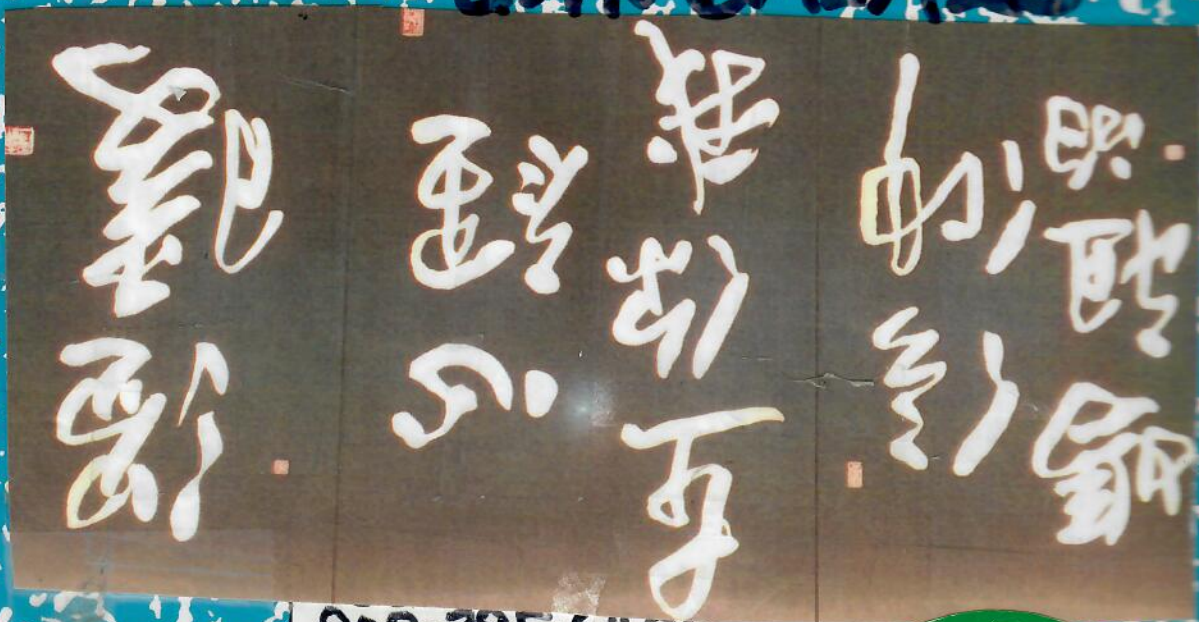

Also note that I had included all species in yesterday's info, while below you find numbers for *just* CM. (which is what I think you need if this is for SRT, sorry for not specifically asking yesterday).

2012 lived up to its promise of being one of the busiest years for the global environmental community. Shark attacks snorkeler

State conservation officials were investigating a shark attack on a woman off Keawakapu Beach on Friday — the seventh off Maui this year.

The attack, reported to authorities at about 1:20 p.m. Friday, occurred in South Maui waters while the woman was snorkeling, according to initial reports from witnesses.

The woman, from Paia, was snorkeling about

30 yards offshore when she was attacked by the shark, leaving her with a cut on her shin and a 6-inch-long wound on her calf, said Cary Kayama, a Maui County Ocean Safety official.

Kayama said according to first responders to the emergency call, the snorkeler's calf bone was visible.

"She definitely needed surgery," Kayama said.

The incident marks the third shark attack in the area within the last 10 years and the 12th in the state this year, according to hawaii-

sharks.com.

Warning signs were posted, and the waters off Keawakapu were closed until at least noon today.

Laura Stevens, spokeswoman for the state Board of Land and Natural Resources, said, "Our concern is for public safety. That's why we're closing and are informing beachgoers about the incident."

The attack at Keawakapu Beach was about three miles north of White Rock, where 20-year-old visitor Jana Luterop died after being bitten

by a shark Aug. 14.

The other two shark incidents at Keawakapu included an attack on a swimmer who was bitten on the calf about 30 yards from shore in about 25 feet of water on Oct. 29, 2007, and a swimmer who lost the top part of a ring finger and all of the small finger on the left hand while about 200 to 400 yards from shore in 30 feet of water on Dec. 21, 2005.

The growing number of shark attacks on Maui has prompted the state to launch a study about the

movement of tiger sharks in Maui County.

In the two-year study, which got underway in late August, scientists are tagging sharks with acoustical and satellite tracking devices.

State officials say the prevailing theory as to why shark attacks are on the rise is tied to an increase in people in shoreline waters and that 40 to 50 years have passed since the last shark-culling.

According to hawaii-sharks.com, five other shark attacks on Maui in 2013 in-

clude an attack upon a surfer at Paia Bay on Feb. 21, another surfer at Honokowai on Feb. 21, a snorkeler at Ulua Beach on July 31, a swimmer at Waiehu on Oct. 23 and a kite-surfer at Kanaha on Oct. 31.

Maui is the only island in the state on which shark warning signs are posted permanently.

The decision to post permanent warning signs at Olowalu followed three shark attacks in the area, including one that killed Maui resident Marti Morrell in 1991.

-Counts of Tracks haul-outs ashore for nesting and tracks returning from nesting- estimate of age- prior night, 2-3 nights before? 3-5 and more? Not easy to discern because 'age of tracks' will depend upon weathering- wind rain bird feet monk seal haulout etc. GPS area location of Island.

- Somewhat same as above but for Basking- count tracks of baskers that were out the prior day/night- naturally they don't go inland, and naturally if inter-tidal they will have been 'erased' if a tide came in and out.

-Counts of Excavations= nesting pits. Numbers and of those how many estimated to contain eggs, how many false. Easy to do if the up and down trackings can be followed (note- East will present special challenges but that's why we have you as subject expert going- and would never have sent (could have sent) anyone else. Nearly.

-Counts of basking turtles. Break down into T1, T2 and T3 - small medium and large (large of course is what you see all the time almost exclusively at East. The T1 and T2 will be seen at the other islands. For T3s if you can see the tail of the male, record of course- but don't go to extreme to see the tail if it means high potential of scaring them off the beach. We will talk special in person about scanning for pit tags of baskers.

-GPS outline of East island- Irene will refresh Joe on how she's done this in recent years.

-GPS locations/mark on Goole map where there are nests/ecavations, and baskers- anything of prominence even if nonturtle stuff. For example- debris that may be from the tsunami of March 2011. What I ask you to look carefully for (such as in shoes, or nearly anything) would be potential pieces of bone or even tissue from victim- small cryptic. If you find a suspect, take it back to the ship for Chad and Jessie- or call their attention to guide them to where it is. Why important? dna to id the person, there are many thousands of families in Japan with no remains of their loved ones. Providing information on even a single victim will be exception good-will from the humanitarian standpoint.

-Dead turtles- examine and photo- but mainly non-invasive inspection- turn turtle over is possible- refrain from getting putrid material on you- unpleasant and unnecessary. Take a small (size of your little finger *nail* or smaller- never larger though) dried tissue or skin. Put in small double-bag zip lock bag, label, and 'good enough' bring back. enough no bring back (Joe these days nearly any piece of tissue can be extracted for dna- so no worries whatever.

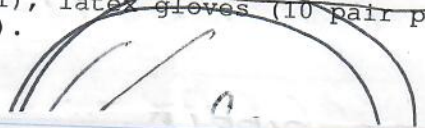

Summary:

The turtle research and turtle assessment groups have been geographically independent in their scope of work; therefore, we have multiple permits with various timelines. Moving forward it makes sense to reduce the number of permits and move to a comprehensive model that will improve organization, transparency, and functionality.

Topics for discussion include:

- Coordinator to oversee permits, renewals, and reporting
- Cloud-based share drive with (1) permit metadata, (2) tabulation of weekly/monthly takes, and (3) specimen tracking (discussed last meeting)
- How to process permit applications, modifications (e.g., amendments, approved personnel), and final reports as a group
- Listing of all PIFSC turtle personnel as CIs on permits
- The role of non-PIFSC personnel – Is it necessary to list them?
- Role and necessity of local permits, e.g., DLNR (Hawaii), DMWR (Am. Samoa), refuge and special use
- Role of NMFS and UH IACUC – are both necessary?
- CITES import/export, interstate samples
- USFWS holding regulations for captive turtles, LSS tanks

DPS 1 - I felt that there were no new threats and existing threats were accounted for in the current trends and abundance for this DPS. Based on the increasing trends at the major rookeries, despite the current suite of threats (FP, harvest, lighting, beach development, and fishery interactions), I felt the nesting stocks in this DPS would continue to increase over the next 100 years.

I also feel that conservation efforts in this region are good and continuously improving through the efforts of state and national governments as well as NGO's such as WIDECAST. The majority of my points were in the <1% bin (team member F).

*

DPS 9 - The fact that nesting is widely distributed throughout this DPS, albeit at low levels, and the remote nature of the region, provides some sense of assurance that the DPS will persist into the future. However, the lack of comprehensive data, low estimate of total nester abundance, continued harvest, and the risk of nesting habitat loss due to sea level rise cause me some concern.

///

In general, I am a firm believer that green turtles in the absence of high levels of human-induced mortality, are resilient and if left alone they will rebound/recover. The majority of my points were in the 6-10% bin (team member H).

DPS 11 - The increasing trend at the major rookery of Colola, MX and the success of conservation efforts over the past 2 decades indicate that this DPS is heading in the right direction. In my opinion, the positive change that has taken place since the late 1990's would be hard to un-do b/c the change was rooted in the people and how they view turtles. I expect the rookeries in this DPS to continue to increase over the next 100 years. The majority of my points were in the 1-5% bin (Team member G).

As a side note - it would take a DPS in a state of total collapse to get me to put my points in the 21%+ bins.
