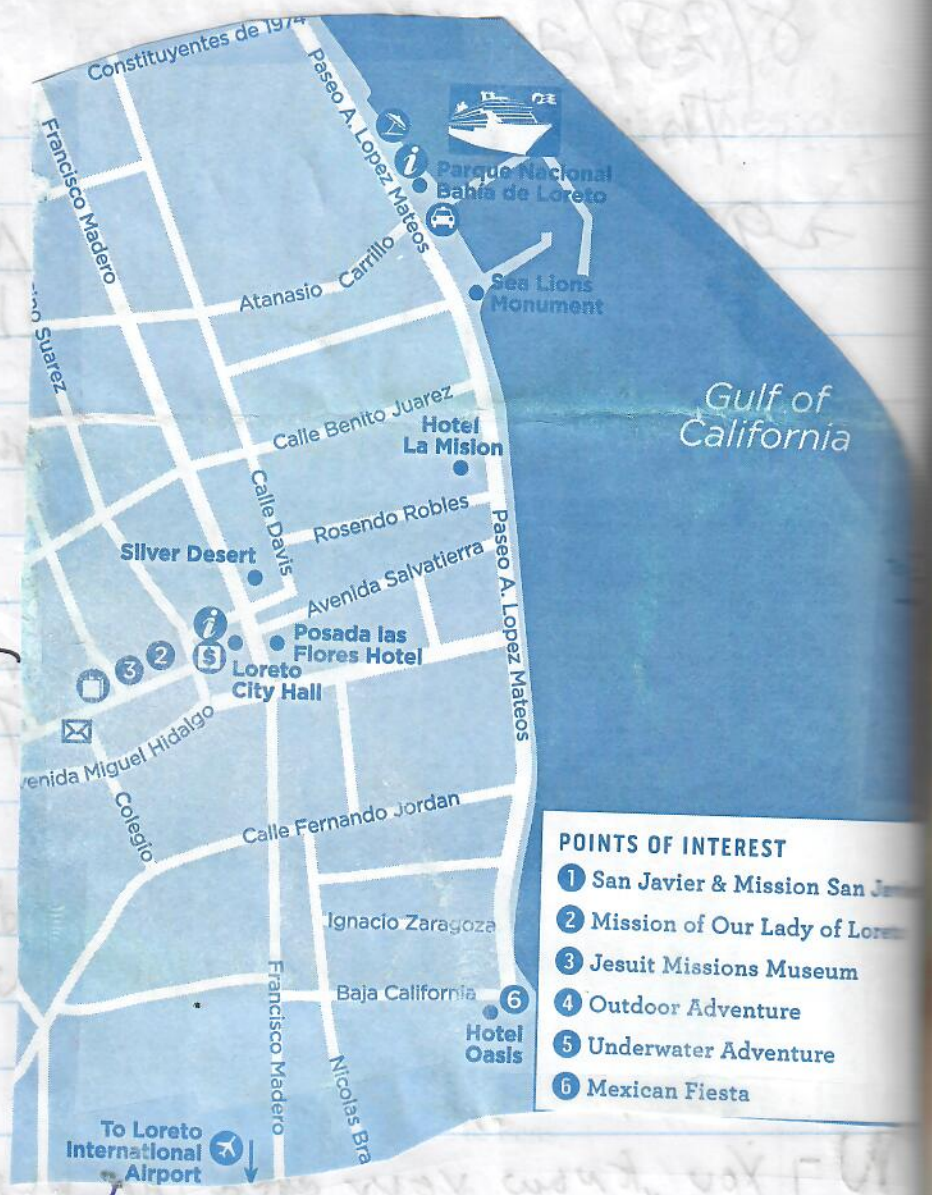

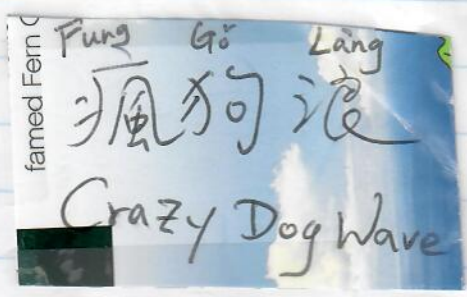

Seven species of ocean turtles exist globally as the descendants of ancient and resilient reptilian lineages that have adapted and survived for millions of years. Over the course of human history an array of relationships have developed with turtles, and especially marine turtles amongst coastal and island peoples. Turtles are woven deeply into the cultural, traditional and contemporary fabric of humanity, with uses ranging from: food for families; hunting and navigational skills, objects of commerce; sacrifices to the Gods; pets; utilitarian implements; ornamentation; medicine; funerary; foretelling the future; and spiritual strength and protection.

Today all seven species of marine turtles are considered endangered by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), with the exception of the population of green sea turtles (*Chelonia mydas*) in the Hawaiian Islands. In 2012 Hawaii's green turtles were downlisted to IUCN's category of Least Concern following a comprehensive assessment by the IUCN Marine Turtle Specialist Group (see <http://www.iucnredlist.org/details/16285718/0>). Successful conservation programs that endure are best built with local communities as their foundation. National legislation and international conventions, based on sound ecological principles, clearly also have importance. However, strategies for conservation are made robust and equitable when they integrate cultural and traditional components forged at the local level by the very people closest to the turtles and their environment. Japan and all of East Asia have vigorous and growing sea turtle conservation programs that deserve praise, support, and partnership to improve the status of regional stocks. The natural direction toward which we should be moving regarding sea turtles, as eloquently expressed by the Sea Turtle Association of Japan, is "to bring back rich and plentiful nature that allows and tolerates a diversity of values and world views."

In light of their 40-year rise to abundance, green turtles in the Hawaiian Islands constitute a unique experimental model to comprehensively understand the dynamics of a recovering sea turtles population. In addition, conservation and management practices in Hawaii, founded upon four decades of research results, can serve as a real-life learning ground for people in East Asia and other regions striving to save and sustain their own charismatic and culturally important sea turtles resources.

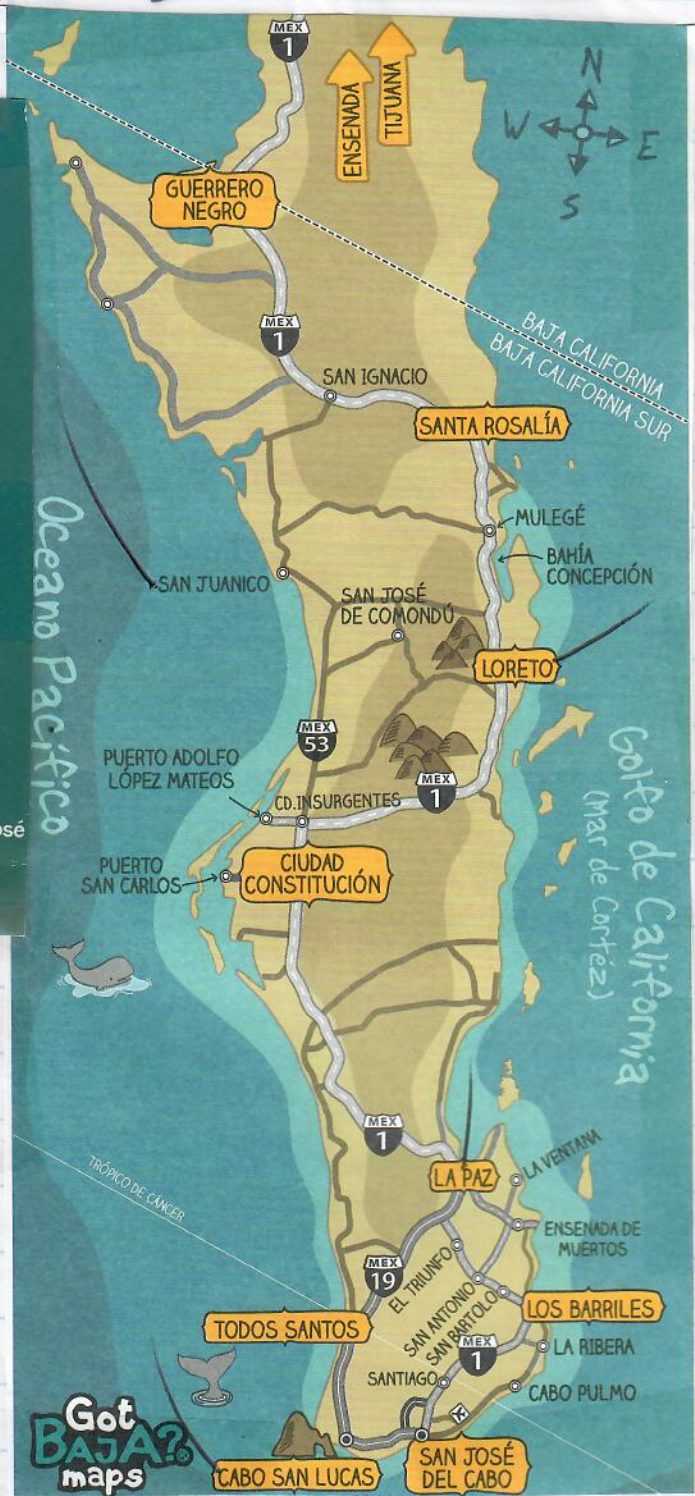

**Hawai'i's Snake**  
 Old myths die hard. For years hikers in Hawai'i could traipse worry-free through the jungle because, as it's often said, there are no snakes in Hawai'i. In fact, a shipment of potted plants from the Philippines — this harmless little snake is now common on most of the major islands. Hardly anyone notices, though. It's very small — usually less than six inches long — and it mostly lives underground. You might not see it, but it's there. Its most remarkable trait, though, is that after it molts its new skin is robin's-egg blue for several days.

**Hawai'i's Snake**

Old myths die hard. For years hikers in Hawai'i could traipse worry-free through the jungle because, as it's often said, there are no snakes in Hawai'i.

Turns out that's not exactly true. At least two species of snake are established in Hawai'i, one of which is highly poisonous. Fortunately the yellowbellied sea snake (*Pelamis platurus*), a seafaring relative of the cobra, is rarely seen in Hawai'i's waters; over the years, scientists have collected fewer than twenty specimens, and swimmers are unlikely to encounter one.

The Brahminy blind snake (*Ramphotyphlops braminus*), however, is a different story. Although not native to Hawai'i—it's thought to have arrived in the 1930s in

a shipment of potted plants from the Philippines—this harmless little snake is now common on most of the major islands. Hardly anyone notices, though. It's very small—usually less than six inches long—and it mostly lives underground. You might find one burrowing under stones or dead logs. A lot of Island residents have probably already seen one and not realized it because the Brahminy blind snake looks like an earthworm. Like earthworms, the snake is blunt at both ends, so it's hard to tell the head from the tail. And, as its name suggests, the Brahminy blind snake has only tiny, vestigial eyespots, making it seem even more wormlike.

But look closely and you'll see that it's definitely a snake: It moves like a snake, and its flicking, forked tongue is a dead giveaway. Unlike earthworms, it doesn't have

body segments; it's covered with scales and, like all snakes, periodically sheds its skin. After it molts its new skin is robin's-egg blue for several days.

Its most remarkable trait, though, is that the Brahminy blind snake might be the only completely parthenogenic snake in the world. That means females can reproduce without the help of a male. It takes only one. In fact all the Brahminy blind snakes in Hawai'i are females, and they're essentially clones. Parthenogenesis is a big reason these little snakes have been able to colonize remote archipelagos like Hawai'i, but it's also a risky strategy: Because they all share the same genome, a single disease could wipe out the entire population—although it's possible few would notice.

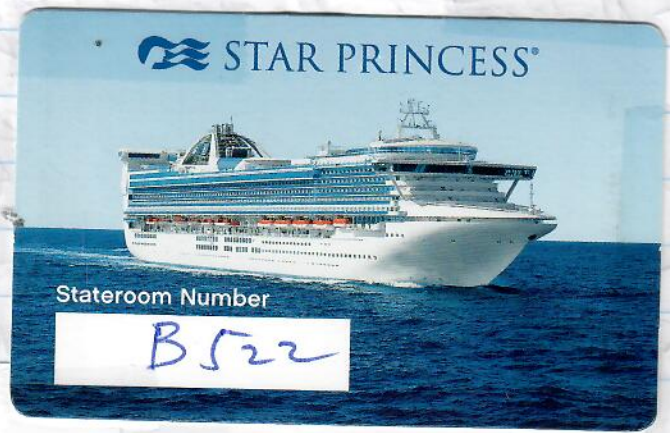

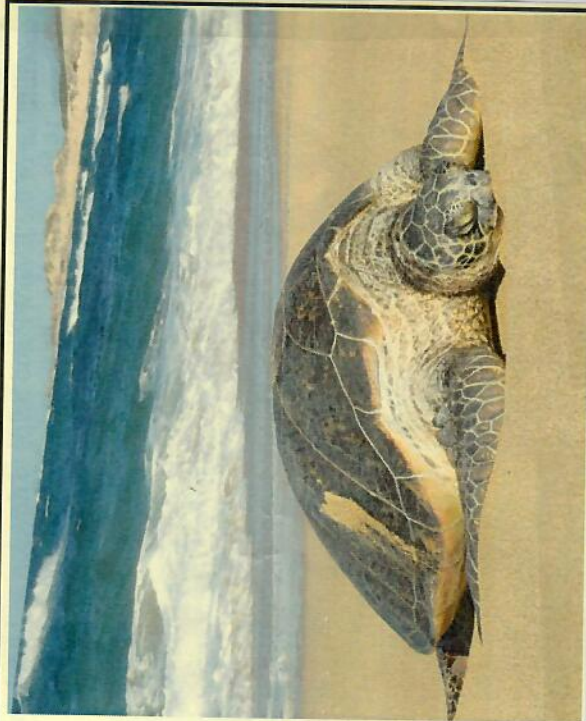

## The Majestic Honu

Mo'omomi Preserve is a very rare and special place that native species like the green sea turtles or *honu* call home. During the months of April through November, *honu* like this old mother use the beaches of Kalani and Kawa'aloa to nest, laying their eggs deep in pits, then covering them over with sand to incubate. A couple of months later, the buried eggs will hatch and the young *honu* emerge together from the sand pit and head for the sea. A single large female *honu* such as this one can lay up to 400 eggs in a year.

We would always see this majestic mama *honu*, exactly as she's pictured here, basking peacefully on Kalani beach in Mo'omomi Preserve. We do not see her anymore.

On behalf of the NMFS Pacific Islands and Southwest Fisheries Science Centers, we invite you to participate in a Workshop on Sea Turtle Foraging Ecology and Health Assessment August 25-28, 2014 in Honolulu, Hawaii. The goal of the workshop is to promote meaningful information exchange, share research techniques on sea turtle foraging ecology and health, and strengthen collaboration among Chinese and U.S. scientists. We expect that this workshop will help foster long-term collaboration to promote the recovery of sea turtle populations in the China region.

Understanding the causes of disease and mortality are critical for determining why sea turtle populations may fluctuate. Further, learning about foraging ecology can help identify important marine habitats and foods for sea turtles, and thus pinpoint essential coastal areas for conservation and management efforts. The workshop will rely on acquiring "hands-on" experience to consolidate practical techniques in collecting baseline information about sea turtles for conservation. We also expect that participants can reinforce the communication network for better management of the migratory sea turtles.

The tentative agenda of this 4-day meeting follows:

- Day 1 - Presentations and Discussions by China participants and the U.S. (NOAA and the U.S. Geological Survey).
- Day 2 - Demonstrations of turtle necropsies by experts, including lavage sampling for diet contents. Practice sessions for necropsies by those participants wishing to do so.
- Day 3 - Field work at a nearby study site to capture free-ranging live turtles to tag, health screen, and collect samples, including lavage diet samples. Activities to encompass the operation and enhancement of a turtle stranding network.
- Day 4 - Discuss days 1-3 and arrive at conclusions and recommendations for future China/NOAA and USGS turtle joint activities.
