## Kuibishan and Chi Islet

Kuibishan, one of the eight old sites of Penghu, is located on the northern shore of Beiliao Village, Husi Township. It is commonly known as "Guibishan" according to a legend stating that there are many Guibi (turtles) at the foot of the hill.

Chi Islet is on the eastern shore of Beiliao Village. It is an oval-shaped islet with the length of 120 meters and width of 60 meters. At low tides, a basalt gravel path appears to have a connection with the Beiliao Peninsula.

The range of this geological park includes Kuibishan, Chi Islet, and their neighbouring waters. The major geological facts are basaltic volcanoes, sea erosions, and Fanzai stones - basaltic stones rich in olivine. It is a site not to be neglected for tours or field trips.

Walking along the Kuibishan hiking path, you can take in the beautiful view of basaltic seashores, the broad sea-eroded plateau and sandbank of Fanshuzaiwei Islet. Climbing up to Kuibishan, you can look out the north to Yuanbei Islet and Niao Islet, the northeast to Jishan Islet, Xiaobaisha Islet, the east to Dinggou Islet, and the southeast to Chapo Islet (Husband Islet) and Chamu Islet (Wife Islet).
