The prediction begins with the cup storing a number of the sticks. After the querent has finished their devotions to the main deity, the querent purifies the cylinder by revolving it around the incense burner three times and mixing the sticks by hand. The querent kneels in prayer, holding the cup between their palms and asking their question to the deity, either aloud or by whispering. This part needs to be done decisively as one should not shift questions or hesitate on the question in the middle of the rite. The shaking of the cylinder, which is usually tipped slightly downward, results in at least one stick leaving the cylinder and being dropped onto the floor. In most cases, if multiple sticks leave the cylinder, those fortunes do not count and must be shaken again. Each stick, with its designated number, represents one answer.

When a single stick falls out, the number will correspond to one of the hundred written oracles with an answer on it. The writing on the piece of paper will provide an answer to the question.

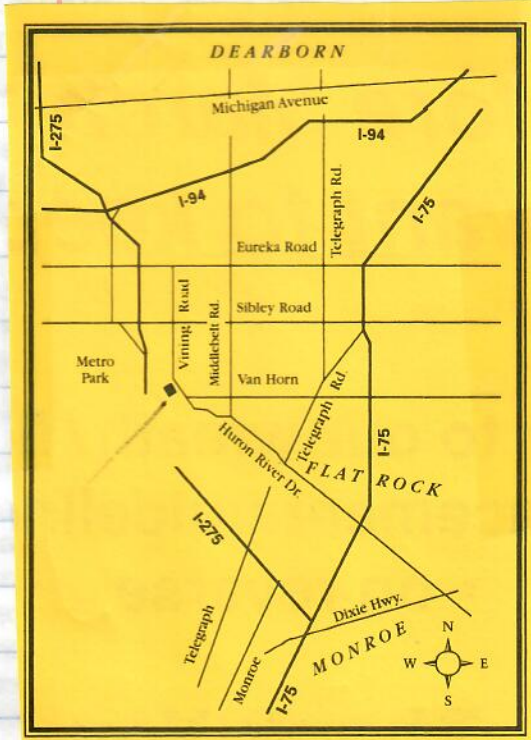

Ocean symposium seeks to engage Pacific nations

Akie Abe did not talk about her country's whaling operations

Japan's first lady teamed up with U.S. Sen. Daniel Inouye's widow Monday to launch an environmental symposium that they hope will become an annual gathering of students, scientists and activists from both sides of the Pacific Ocean.

The Japan-U.S. International Symposium for Ocean Conservation, held at the Hawai'i Convention Center, saw more than a dozen prominent figures discuss efforts against overfishing, pollution, environmental degradation and other threats to the Pacific's ma-

rine resources.

It aimed to build networks among some of those nations' strongest advocates for better ocean protection, said Irene Hirano Inouye, president of the nonprofit U.S.-Japan Council.

"I think this is the perfect place to talk about how our two countries can work together," Inouye said Monday. "We're both island areas, and we face the erosion of our environment."

Akie Abe, wife of Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, "loves to come to Hawaii, as well," Inouye added.

"It was an idea that came about as we talked. How can we bring together women, how can we bring together leaders? We decided that this would be a great way to

ABSTRACT

From 1992-2014 the breeding migrations of 20 green turtles, *Chelonia mydas*, were satellite tracked either from or to the geologically ancient colonial nesting site of French Frigate Shoals mid-point in the 2400 km arc of Hawaiian islands. Using the Argos System, ocean routes and travel schedules were mapped and delineated, and the home ranges of foraging area destinations were calculated and portrayed by Minimum Convex Polygons. None of the turtles migrated outside the Central North Pacific region of Hawaii, consistent with prior long-term results of comprehensive flipper tagging and genetics research. Our study brings together for the first time tracking data collected over the span of 22 years. Novel and as yet unanswered aspects of our results point the way for future telemetry with this globally isolated discrete green turtle population that has shown significant improvements in conservation status over the past 45 years of intense investigation.
