The Tiare Tahiti hotel will close its doors this Sunday, June 21.



The management of the hotel located on the seafront of Papeete near the OPT, has announced the permanent closure of the establishment and the sale of the building. "Retirement of the former management team. The new group does not wish to continue the activity," announces a poster.





The hotel will close permanently this Sunday after more than 20 years of existence. For the moment, according to our information, the employees, who have been warned, have not yet signed a document signifying their dismissal. They would be a dozen to find themselves unemployed.

"It is a family business run by the family, by my dad and myself since 1997. So it's been 23 years of history, and it makes me sick to get there. The adventure stops abruptly because I think like other local hoteliers or other pension owners, the Covid-19 pandemic has passed through there. We would have liked to continue the adventure anyway, but the charges are too enormous. (...) My father, for health reasons, decided to retire. The new management team did not wish to continue the activity, and announced that to us blank on Tuesday, which they had decided to close this weekend. It shocked us a lot, but that's how it is... "confides, moved, Marianne Giau, former manager of the hotel.

"Faced with the global economic crisis triggered by Covid-19, the Tiare Tahiti hotel in downtown Papeete is forced to close its doors permanently. We tried to reopen on May 22. But despite everyone's efforts, the exceptional cooperation of our teams, or the aid put in place by the authorities, we are no longer able to hold out," the new managers of the hotel said on Tuesday. "In addition to this, our historical manager Mr. Leon Giau, had to resign earlier this month due to serious health problems. All our thoughts are with his family to wish him a speedy recovery. After more than 20 years of existence, it is therefore with great sorrow and sadness that we close this economic and human adventure. We are closing the 'Tiare Tahiti' establishment in the coming days, as well as selling the building".
