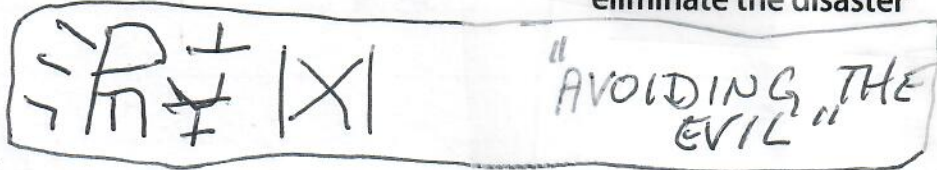

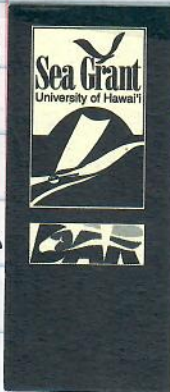

Glyphosate-based herbicides are commonly used to combat weeds and unwanted grasses in many habitats in the Hawaiian Islands, including near freshwater, marine, and anchialine pond shorelines. Glyphosate is reported to degrade within a few days of application, and to break down rapidly in soil, which suggests that it is safe for use near aquatic environments. However, glyphosate can be transported to coastal waters, especially during run-off events. Five native macroalgal and seagrass species, and one introduced aquatic vascular plant found in coastal anchialine ponds or in the adjacent intertidal zone were exposed to freshly mixed solutions of a glyphosate-based herbicide in lab experiments. Chlorophyll absorbance and photosystem II (PSII) efficiency were measured after five to seven days of incubation. At herbicide concentrations (0.225 to 1.8 g L⁻¹ glyphosate) below the manufacturer's lowest recommended concentration (3.6 g L⁻¹ glyphosate), chlorophyll absorbance and PSII efficiency differed significantly from the control (0.0 g L⁻¹ glyphosate). Native macroalgae and seagrasses in marine and anchialine aquatic habitats may be negatively affected by use of glyphosate herbicides to control shoreline weeds.

Protected sea turtles with a newfound interest in the floating dock for the USS Arizona Memorial have resulted in about 7,000 people not being able to set foot on the memorial since Wednesday, the National Park Service said.

The memorial was closed part of Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Monday due to the presence of apparently foraging sea turtles, said Abby Wines, a memorial spokeswoman.

"Of course, visitors are disappointed when they can't get out to the memo-

rial for any reason," Wines said Monday. "However, I think the visitors seemed to think it was at least a cute reason, an interesting reason. Definitely, they seemed to be more understanding than when we've had to shut down for other reasons."

That happened, too, on most of Sunday, when the wind was clocked at 34.5 mph and the Navy, which operates boats that ferry passengers back and forth to the memorial, decided to pull the plug on the short trip, resulting in about 3,000 others not getting out to the memorial, Wines said.

"Turtles have definitely

been seen in Pearl Harbor before and around the Arizona Memorial before, but this is the first time they have been staying for an extended period of time right next to the dock," Wines said.

The green sea turtle is threatened, and the hawksbill sea turtle is endangered, the state Department of Land and Natural Resources said in 2014. Although federal and state conservation laws differ, all prohibit disturbing or harming sea turtles without a permit. Even touching turtles is considered disturbance and is illegal, the DLNR said.

The USS Arizona Memorial, a grave for most of the ship's 1,177 crew members killed Dec. 7, 1941, is the state's most visited attraction. A maximum of 4,350 people a day set foot on the memorial, which sits astride the sunken battleship.

Most of the time, one turtle has been spotted at the memorial's floating dock. On Monday there were two, Wines said.

"We're working with a biologist from (the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) to try to figure out how we can best strike a compromise between the needs of the turtle and the desires of the

people," she said.

In May the 894-foot hospital ship USNS Mercy caused damage to the Arizona Memorial's access dock as the big ship was turned in the harbor. NOAA thought that might have had something to do with the new turtle interest in growth on the floating dock, Wines said.

But the dock was always in the water, "so I doubt there was very much disruption to the growth on the bottom and side of it," she said.

"It doesn't really make much sense," Wines said. "The dock didn't change that much."

Turtles take over Arizona's dock

This sounds like the start of a homegrown riddle, doesn't it: How many sea turtles does it take to roust 7,000 tourists?

But this is Hawaii, where we take our protected species seriously, so it's no joke.

Since last Wednesday, the USS Arizona Memorial has been closed to visitors for chunks of time, due to a few protected sea turtles around the site's floating dock.

The green sea turtle is threatened and the hawksbill sea turtle is endangered, so there are state and federal laws that ban disturbing or harming them.

Thus far, some 7,000 people have been turned away from the memorial. Most visitors are said to have been disappointed but understanding, but let's hope the critters mosey along soon to another, less-interesting site.

Systematic studies of the green turtle (*Chelonia mydas*) in the Hawaiian Islands were initiated by the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology in partnership with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 1973 with annual seasonal monitoring and tagging of nesters at East Island, French Frigate Shoals in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands. Subsequently, in the late 1970s, ocean capture tagging and related research of immature green turtles commenced in the Main Hawaiian Islands, expanding over time to include numerous coastal neritic sites throughout the archipelago. Concomitantly, in 1982 a sea turtle stranding investigation was begun. The goal of this initiative was to spatially and temporally document strandings, and necropsy dead turtles to determine cause of stranding, health status, morphometrics, gender, diet, and collect tissues for archival and various analytical purposes. In 1990, a companion program was launched to rescue, rehabilitate, and conduct clinical research on stranded turtles found treatable for return to the wild. Turtles stranding with injuries or disease deemed untreatable by veterinary evaluation were humanely euthanized and necropsied by wildlife pathologists for fresh sample collection primarily for use in the research of fibropapillomatosis disease. Presently, there are seven major long-term data sets and associated sample arrays collected annually over a 24-41 year time period housed at the PIFSC and partner organizations. These seven broad categories consist of 1) nester monitoring and tagging, 2) ocean capture/basking turtle tagging, 3) strandings, 4) necropsies including pelagic turtle by-catch, 5) rehabilitation and release, 6) euthanasia, and 7) satellite tracking. Overall, as the result of these initiatives, and the commitment of time, resources, partnerships, and expertise to keep them going, the Hawaiian population is among the best studied of green turtles globally in terms of longevity, consistency of methodologies, central consolidation and coordination of data, and multi-disciplinary partnerships. Since 1999, our work has resulted in 107 peer-reviewed journal publications (see http://www.pifsc.noaa.gov/marine_turtle/).

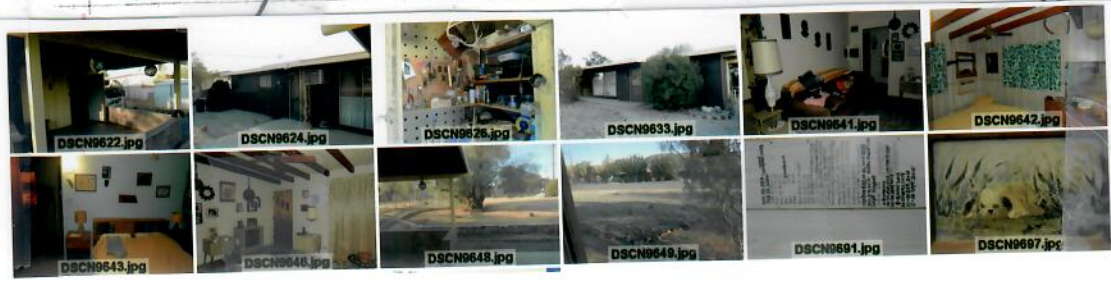

Despite excellent reasons for these telescopes, they do not justify the desecration of Hawaiian places of worship

Many well-respected thinkers are advocating for the completion of construction of two major telescopes on Mauna Kea and Haleakala.

My initial reaction to the controversy was in line with their views — until I rode my bicycle up to the Haleakala summit last month and saw the construction site for the Daniel K. Inouye solar telescope first-hand.

The visceral impact was shocking, as the construction crane looked as if it was sitting in the middle of a heiau.

I then understood why the protectors are so adamant.

Although other telescopes were previously built there and the state Department of Land and Natural Resources has already issued permits, truly progressive and open-minded thinkers will understand that it is time to change direction under these special circumstances.

James Haught, editor of The Charleston (W. Va.) Gazette in his commentary piece, "Tide of history flows to the left" (Star-Advertiser, Insight, Aug. 2), stated that "the overall tide of civilization flows in a progressive direction" and "amid all the chaos and confusion of daily life, through a thousand contradictory barrages, the struggle for a safer, fairer, more secure, more humane, world never ceases."

These protectors raise our consciousness of the special spiritual values at stake.

They teach us that notwithstanding economic, educational and scientific reasons for these telescopes, they do not justify the desecration of Hawaiian

places of worship. While the sacredness of each site is more appropriately explained by Hawaiian kupuna, cultural practitioners and scholars, suffice it to say both sites are considered among the most spiritually revered sites on Earth.

Mauna Kea — or Ka Mauna a Wakea, as known in Hawaiian creation tradition — is held in high esteem as kupuna, and is the first born child of Earth Mother Papahānaumoku and the Sky Father Wakea.

Located within this sacred wahi pana are hundreds of heiau and other historic properties, including an ancient alpine lake, Lake Waiiau, which is visited even today by native healers for traditional practices.

The summit of Haleakala is an ancient place for prayer, meditation and the drawing of spiritual wisdom by lead priests or kahuna po'o.

When Pele first visited Haleakala, she dug a deep pit and made 16 pu'u that form a sacred alignment from the summit into the ocean; this path features over 300 heiau, the highest concentration of heiau in the Hawaiian archipelago.

Like those leaders who went to jail advocating for many of the rights we take for granted today, the protectors understandably will never give up. I am hopeful that the leaders of our state will recognize that given the undisputed highly sacred character of both Haleakala and Mauna Kea, the scales tip in favor of preservation, and will take immediate steps to stop the construction and work out a fair settlement with the developers of the Thirty Meter Telescope and the Inouye solar telescope.

Hey Todd and MTBAP, here are some interesting numbers from the 2015 FFS nesting season:

Todd asked me to calculate the number of "new" and "old" nesters based on the turtles that did or did not have PIT tags in the 2015 FFS nesting season. The following numbers are not going to be exact due to the number of turtles that may have nested previously but were not tagged during previous seasons. So, of the 491 total turtles that Emma had counted, 292 were "known" turtles with PIT tags (59.47%). This leaves 199 turtles that Emma saw and mototooled but were untagged.

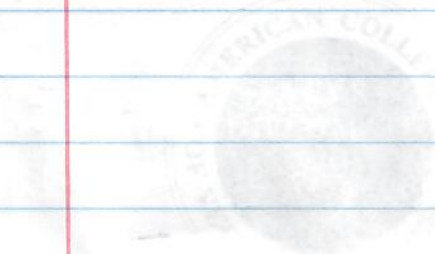

Comments on Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants: Identification and Proposed Listing of Eleven Distinct Population Segments of Green Sea Turtles (*Chelonia mydas*).

Thanks to the NMFS for extending the comment period for this important topic.

My wife, Ursula Keuper-Bennett, and I spent 25 years observing and documenting the Hawaiian green turtle population of Honokowai, West Maui. Over that span, we spent more than 100 24-hour days underwater with the honu, accumulating over 750 hours of video and 8-10,000 pictures. In 1995, we published the first ever marine turtle website at <http://www.turtles.org>, and for almost 15 years it remained the top search result for "turtle". We developed a system for identifying individuals and used it to compile a database for over 750 turtles. At the 19th Annual Symposium on Sea Turtle Biology and Conservation, held on South Padre Island, Texas, 2-6 March 1999, we presented a summary of our findings entitled "Photographic Evidence for the Regression of Fibropapillomas Afflicting Green Turtles at Honokowai, Maui, in the Hawaiian Islands" (p. 37-39 in Kalb, H.J. and T. Wibbels, compilers. 2000. Proceedings of the Nineteenth Annual Symposium on Sea Turtle Biology and Conservation. U.S. Dept. Commerce. NOAA Tech. Memo. NMFS-SEFSC-443, 291 p.) showing that many honu spontaneously recovered from the disease. In 2008, the University of Hawaii Press published "The Book of Honu", our book about the Hawaiian green turtle and our experiences with them. In it, on page 125 we expressed our feelings about de-listing the honu:

"Our affection for the honu means that of course we don't want to see them hunted. If, however, their numbers have recovered to the point where a regulated harvest would not threaten the overall population, then we find it hard to oppose. Our objections would be strictly emotional, not scientific. We'd insist that such a hunt be strictly controlled and that safeguards be put in place to prevent hunting in areas where human contact has acclimated the turtles. If these conditions met, we wouldn't like the idea, but we'd be forced to accept it."

Over the years, we have always been pleased and impressed by the protection extended to the honu by first, the State of Hawaii, and later by the US government through the Endangered Species Act. The intent of the protections was to allow the honu population to recover its numbers. The fact that these measures resulted in a spectacular recovery speaks to their effectiveness and the diligence of their administration. The honu have become so plentiful that, regardless of the truth, it is easy to see why people conclude that some reefs have reached carrying capacity. In our area [West Maui] the honu have begun feeding throughout the day. We count fewer honu resting on the reef, and our snorkel/dive surveys have found that the foragers are competing for a diminishing supply of food. It is tempting to reason that this is happening throughout the Islands, thus explaining at least in part the increase of reports of daytime foraging along the shorelines.

We therefore find it puzzling that the wisdom of the conservation policies is undermined by a concerted effort to deny the final step: de-listing the Hawaiian turtle. In 2012, the Marine Turtle Specialist Group of the IUCN concluded an assessment of the Hawaiian green turtle and pronounced it a species of Least Concern, which I'm sure you know is the lowest threat rating possible. If the honu can have this status and still be listed under the ESA, something is drastically wrong with your system.

There have been attempts to justify continuing the listing on the basis of rising sea levels and potential loss of the primary honu nesting beaches in the French Frigate Shoals. This theory requires a belief that faced with the complete loss of the East Island nesting beach, the honu would stop nesting—despite an abundance of suitable beaches throughout the Hawaiian archipelago. As the wonderful story of 5690 illustrates, a turtle who can't return to her natal beach simply finds another, in this case on the busiest beach in Lahaina, Maui. If this is the strongest argument against de-listing that opponents can bring, you have no choice but to de-list the honu.

In reviewing other comments, we have also noticed many appeals to the heart rather than the science. While we love the honu as dearly as anyone, we would like to point out that F&WS has already responded to such comments. The Federal Register, Vol. 76, No. 249 for Wednesday, December 28, 2011, Rules and Regulations, announces the de-listing of the gray wolf: Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants; Revising the Listing of the Gray Wolf (Canis lupus) in the Western Great Lakes. On page 81682, please see this reponse:

"(7) Comment: A number of comments expressed opposition to delisting, making statements such as "wolves should always be protected" by the Act and "why do wolves have to be delisted."

"Our Response: The Act provides the Federal Government with authority to protect and recover threatened and endangered species. When a species has been recovered to the extent that it no longer meets the definition of "threatened" or "endangered," the Act provides that it should be removed from the Federal List of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants and its management be returned to the appropriate States and tribes (in cases where treaties identify such authorities for tribes). The goal of the Act is to recover listed species and then to delist them when they no longer qualify as threatened or endangered, thereby allowing the Service to focus its efforts on the many other species that do qualify as threatened and endangered. The WGL gray wolf DPS no longer meets the definition of a threatened or endangered species, as it has achieved long-standing recovery criteria by greatly expanding in numbers and geographic range and threats to its longterm viability have been reduced or eliminated. Therefore, the Act requires delisting the species, but it also requires that we continue to monitor the status of the species for a minimum of 5 years after delisting, and we can list it again if the monitoring results show that to be necessary."

Comment:

I declare that I have been professionally and personally involved in the research and conservation of marine turtles in the Hawaiian Islands, and elsewhere in Oceania and globally since 1972. In my professional scientific capacity involving marine turtles I have worked in leadership roles for the University of Hawaii (1972-1982), and the National Marine Fisheries Service based in Hawaii (1982-present). In my personal but professionally-focused capacity I have been a member of the IUCN SSC Marine Turtle Specialist Group since 1976. I am presently the Co-Chair of the Oceania Region of the IUCN Marine Turtle Specialist Group, again in the professional capacity of my personal life. For the record, I declare that the professional views expressed in this testimony are mine alone, in my personal capacity as a 50-year resident of the Hawaiian Islands. In this capacity, I express disagreement with the proposed rulemaking for the listing status of DPS10 (Central North Pacific that includes exclusively the Hawaiian Islands and range of the genetically discrete green turtle population). My disagreement is based on the fact that the proposed listing is scientifically discordant, contradictory, incongruent, and simply at odds with the biological and population assessment findings and information presented in the NMFS NOAA document by Seminoff et al. (2015) "Status Review of the Green Turtle under the Endangered Species Act." I further declare that I am a co-author of this report, however I had no involvement in the listings being proposed. The principal reason given relating to the proposed rule making for DPS 10 is climate-change induced sea level rise, hence eventual submergence of nesting beaches at French Frigate Shoals. This opinion runs oppositional to the fact that green turtles are highly resilient and adaptable resulting in short and long term successful nesting beach and other changes for millennia. The rationale simply "does not hold water" in that no science-based information of support was presented in the rule-making proposal.

The proposed rulemaking for DPS 1 (North Atlantic), DPS 7 (Central West Pacific), and DPS 9 (Central South Pacific) are also viewed in my professional view as discordant with the findings presented in Seminoff et al. 2015.

For the record, and for the sake of historical events, I am also taking this opportunity to re-submit

testimony that I wrote to the NMFS Office of Protected Resources in September 2012. To the best of my knowledge that testimony on R.I.N. NOAA-NMFS-2012-0154 was never incorporated into the official record. Hence, I repeat that testimony as follow: "I attest to the following direct personal observations, submitted here as testimony based on a significant span of time- nearly 48 years- 1965-2012- living in Hawaii and devoting attention, as an astute observer in, on, and by the ocean. During the mid-1960's to the mid-1980's it was uncommon to ever see green turtles when snorkeling, scuba diving, boating, or walking along the shoreline. Starting in the late 1980's and early 1990's sightings of turtles increased prominently- including the occurrence of terrestrial basking. By the mid-1990's through to the present, with increasing frequency, it has become *common* to see turtles. My observations are applicable to the Hawaiian Islands of Oahu where I live, as well as Maui, Kauai, Lanai, Molokai, and the Big Island of Hawaii (including East Hawaii and the Kohala/Kona Coast). By green turtles being "common" I mean widespread, general, ordinary, of frequent occurrence, and usual. George H. 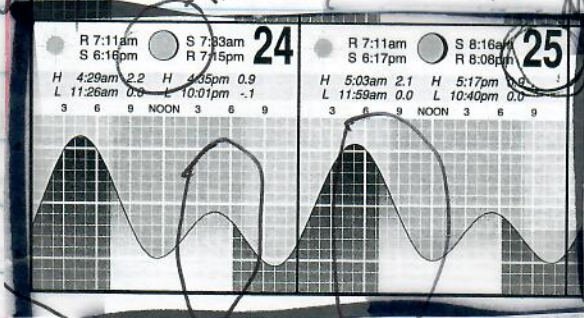
