**Do endangered green
sea turtles really matter?**

While enjoying my vacation at the Wailea Marriott the morning of May 21, I observed a green sea turtle floating on the surface about 75 yards offshore. The turtle was floating on the surface the entire day.

To my horror, the next day the turtle was still floating in the same area. I decided to get my snorkel gear and go to see if the turtle was OK. I was shocked to see the turtle dive down about three feet and then bob back up, bottom first, like a cork.

I notified the hotel employees to call the Maui Ocean Center for assistance. We were told by the Ocean Center to contact the stranded turtle rescue group. I was told they would pass on the information and "try" to get someone to help.

I am from Florida and there they respond to distressed wildlife right away no matter what it is. The next day, the turtle was still floating in the water. The rescue group did arrive that morning to observe and said they would get a boat and get the turtle some help. The day went by and no boat! I received a call and they said the boats were dry docked and if I could find someone with a boat they could go out to get it.

I did find a boat and left messages but, as of this writing, still no response.

Sea turtle's case of bad gas has a happy ending

WAILEA — A green sea turtle suffered from gas so much that it couldn't dive down to lunch and then defied rescue for three days. Tourists were alarmed, but the tale had a happy ending.

"My body is extremely sore the last four days," says Bo Blinski, a sports teacher at the spa at the Grand Wailea Resort Hotel and veteran turtle volunteer, after a long and potentially dangerous struggle to get the turtle ashore.

The "excessively buoyant" turtle was spotted May 22 about 100 yards off the Wailea Marriott and reported to the Marine Turtle Research Program, which maintains a watch for stranded

turtles.

The problem was, this turtle — described by Blinski as good-sized but not exceptionally large (it was later weighed at 110 pounds) — declined to be stranded.

Blinski swam out and tried to shove and guide the turtle to shore. No dice.

Since 1990 the turtle program of the National Marine Fisheries Service's Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center and its helpers have salvaged, treated, saved and successfully released back into the ocean more than 400 stranded sea turtles in the Hawaiian Islands.

Usually, it's just a matter of a couple

of strong backs lifting a turtle off the beach into a pickup truck for a trip to the airport and a quick flight to Oahu. The program doesn't even have a boat.

Throughout the day on May 23, even tourists could tell something was wrong with the turtle. It could dive but it couldn't stay down long.

Ka'au Abraham of the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary office in Kihei was checking on the turtle, which was sometimes difficult to track, and visitors to the resort were wondering why no one was helping the turtle.

Meanwhile, Maui turtle volunteers were wondering how to do that.

Blinski was concerned that a distressed turtle might be "shark bait or dangerous for a boat."

In Honolulu, George Balazs, leader of the Marine Turtle Research Program, was also wary about sending someone into the water, in case sharks might be prowling. An unconfirmed report said a shark was seen.

Blinski says he was "not really concerned" about sharks. Before making his next attempt, he surveyed the water carefully through binoculars.

"I've dealt with worse sharks on land than in the sea," he commented.

So he went out in his kayak and spent 40 minutes trying to corral the turtle.

Blinski knew he needed help. He's not a big guy, and he knew "there was no way I could lift it."

He recruited a beefier kayak guide, whom he knew only as Anthony, "a good guy," and they tried.

Still no success. So on Wednesday, May 24, they recruited an activity company Zodiac and its crew of two.

Even with all that help, it still took about an hour to haul the flailing and frantic turtle over the side.

Blinski realized the turtle was afraid of the kayak and the boat. So he had the Zodiac shut down its engine and steered the turtle to face away from the boat, where it couldn't see it.

Then he and Anthony backed the turtle up to the boat and with the crew hauling and them heaving, got it aboard.

By noon Wednesday, the turtle was on the way to a veterinarian on Oahu, Dr. Robert Morris. An X-ray revealed a gas-filled gastrointestinal tract.

Morris gave the turtle antibiotics and transferred it to a tank at Kewalo Basin, where it remains "excessively buoyant" but with a good prognosis.

All's well that ends well, Balazs says.

"The ocean is a place where things get bitten at times, that is, big things biting smaller things.



"A turtle in distress is a sad circumstance, but it can also be an attractant to large predators. We balance all aspects — turtle's well-being versus human's well-being" before taking risks, he says.

"I was lucky enough to get people interested," says Blinski, who hopes the rescue will help educate people to the situation of the Hawaiian green sea turtles, which are listed as a threatened species.

Sea turtles both familiar and mysterious

LAST WEEK, I drove to the North Shore to visit some friends I haven't seen in seven months. Since they were eating when I arrived, and still eating when I left, I didn't see much of them. I saw enough, though, to know they are being loved and protected as much as ever.

My friends are the sea turtles of Laniakea that occasionally lie on the beach there. Workers have tagged about 20 in that bay, and about 10 of those regularly crawl onto the sand and sleep.

Or not. Some days, like last week when I was there, none hauled out at all.

"When will the turtles come out?" visitors asked us volunteer guardians. No one knows.

"Why do they come out?" they wanted to know. We don't know that, either.

Researchers don't know where or how green sea turtles spend the first two years of their lives.

"What's special about this particular place?" Another unknown.

Given that thousands of turtles swim in Hawaii's waters today, it seems odd that so much about them is still a mystery. Researchers, for instance, don't know how or where juveniles spend their first few years.

Turtle hatchlings, which fit in the palm of your hand, run to the sea right after hatching and, four to six years later, show up on coastlines about dinner-plate size. No one knows what happens in between.

In an effort to find out, NMFS workers raised four Hawaiian green turtles hatched at Sea Life Park. Last month, biologists attached satellite tags to the 2-year-olds and released them from the cruise ship *Pride of Hawaii* about 10 miles north of Kauai.

By tracking the turtles' paths, researchers hope to learn where the youngsters go. This would help biologists better understand what's important to the survival of baby turtles. It might also help fishermen steer clear of dense turtle areas.

Green sea turtles are native to warm waters throughout the world's oceans, but they regularly sleep on beaches in only two island groups: the Galapagos Islands and, lucky us, Hawaii.

We're also lucky to have an active, successful, ongoing turtle conservation program for the past 30 years. Thanks to the leadership of federal turtle biologist George Balazs, turtles seem to be everywhere in Hawaii waters today.

It's so common to see turtles here now that it's easy to think they are common everywhere.

Not so. Green sea turtles in other nations have minimal protection, if any, and are surprisingly scarce. I asked Scott, one of my crew members on my recent South Pacific voyage, "How many turtles did we see between Tahiti and Australia?"

He thought a minute. "Two. No, wait. Three, I think." I also remember only three sightings.

Inside Australia's Great Barrier Reef, though, that number changed dramatically. Turtles are so abundant in that national marine park that we saw them from the boat nearly every day.

There is still much to learn about sea turtles, but from my own observation, two facts stand out: One is that turtle conservation programs work, and the other is that Hawaii has a good one.

The turtles of Laniakea should make us all proud.

Tiger shark sighting closes Lahaina beach

WAILUKU >> A 2-mile stretch of Lahaina beach was closed for two hours yesterday after a shark sighting.

The tiger shark, about 18 to 20 feet long, was first seen between 9:30 and 10 a.m. next to Mala Wharf, where it was eating a turtle weighing more than 200 pounds, said Archie Kalepa, a county ocean safety supervisor.

"It was tremendous," Kalepa said.

Kalepa said the shark was so big that some bystanders thought it was a great white.

He said some Lahaina residents reported having seen the shark outside the reef while they were paddling a canoe, but never inside the reef.

Shoreline areas from Hanakoo Beach Park to Baby Beach were closed from 10 a.m. to noon yesterday after the shark was sighted along the coastline, a state official said.

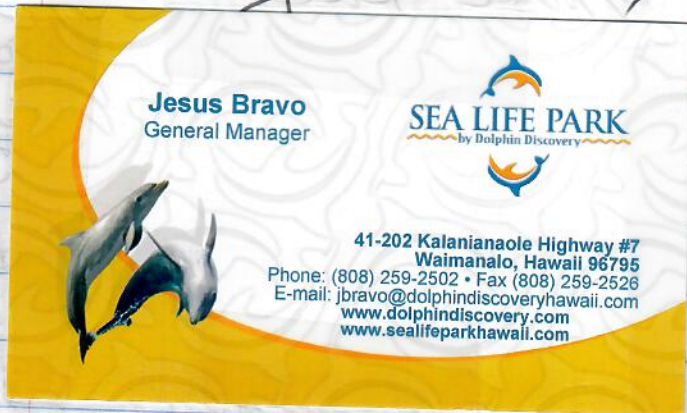
