The Sea Turtle Conservancy announces a job opening for Station Manager of its Biological Field Station at Tortuguero, Costa Rica. Launched by Dr. Archie Carr in the 1950s, the work conducted by STC at Tortuguero represents the longest-continuous sea turtle monitoring and conservation program.

Today, the work carried out in Tortuguero includes standardized nest monitoring, special research projects, a research assistantship program, an eco-volunteer program, operation of a natural history museum and visitor center for tourists, and diverse community outreach and education programs involving members of the Tortuguero community. The Station Manager will oversee the operation and maintenance of the station itself; supervise a staff of approximately 10 maintenance, food service, custodial and visitor relations personnel; serve as a primary liaison for STC with the community, local businesses, government authorities and international volunteers; and work closely with STC's field research coordinators and public outreach coordinators.
