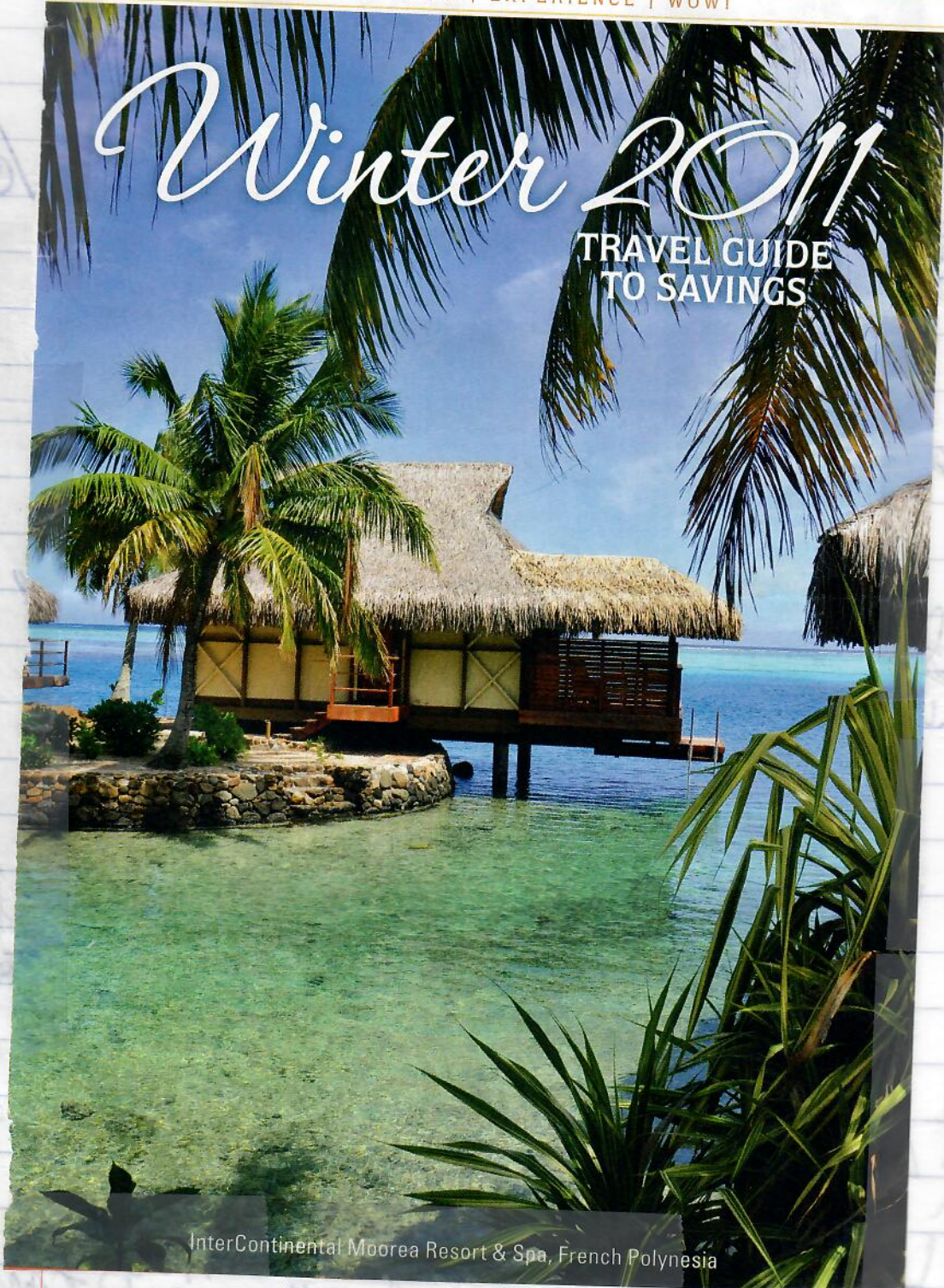

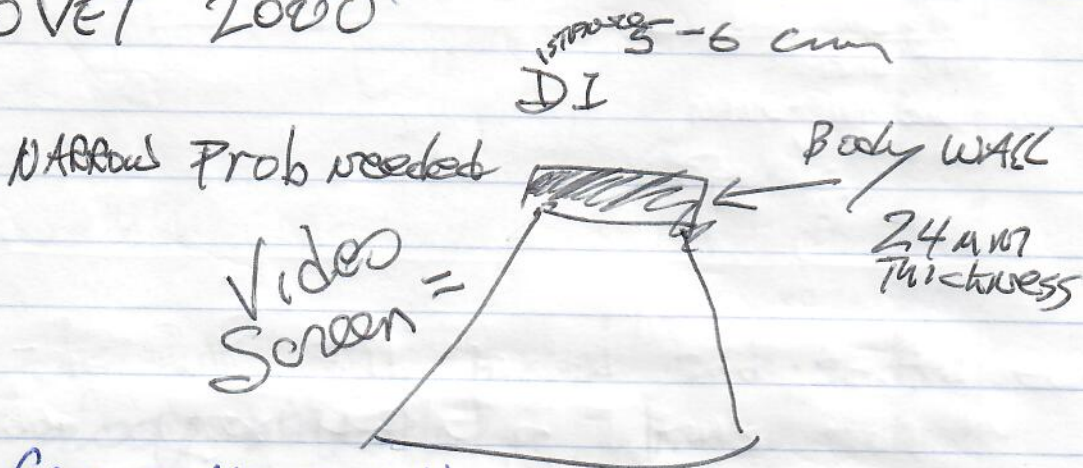

A LIFELONG RELATIONSHIP WITH HAWAIIAN AND FRENCH POLYNESIAN GREEN TURTLES, 1963-2011

The story of green turtles being restored in the Hawaiian Islands during recent times has been heralded in several scientific and popular publications, but perhaps most eloquently in "The Book of Honu" and on the Turtle Trax web page <[www.turtles.org](http://www.turtles.org)> authored by Peter Bennett and Ursula Keuper-Bennett. Less known to most is the past and present complexities of the green turtles of French Polynesia, where they are also called honu. The bond between the native peoples and honu of the far-flung islands of French Polynesia continues to be deep-rooted, diverse, and intense, likely as previously existed in Hawaii, and may happen again, as the honu population of Hawaii proceeds upward and the tumor disease continues in decline. My relationship with green turtles began in French Polynesia in 1963 and evolved, through a series of lucky events, into a 38-year endeavor focused in the Hawaiian Archipelago.

In 1963, my wife Linda and I sold our possessions, emptied our small bank account, and left California to experience life in the South Seas among the people of Tahiti. Our journey there included a week in Hawaii before flying to the newly-opened jet airport near Papeete. Through the kindness of strangers, for seven months we subsisted in the then-outlier District of Paea in Tahiti. Visa limitations eventually returned us to California on a cargo ship via Nuku Hiva in the Marquesas and Panama. A few months later, we were back in Hawaii building a life, family, and careers that endure to the present.

I saw my first sea turtle in Tahiti, a juvenile honu that would have been dinner if not for my poor aim as a spear fisher. Later, walking the shoreline of Bora Bora with Linda, I saw my second sea turtle kept as a pet in a pen on the reef flat. I regularly still dream about French Polynesian people, islands, and turtles, as the natives still dream at night when an ancestor tells them where a turtle can be caught the next day on the reef. Since leaving in 1964 I've returned to French Polynesia on six short trips, five by invitation to assist with sea turtle studies, and once with Linda for a brief stop on a cruise vacation to Sydney. The most memorable visit was in 1991 to remote Scilly Atoll to work with Rene Tuputu and family, Rene being one of the most knowledgeable turtle hunters of the region. My most recent visit was in October 2010 as part of the "First International Symposium on Sea Turtles in French Polynesia" where Rene Tuputu and I met again after 20 years.

There is great potential for traditional ties with the honu to persist, on a sustainable basis, among the people of French Polynesia. The status of the stocks and the sustainability of the harvest need to be examined within the cultural context of island communities. I am committed to playing a role in aiding both the honu and the people in their interwoven relationships.

De multiples raisons peuvent conduire à mettre en place une aire marine protégée, car elles ont des effets positifs reconnus :

- **intérêt écologique** : la densité, la biomasse, la taille et la diversité de la majorité des espèces et écosystèmes y sont plus importantes que dans les régions non couvertes par une AMP ; elles permettent en outre d'avoir un suivi régulier d'une zone ;
- **intérêt touristique** : maintien de l'état des paysages littoraux et sous-marins ;

- **intérêt culturel et éducatif** : sites préservés pour les populations (ex : parc à poissons traditionnel, épaves, mise en place de sentiers sous-marins et de programmes pédagogiques) ;
  - **intérêt halieutique** : restauration des ressources halieutiques et maintien de la qualité des eaux (intérêt pour la pêche et l'aquaculture dans les zones adjacentes, intérêt pour les populations vivant à proximité) ;
  - **intérêt socio-économique** : gérer des conflits d'usages en mer, renforcer la place des populations locales dans la gestion de l'espace côtier, etc.
- Ainsi, en plus de la préservation de l'environnement,

les AMP entraînent des retombées positives sur les pêches dans les secteurs périphériques et des avantages sociaux (économiques, éducatifs, touristiques). Pour ces raisons, les AMP sont considérées comme un outil indispensable pour une gestion durable du milieu marin.

• **L'effet réserve ou débordement** ou encore "spillover effect" : il est reconnu qu'une zone marine protégée (réserve intégrale ou non) induit des effets positifs sur les zones adjacentes.

# Deux jours p sous la carapa

**M**atthieu Petit, biologiste au sein de l'association Te mana o te moana, a présenté au comité permanent du Plan de gestion de l'espace maritime de Moorea (PGEM), la tenue d'un symposium international sur les tortues de Polynésie française.

Il aura lieu les 26 et 27 octobre à l'InterContinental.

Cent vingt participants sont attendus, dont cinq scientifiques internationaux, des autorités administratives, la douane, la gendarmerie, des représentants des pêcheurs, d'associations diverses, des représentants des prestataires et des particuliers. L'objectif de ce symposium, explique Matthieu Petit, est d'établir un bilan complet des actions déjà entreprises et les besoins pour l'avenir.

*"Nous souhaitons pouvoir définir des priorités locales afin d'aboutir à des propositions d'actions en faisant collaborer les acteurs locaux".*

Ainsi, plusieurs missions devraient être définies sur six îles sélectionnées : Moorea, Tetiaroa, Maiao, Tupai, Maupiti et Bora Bora. Elles seront menées en mer sous la forme d'observations le long des barrières de corail, ainsi que sur terre pour le repérage et la protection des zones de pontes.

Il existe en Polynésie française cinq espèces de tortues, notam-

ment les "imbriquées" et les "vertes". Selon le biologiste, très peu d'études ont été faites sur ce reptile, donc il existe très peu d'indications sur les stocks, les migrations ou la reproduction. 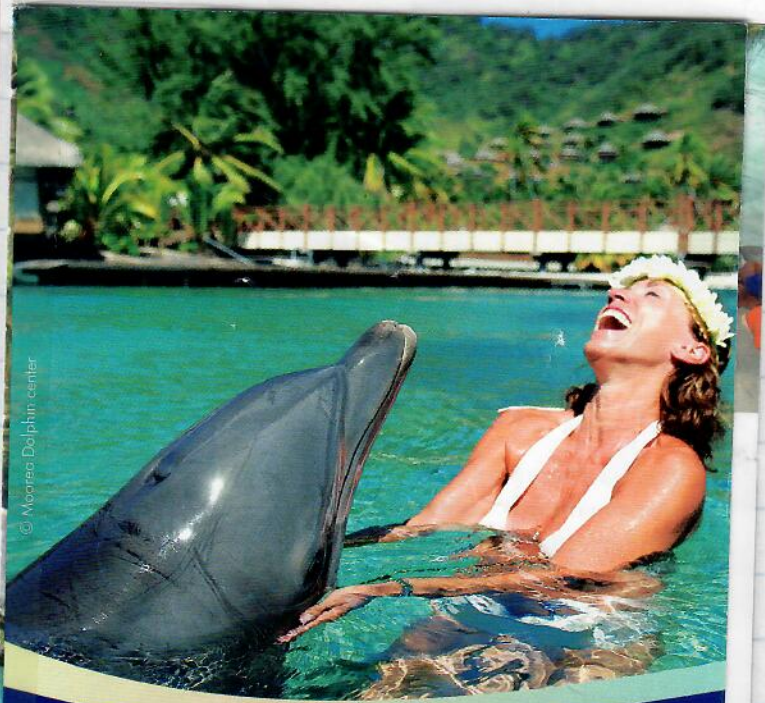

# MAUPITI

Located 50 km (31 miles) away from Bora Bora, Maupiti is the most remote of the Leeward Islands. Before the arrival of the Europeans its name was Vaitu, it was then changed to Maurua and finally to Maupiti, which means «Two Mountains». Very few tourists are seen there. The island's people and its «pensions» await you with a traditional and warm welcome. The Maupiti Express ensures regular link from Bora Bora. With a surface of 12 km<sup>2</sup> (4.6 square miles), the island counts slightly more than a thousand inhabitants. Its highest point is Mount Te Uru Faatiu (385 m / 1,280 ft). Maupiti features very old archeological sites, among which the marae Vaihau in Vaiea. In the mountain, you will discover famous petroglyphs hidden in the bed of the only river, the Haranai, on the Northeast side of the island. A walk around the island of Maupiti takes only three hours. Do not miss the famous white sand beach of Tereia from where you can walk to Motu Aira and the Mount Pahahere vista point. In Maupiti, you will also encounter sacred aigrettes but also stingrays and varos (squills) which you'll get a chance to taste. As for the lagoon, it is gorgeous. It is shallow and shelters five large and mostly desert motus to bring happiness to those who like tranquility and beauty.»

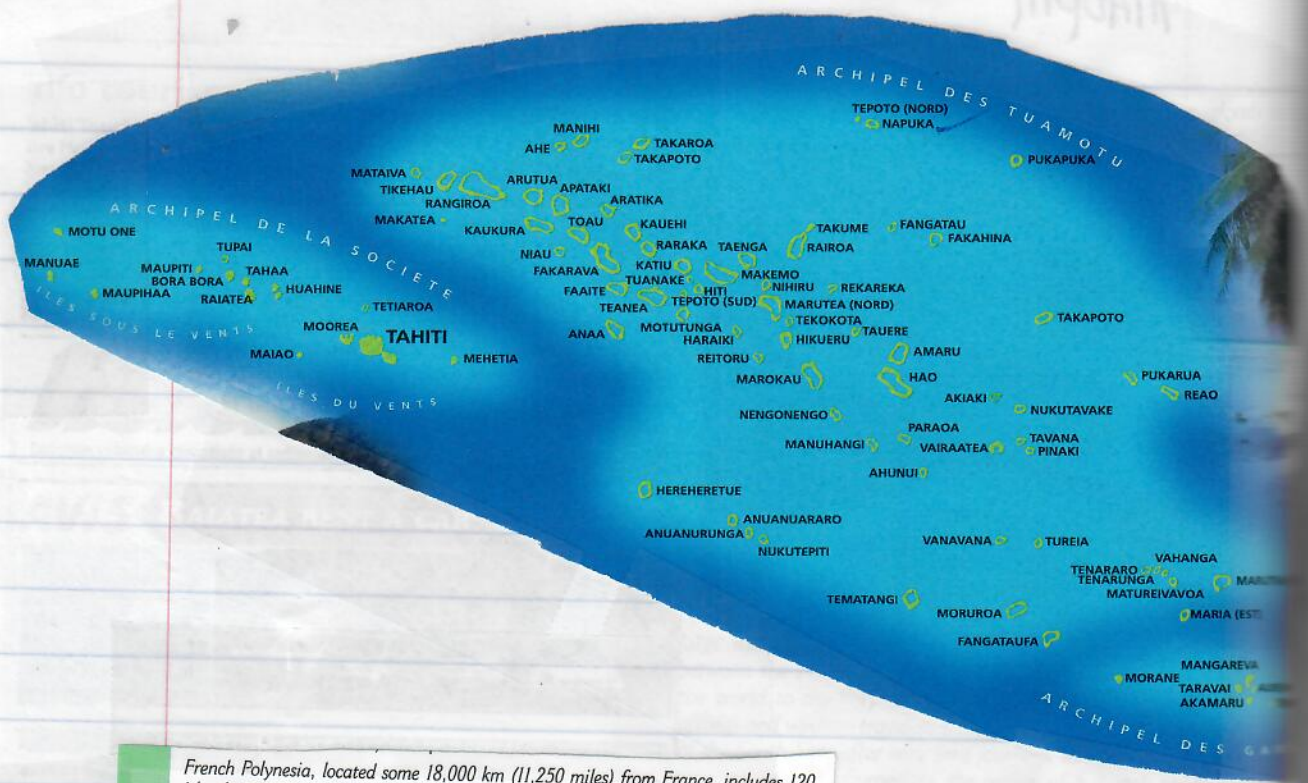

French Polynesia, located some 18,000 km (11,250 miles) from France, includes 120 islands spread over five archipelagos covering some 4.5 millions kms (1.7 million square miles) in the middle of the Pacific Ocean. The Society Islands, the largest, is composed of 9 high islands and 5 atolls split into two groups: the Windward Islands (Tahiti, Moorea, Maiao, Tētiaroa and Mehetia) and, further West, the Leeward Islands (Huahine, Raiatea, Tahaa, Bora Bora, Maupiti, without forgetting the uninhabited islets of Tupai, Mopelia, Scilly and Bellingshausen). While Bora Bora remains a favorite destination for thousands of visitors, the «Pearl of the South Seas» was able to encourage tourism in its neighboring islands. Indeed, Huahine the Savage Island, Raiatea the Sacred, and Tahaa the Vanilla Island have, over the years, become privileged destinations with the rebirth of Polynesian tourism. Each one today welcomes the visitor with faithfulness to its tradition and pride for its scenery and undiscovered enchantments.

For the most adventurous, the more remote islands of Rangiroa, Tikehau, Manihi, and other atolls in the Tuamotu will delight those who seek serenity as well as the scuba diving aficionados. Is so much tranquility really still possible in this world? In any case, for Jacques Brel's and Paul Gauguin's admirers, the Marquesas will remain a destination outside of time. The Land of Men, (Fenua Enana) as the Marquesans calls it, has always left its few visitors with a strong impression that they could never forget.

The largest of the Polynesian archipelagos includes 76 islands and atolls extending over more than 20000 square kms. Asleep for many years, now it has come back to life through the establishment of some pearl farms and tourism. Second largest atoll in Polynesia by its surface, Fakarava is located South-East of Rangiroa. Its reef crown is rectangular shaped, 60 km long and 25 wide. Fakarava's 2 main villages are Rotoava and Tetamanu, where the first catholic church was built out of coral in 1874. Fakarava is the ex capital of the Tuamotus. Along with six of his neighboring islands have been named Natural Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO. International project MAB, literally Man and Biosphere, launched by UNESCO in 1971, aim at accompanying the harmonious development by the human activities, while preserving a nature of remarkable interest.

Since many years, the island is known for its idyllic sites and emerald waters. Fakarava reveals a luxurious fauna and flora, allowing exceptional diving (ray, sharks hammerheads, tiger sharks...). The atoll is composed of 2 passes: Garuae (north), the largest pass of French Polynesia (2km) and Tamakohua, also called Tetamanu (in the south). The speed of the outgoing flood of this northern pass can reach six knots! The pass then become the privileged hunting ground of the gray sharks, lemon sharks, but also manta rays, enormous napoléons, mérous, dolphins, barracudas in benches so tight that they hide the light. All the predators follow their preys in the current, like shades on the conveted fish, which cannot hope for safety that if they reach the lagoon, where the large predators cease their hunt.

Moreover, there are numerous pearl farms and amazing desert beach with a pink and white sand.... The major attraction of Fakarava is its exceptional situation, at the same time near to Tahiti and yet far, very far from any town planning or tourist activity. And especially, it is surrounded of wild atolls of a beauty, accessible only by boat in a few hours from navigation... Tetamanu, Kaehi, Toau, Tahanea, Aratika are some of the destinations offering landscapes of dream for a perfume of end of the world...

- Take shorter showers.

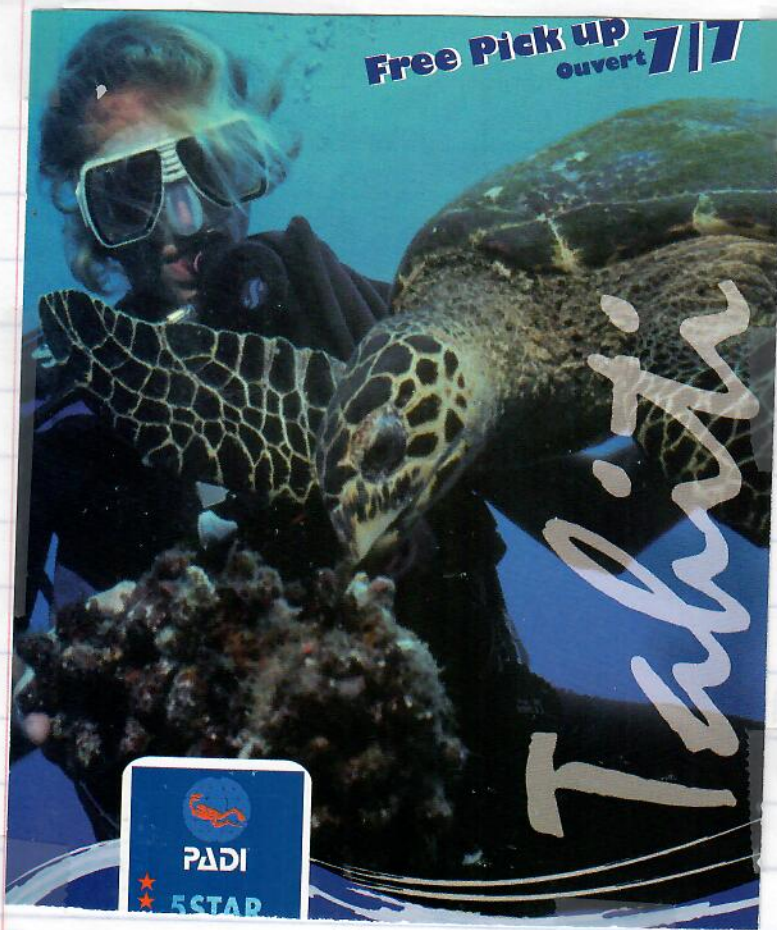

## Brief Biography- George H. Balazs

March 20~~10~~

George Balazs saw his first sea turtle in 1963 while exploring the lagoon at Bora Bora with his wife Linda. A few months later he tried to spear a small turtle for dinner while snorkeling near their home in the Paea district of Tahiti. He missed by only a few inches and the turtle swam away safely. In 1969 he watched commercial turtle hunters on Maui land their catch for nearby restaurants catering to Hawaii tourists. He wondered if there really were enough turtles to sustain the growing trade in turtle steak. After finishing graduate school he went to work in 1971 for the University of Hawaii as a junior researcher in an aquaculture program that included rearing turtles. In 1973 his research interests turned to the conservation biology of wild sea turtles in Hawaii and throughout the Pacific region. For the past 37 years he has pursued an array of studies to aid in understanding and restoring depleted stocks of sea turtles. He is grateful to NOAA Fisheries for supporting and encouraging his efforts for the past 28 years, including current collaborative research with Japan and Taiwan sea turtle scientists to address fishery interaction issues of threatened loggerhead turtles.

Une équipe du ministère de l'Environnement constituée de Mirl Tatarata, responsable de l'opération, et de l'informaticien Vincent Wan ont aidé les membres du PROE (Programme régional océanique de l'environnement) à effectuer une première sur le territoire équipé de balises GPS Argos et baguer cinq tortues marines adultes du 20 au 22 novembre au sein de l'hotel Meridien de Bora Bora. Après deux semaines de route le système localise les tortues en direct grâce au positionnement satellite. L'objectif est de connaître les mouvements migra-

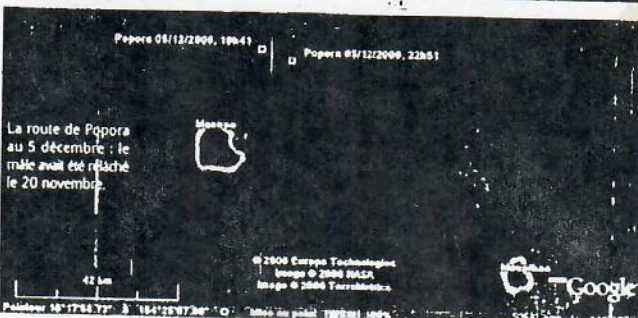
