I have received a request from a marine biologist with the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology for information regarding the Marine Corps personnel stationed on the islets of French Frigate Shoals (23°45'N, 166°10'W in the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands) during the period January through August, 1942.

The French Frigate Shoals area has great scientific importance as the last breeding grounds for the Hawaiian green sea turtle. It is believed that the Marines stationed in this area during 1942 (prior to military construction) may be able to provide valuable historical information on green turtles and other wildlife.

Your assistance is sought in providing the names and addresses of surviving members of this Marine contingent. Thank you very much for your attention to this request.

Dear Major Larghey:

On May 25, 1976 I requested assistance from Congresswoman Patsy Mink in locating Marine Corps personnel who served at French Frigate Shoals prior to the start of construction (August 1942) on the Tern Island air station. The fact that a small contingent of Marines was assigned guard duty at this remote location during this time period was brought to my attention by the book "Builders for Battle" by David Woodbury (1946). For your information, I have enclosed copies of pages 378-381 from Mr. Woodbury's book relating to this subject. Mrs. Mink passed on my request to Brigadier General Charles Cooper, Legislative Assistant with Marine Corps Headquarters in Washington, D. C. Earlier this month I received a reply from Brigadier General E. H. Simmons, Director of Marine Corps History and Museums, listing you as having been one of 17 Marines assigned to this duty. A copy of Brigadier General Simmon's letter has been enclosed for reference purposes.

My desire to communicate with persons who had contact with the small, uninhabited islets at French Frigate Shoals before construction began on Tern Island stems from my involvement in biological research of green sea turtles. Over the past four years I have spent many weeks at French Frigate Shoals monitoring nesting activity. Most of my work has been carried out on the centrally located Island of East, which consists of little more than 12 acres. A Coast Guard LORAN Station was located at this site between 1944 and 1952, however the island is presently once again uninhabited. Since 1952, the Coast Guard LORAN Station has been situated on the reconstructed island of Tern. The Navy abandoned Tern Island in 1946 and it pretty much remained unused until 1952. All of the other small islands at French Frigate Shoals continue to be unused by man, serving as nesting sites for turtles, seabirds and seals.

What I am trying to do is gather together as much historical information as possible on the occurrence and past status of green sea turtles at French Frigate Shoals. ~~Needless to say, I am most appreciative that you agreed to make your name and address available, thereby allowing me the privilege of contacting you with this letter.~~ Ideally, I would like to be able to speak with you in person about your experiences at French Frigate Shoals and learn whatever memories you may have of green sea turtles and other wildlife. Hopefully, someday this may be possible as I occasionally travel to the mainland United States. In the meantime, I hope you will have the time to write to me about this subject. Any assistance that you are able to provide, regardless of how small, will greatly be appreciated. I am interested in any general observations that you may recall, such as occurrence and location of nesting and ^{the} numbers seen. Perhaps you may even have photographs taken during your tour of duty. I would, of course, reimburse you for the cost of duplicating any such material. turtle

I fully realize that it has now been over ⁴33 years since you were at French Frigate Shoals. In addition, due to the isolated location and short period of time spent there, I would certainly not expect you to recall your stay in much detail. However, I again repeat that I will sincerely appreciate any and all information that you are able to provide.

I look forward to hearing from you as soon as your time permits.

Dear Ms. Mink:

This letter is in further response to your request of 9 June 1976 for information on any Marines on French Frigate Shoals during the period January through August 1942.

An alphabetical list of the 17 Marines who were recorded on Marine muster rolls as having been stationed on French Frigate Shoals in that time period is attached. This office was able to locate one of those Marines, Major P. J. Larghey, USMC, (Ret.), 4240 Mt Casas Court, San Diego, CA 92117, 714-278-8060, in a telephone conversation with this office on 12 August 1976, Major Larghey waived his rights under the privacy act and authorized us to release his address and telephone number to your office. This office was not able to contact Chief Warrant Officer J. E. Hutchison, USMC, (Ret.), Lodi, CA, who is on vacation until October, however, for authority to release his full address.

Also enclosed are copies of the muster rolls from which the list of names was compiled.

It appears that the Navy had a number of men stationed there too. Enclosed are excerpts from Samuel Eliot Morison's History of United States Naval Operations in World War II which mention naval activities on the Shoals.



Dear Mr. Hutchison:

Your name has been kindly supplied to me by the Director of Marine Corps History and Museums in response to an inquiry to locate Marine Corps personnel who served at French Frigate Shoals prior to the start of construction (August 1942) on the Tern Island air station. The fact that a small contingent of U. S. Marines was assigned guard duty at this remote location during this particular time period was brought to my attention by the book BUILDERS FOR BATTLE by David Woodbury (1946). For your information, I have enclosed copies of pages 378-381 from Mr. Woodbury's book relating to this subject.

My desire to communicate with persons who had contact with the small, uninhabited islets at French Frigate Shoals before construction began on Tern Island stems from my involvement in biological research of green sea turtles. Over the past four years I have spent many weeks at French Frigate Shoals monitoring nesting activity. Most of my work has been carried out on the centrally located Island of East, which consists of little more than 12 acres. A Coast Guard LORAN station was located at this site between 1944 and 1952, however the island is presently once again uninhabited. Since 1952, the Coast Guard LORAN station has been situated on the reconstructed island of Tern. The Navy abandoned Tern Island in 1946 and it pretty much remained unused until 1952. All of the other small islands at French Frigate Shoals continue to be unused by man, serving as nesting sites for turtles, seabirds and seals.

What I am trying to do is gather together as much historical information as possible on the occurrence and past status of green sea turtles at French Frigate Shoals. Ideally, I would like to be able to speak with you in person about your experiences at French Frigate Shoals and learn whatever memories you may have of green sea turtles and other wildlife. Hopefully, someday this may be possible as I occasionally travel to the mainland United States. In the meantime, I hope you will have the time to write to me about this subject. Any assistance that you are able to

provide, regardless of how small, will be greatly appreciated. I am interested in any turtle general observations that you may recall, such as occurrence and location of nesting and the numbers seen. Perhaps you may even have photographs taken during your tour of duty. I would, of course, reimburse you for the cost of duplicating any such material.

I fully realize that it has now been over 34 years since you were at French Frigate Shoals. In addition, due to the isolated location and short period of time spent there, I would certainly not expect you to recall your stay in much detail. However, I again repeat that I will sincerely appreciate any and all information that you are able to provide.

I look forward to hearing from you as soon as your time permits.


