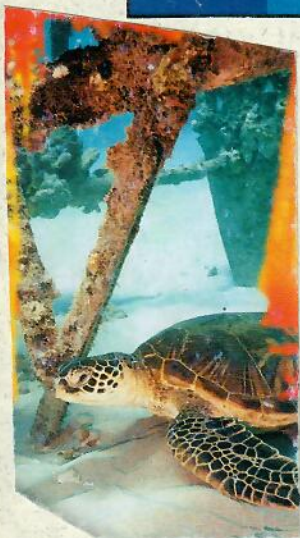

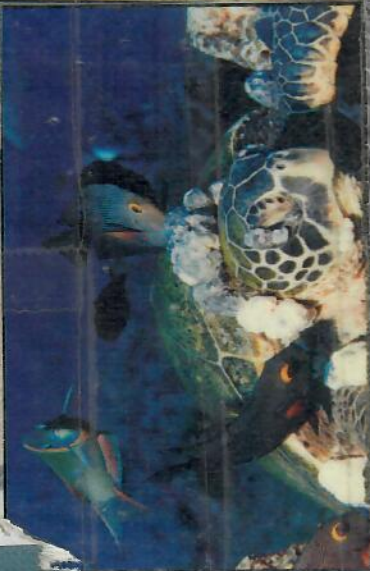
