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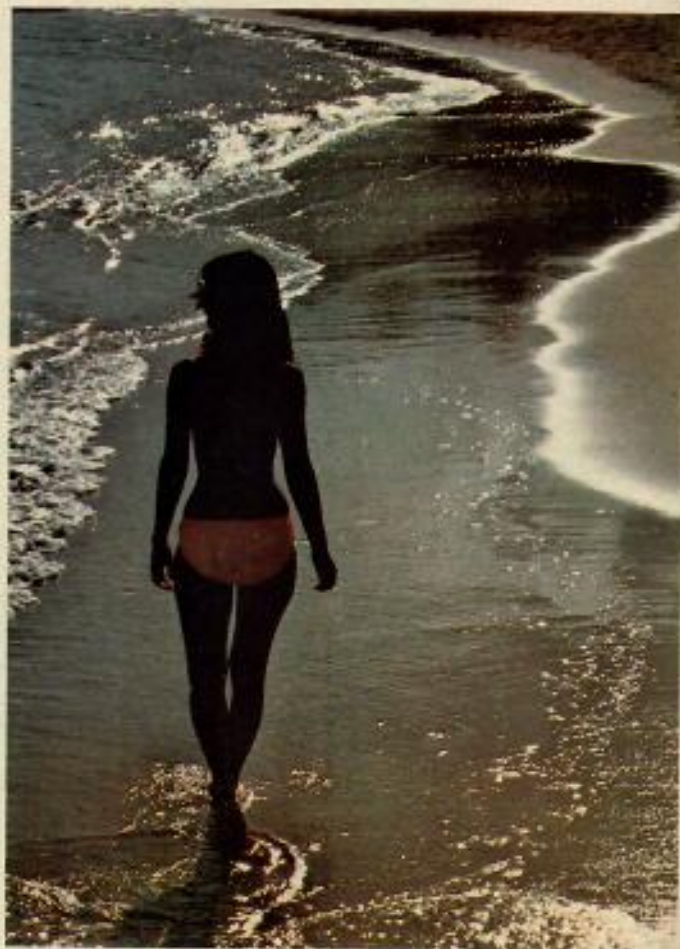

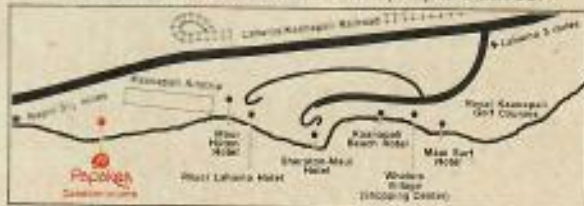
PapaKea means white sand.

Two minutes away is the famous Royal Kaanapali Golf Course. Just down the road are posh hotels and the quaint, restored whaling village of Lahaina.

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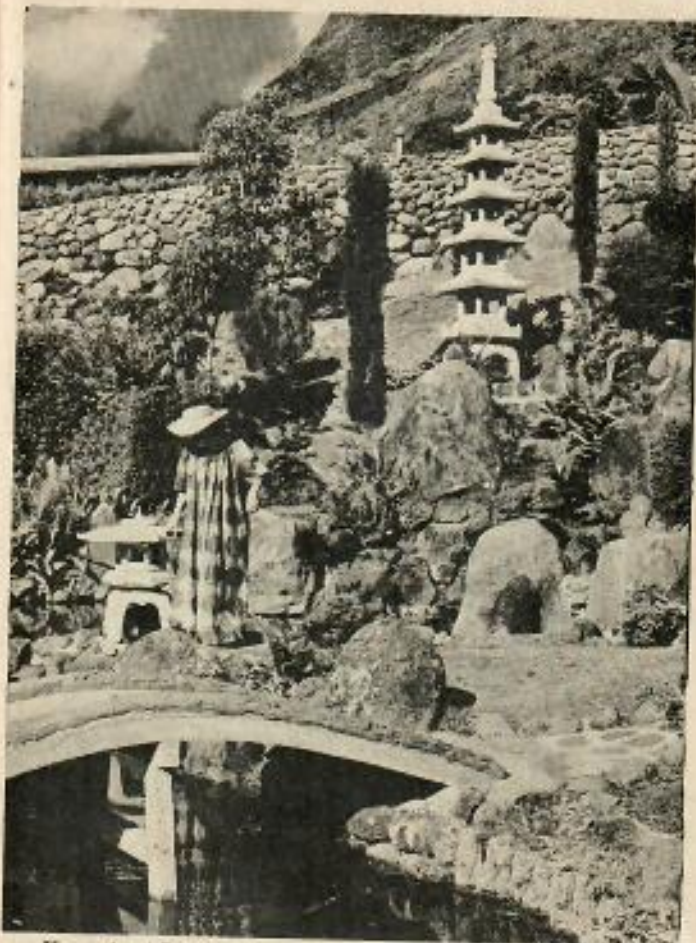

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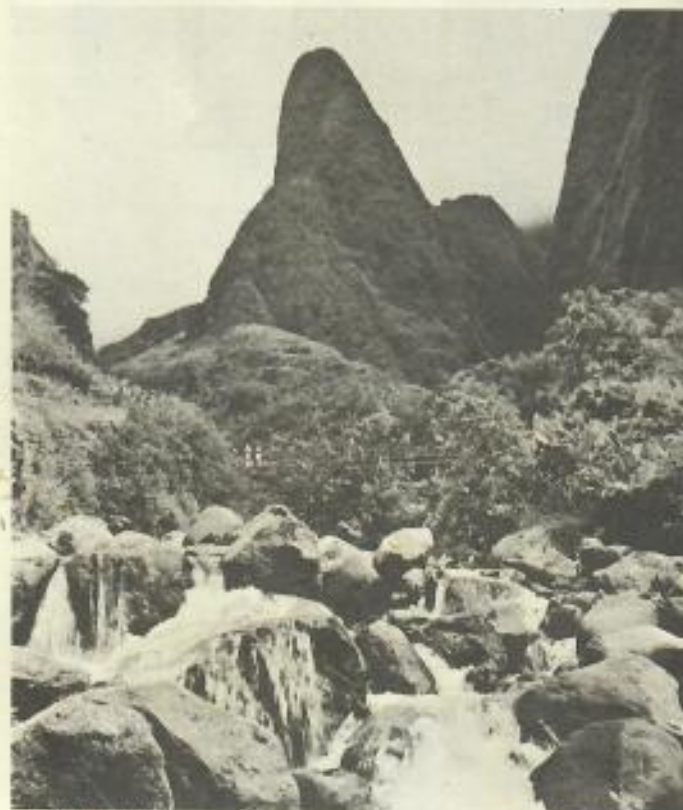
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MAUI 'The Valley Island'

Maui's main airport is at Kahului. Over 80% of all visitors arrive and depart from the Kahului Airport. On Kahului Bay are three resort hotels at which many visitors stay before exploring the rest of the island. The highways to Haleakala, Hana, and through the historic old town of Wailuku to Kihei, Lahaina, and Kaanapali radiate from Kahului.

Two smaller airports serve Kaanapali and Hana direct.



IAO-NEEDLE—Lush tropical splendor within 10 minutes drive from Kahului Airport.

"Maui No Ka Oe"—Maui is the Best—Expresses not only the feelings of Maui residents, but of many who visit the Valley Isle. There are miles and miles of some of the Islands' most beautiful beaches, many of which you may have entirely to yourself. There is the drive, via Route 36, to Hana through verdant jungles, past Kaumanahina Park, Wailua Bay, Waianapanapa Caves, and countless waterfalls including the famous Seven Sacred Pools. Although, the road is narrow and curve-some, the breathtaking views along the way make it extremely worthwhile. This round trip takes a full day.

Then there's the drive to the 10,000 foot summit of the dormant volcano, Haleakala (Hawaiian for House of the Sun), with its strange and spectacular views.



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From the topmost rim of the crater to its floor is a drop of 3,000 feet, and its vast lava cone floor is 25 square miles in area, Manhattan Island it is said could be dropped into it without any trouble. There are several cabins at intervals in the crater for those with the time and ambition to explore on foot or on horseback. Haleakala is reached by Haleakala Highway (Rt. 37 to Rt. 377 to Rt. 378) out of Kahului. It is best to allow at least half a day for the trip.

The only other well-travelled road is Highway 30 which winds through sugar cane country to historic Lahaina and fresh-as-a-dime Kaanapali.

Kaanapali is an outstanding resort destination with five luxury hotels, resort shops, fine dining facilities, and evening entertainment. Here, too, is the 18-hole championship Royal Kaanapali Golf Course from whose greens players often stop to watch spouting whales!

A few miles beyond Kaanapali is peaceful, secluded Napali Bay with several delightful smaller hotels.

By interesting contrast, Lahaina, former whaling port of the Pacific, is almost unchanged since the 1800's. There are fascinating historic places to visit including the Pioneer Inn, Hale Paahao, the Baldwin House and many more. In Lahaina's small harbor you can board the "Coral See" and go coral gazing, can board the "Coral See" and go coral gazing, take a cruise to the island of Lanai, or go deep sea fishing.

Maui has everything—friendly people, sparkling white beaches, spectacular scenery, away-from-it-all seclusion, or golfing, water sports, nightlife and a perfect climate. Yes, "Maui No Ka Oe".

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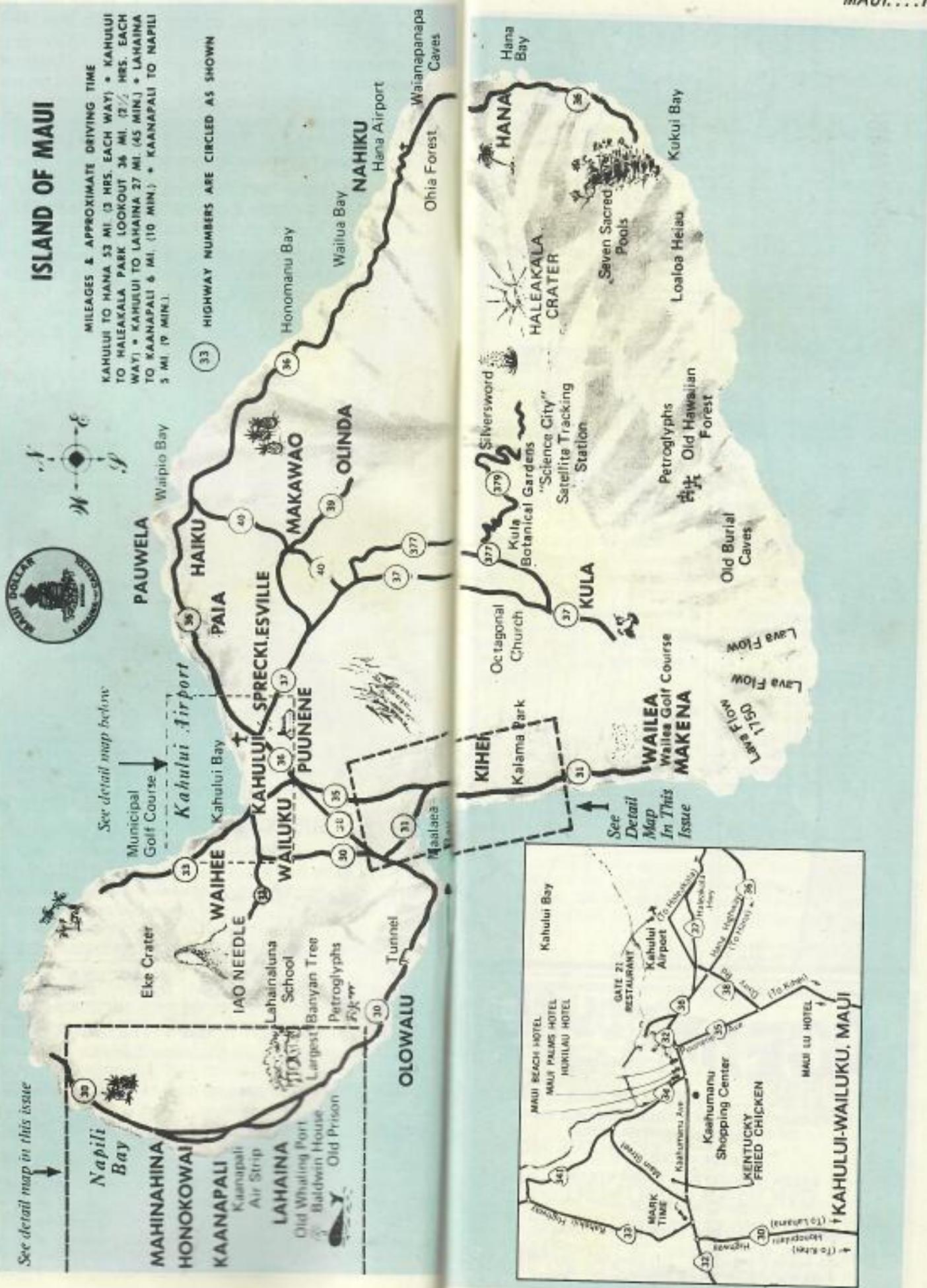

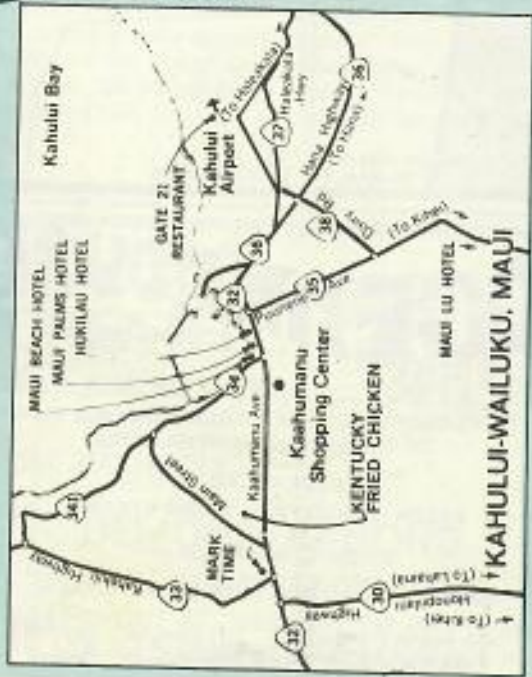
HIGHWAY NUMBERS ARE CIRCLED AS SHOWN



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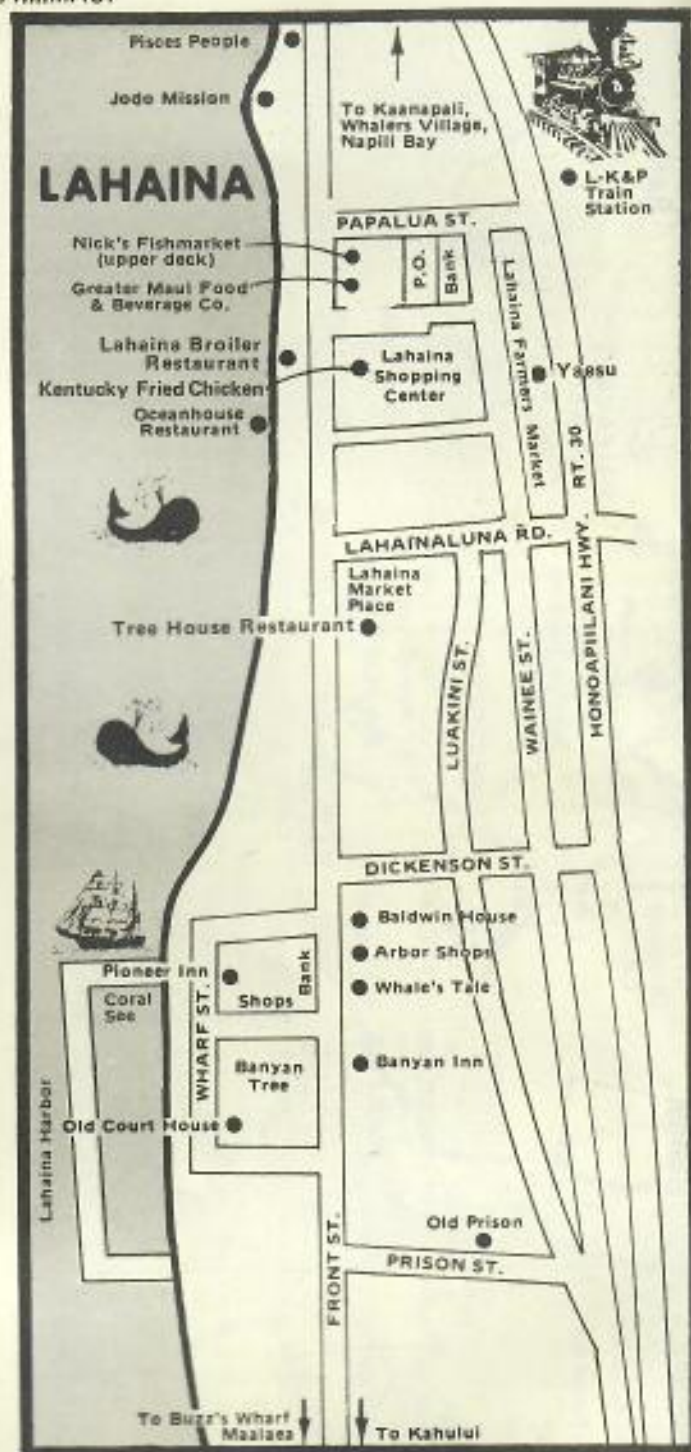
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Where To Go - West Maui

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Lahaina, Old Whaling Port, Now Art Center

Lahaina, famed whaling port of the last century, has in recent years become a noteworthy art center. The Hawaiian Islands have produced a number of famous artists, and the works of several of them may be seen in Maui galleries. Lahaina got its start as an art colony several years ago when the Lahaina Art Society was formed. Their own gallery is located under the big Banyan Tree facing the harbor, in what used to be the Court House.

The shows at the Lahaina Art Society Gallery change every month. Sometimes it's a one-man show, sometimes it's a group show featuring all the members. Its well worth a visit. Who knows, you may buy a painting from a budding artist who someday will be famous.

A little farther down the street at 760 Front Street, we come to the Kelsey Gallery (661-3179). This gallery features such artists as Cee Rodriguez, Ann Cuevas, Ed Fawcett, Hajime Okuda and Bill Sellers, the pen and ink artist. Dimensional abstracts by the owner are also on view.

On Lahainaluna Road, the only street that goes from the sea to the mountains, we come to the Masthead Gallery (117 Lahainaluna Road, 661-0839). Their art lineup is impressive, featuring Dali, Miro, Chagall, Moti, Boulanger, Stancin, Neiman, Le Branch, and Black Velvet paintings by Tyree.

Across the street from the Masthead is the Maui Framing Company which features oil paintings by Steven Sands. Mr. Sands has travelled the South Seas and knows his subjects well. He has had many one-man shows and is getting a lot of attention from Mainland collectors (661-4752).

Joyce Clark is no stranger to Southern California collectors. She has been painting her beautiful seascapes for many years. She now makes her home in Lahaina and has opened the Joyce Clark Gallery at 867 Front Street (661-8068). Featured along with her own work are David Soloman watercolors, oils by Betty Hay Freeland, Mogems Abel carved panels, collages by Jan Stewart and weavings by Ann Allison.

The newest gallery in Lahaina is the Ed Fawcett Gallery, located near the Lahaina-Kaanapali Pacific train depot. (See Lahaina map). Mr. Fawcett has had many shows in Lahaina, and last year packed up his easel & wife, Margie, and moved to Maui. Mr. Fawcett's specialty is seascapes.

In the Kaanapali Resort area at the Royal Lahaina Hotel we find the Larian Gallery. In addition to Mr. Larian's paintings, we see Bill Longyear, J. Lopes, Les Demille, Dolores Kirby, Yllascas, and John Stancin. A cool gallery located in the hotel's Royal Court.

Over at Whalers Village, that interesting shopping center located right in the middle of the Kaanapali hotel area, is the Village Gallery. It is located on the ground level, right across from the Village Cinema. They feature such well known Island names as Jean

Charlot, John Young, Tom Tagami, Pil Soon Conklin, Peter Hayward, and Vonnie Paine. They often have one-man shows which are widely attended.

One final note: if you are visiting Lahaina on a Saturday, don't miss the exhibit on the seawall near the Banyan tree. It is held in front of the Court House. The artists who exhibit are the famous as well as the unknown. You may see a 14 year old who is trying his wings, or you may meet and talk to Phil and Ginny Von Phul, one of the regulars. On a recent Saturday, we saw Cee Rodriguez, the Okudas, Ed Fawcett and Ann Allison. That's every Saturday (and boat-days, too!) on the seawall near the Banyan tree. Everybody is welcome to meet and talk to the artists of Lahaina, Maui.

L-K & P RAILROAD The "Sugar Cane Train"

There's no denying she isn't a mighty Iron Horse and much of the grandeur is gone from railroading in general, but the spirit and the charm and the nostalgia of railroading lives on a little train that plies between Lahaina and Kaanapali on the Island of Maui.

The Lahaina Kaanapali & Pacific Railroad puffed out of the pages of Hawaii's railroading history early in 1970 to become the hottest visitor attraction in the islands.

She's called "The Sugar Cane Train" for she is a restored sugar cane railroad of the type that once laced the State at the turn of the century. These little locomotives used to go out into the sugar cane fields and pull railroad cars loaded with cut sugar cane to the nearby sugar mills. In the late 1800's the trains were a boom to the sugar industry. They more than tripled the ox cart harvesting method.

Today, the Lahaina Kaanapali & Pacific Railroad winds six miles through the lush green sugar cane country of West Maui. The track follows along much of the original railroad bed of the Pioneer Sugar Mill which still operates in Lahaina today. But she carries passengers rather than sugar.

The train is a vivid reminder of the days of old when Lahaina was the robust whaling capitol of the Pacific. As many as 500 great whalers used to call at this rustic port to rest their tough, hard-drinking crews and replenish their provisions. Those were the days when Lahaina was the capitol of the Islands and the place where Hawaiian royalty gathered to play.

Much of the town's aesthetic character remains. While the whaling and the Hawaiian royalty are gone, the Lahaina Kaanapali & Pacific Railroad brings back the pages of the past.

The little railroad's "Singing Conductor" strums his way through the day to the delight of visiting passen-

gers and many a railroader has exchanged stories with the iron mind of the locomotive engineer.

Railroad Adventure Tours offers three separate tours. Tour A combines the train ride with a glass-bottom boat trip on the "Coral See." This is a 3 hr. tour—adults \$8.50, children \$4.25. Tour B combines the train ride and guided tour of historic Lahaina in a 1925 Packard Touring car...includes a "Spirit of Lahaina" production and tour of the Old Baldwin House. This is a 3 hr. tour, adults \$7.50, children \$4.25. Tour C combines the train ride, lunch in historic Lahaina at Pioneer Inn or Lahaina Tree House, and a Souvenir Railroad Poster. This tour is \$5.95, children \$4.75.

"Passport to Lahaina" is the newest tour via the L-K & P RR. This tour offers a full day in Lahaina including round trip ride on the Sugar Cane Train from Kaanapali, 1½ hr. scenic cruise from Lahaina aboard the Coral See Glass Bottom Boat with refreshments included, plus lunch in Lahaina at the famous Pioneer Inn, and Kaanapali Jitney service to and from the RR station. Cost is \$12.50 adults, \$7.50 children under 12.

To reach the Lahaina Train Station, visitors who are driving should turn right off Front St. on Papalua St. to Honoapiilani Hwy. (Route 30). The train station is about 100 yards to the left on Honoapiilani. The parking entrance is about another 100 yards.

In Kaanapali, the Puukoolii Boarding Platform is directly across Honoapiilani Hwy. from the entrance to the Kaanapali Air Strip...parking available. There is no parking at Kaanapali Station which is directly across the highway from the Maui Eldorado Hotel. Visitors may use the foot-bridge over the highway from Kaanapali hotels, or take the hotel jitney buses.

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The hibiscus is the State flower of the Islands. Over a period of years more than thirty varieties of this ever-blooming shrub have been crossed and recrossed with three native species, producing over five thousand varieties to brighten the gardens and roadsides of the Islands. They appear in almost every color except clear blue. Though these short-lived flowers are never used in leis, beautiful, decorative flower arrangements are made by stringing several blossoms on the fine spines of palm leaves. These arrangements must be made fresh daily, as hibiscus blossoms last only a day.

'Round Isles For \$9

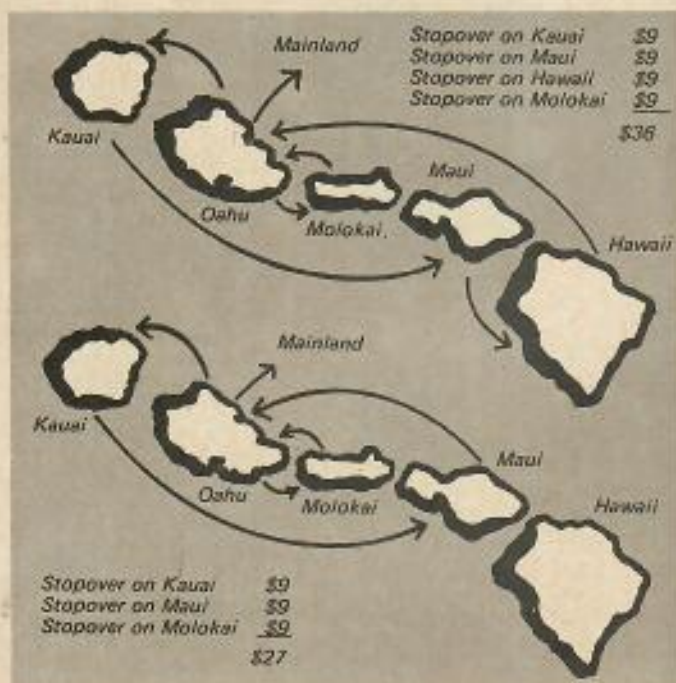
Hawaii has one of the greatest travel buys in the world. If you traveled to Hawaii on a round trip ticket from the mainland U. S., Alaska or Canada on a scheduled air carrier, you are eligible. Simply take the return half of your airline ticket to any Hawaiian Air or Aloha Airlines ticket office and work out an itinerary. Here are the ground rules:

1. In addition to the main island of Oahu, there are four other scenic islands to visit: Maui, Hawaii, Kauai and Molokai. You may visit any island for \$9, any two islands for \$18 and on up to maximum of only \$36 for all four. Those without round trip mainland tickets would pay \$36 for a round trip ticket to Maui alone.

2. If after visiting one or more Neighbor Islands you return to Oahu for an additional stay, add another \$9 to the total. If you connect directly back to the mainland, the trip back to Honolulu International Airport cost you nothing.

3. An important rule: To take advantage of the new Hawaii common fare, passengers must fly one airline only to and from Hawaii.

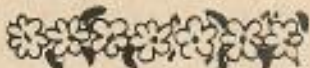

WHALERS VILLAGE

A top attraction in the popular Kaanapali resort area, Whalers Village houses 28 shops and restaurants, all of which boast a nautical decor. Harking back to New England, where hundreds of whaling ships were outfitted to sail around the Horn to the Pacific hunting grounds, Village structures feature shingled walls, slate roofs, widow's walk and carved trusswork. Other buildings resemble ship hulls and ship's cabins with curved corners and timbers like bow keel planks.

Amidst the shops—which range from a large department store and fine restaurants to small gift boutiques—are 96 authentic historical displays. One of the most enthralling is the "World of Whales" at the entrance. Here you'll find pictures and models of many species of whales and ocean mammals, plus a large tile map set in the floor depicting whaling rounds and ports of call in ancient cartographic style. Impossible to miss is the 40 foot whale's skeleton suspended over a reflecting pool.

Whether ye be landlubber or old salt...whales and square-riggers, harpoons and scrimshaw are bound to intrigue you. At Whalers Village on fabulous Kaanapali Beach on the Island of Maui, you slip back into the rollicking hey-day of whaling fleets and brawny seamen in an 8-acre complex of specialty shops, restaurants and historical displays. And, if you're lucky, a touch of realism is added when, in winter months, real live whales frolic a few hundred feet off the beach that fronts the unique village.

Where To Go - East Maui

HALEAKALA—Via Haleakala Hwy. This 200 year old dormant volcano is simply too much to describe. Interesting displays on view at the observatory. Sunrise at the crater is the most spectacular scene this world of ours has to offer. Don't miss the silversword plants growing along the road. Kula Lodge and Silversword Inn at the 3200 ft. level on Route 377 each offers unique accommodations, dining rooms and a shorter early morning drive.

TOP OF THE WORLD

It is fitting that Haleakala is the site of several scientific installations which probe the mysteries of the universe.

Because, in English, the name of the huge, dormant volcano in eastern Maui is "House of the Sun", what better place to observe the sun . . . and stars?

Ancient Hawaiians though, had a different reason for calling the soaring mountain "Haleakala". It was here, according to legend, that the demi-god Maui stood to snare the sun and force it to change its course for the benefit of the islands.

The immense volcanic crater offers delights clearly evident to the naked eye. From the topmost lookout, 10,023 feet high, you gaze down upon a panorama

of other-worldly beauty. Inside the crater's 21 mile circumference are caverns, a desert plain, forest niches, luxuriant meadows, a sparkling lake, and richly colored cinder cones—the highest of which would dwarf the Empire State Building.

Whatever its name, modern day scientists have found Haleakala to be an excellent location for their space investigations. The Smithsonian Institute operates an astrophysical observing and satellite tracking station here; the University of Michigan maintains an astrophysical observatory; and the University of Hawaii conducts air-glow zodiacal light and solar observations. The U.S.A.F. and Federal Aviation Agency also have facilities close by, along the crater rim.

But the average visitor does not need the laser beams and giant telescopes of these observatories to enjoy Haleakala.

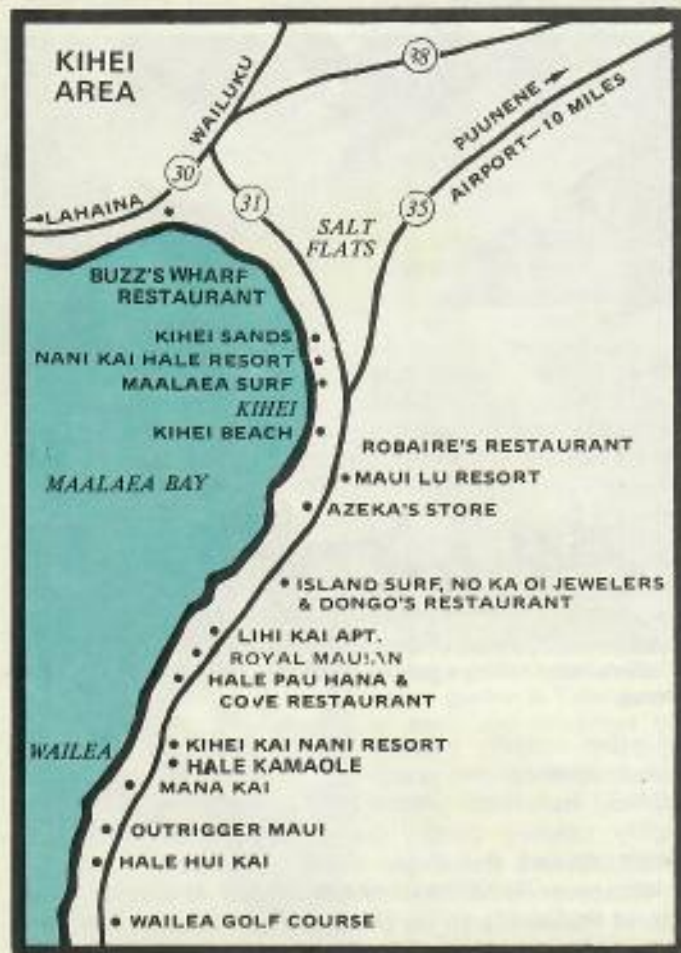

HANA'S GOLDEN GLOW

This tiny town (pop. 600) on the eastern tip of Maui is one of the few remaining outposts of old Hawaii. Tranquil and bucolic, Hana is a lovely, verdant valley on the slopes of Haleakala, the island's massive dormant volcano. Its residents are mostly part-Hawaiians who work on Hana Ranch where white-faced Herefords, horses and other stock are raised on some 7,000 acres of working ranchland. Here, too is the site of Hotel Hana Ranch — a charming, sprawling resort complex which is one of Hana's rare concessions to the outside world of travel and tourism.

Hana Ranch is a rare experience in our day, offering easy-going, rustic pleasures in an authentic Hawaiian setting. But don't let the "country-cousin" atmosphere deceive you; Hana Ranch is a luxurious vacation retreat in the finest tradition.

Other than the 63-unit ranch hotel, visitor accommodations in the remote village include only such small, semi-private inns as Hana Kai Resort Apartments, situated on its own black lava beach, Heavenly Hana Motel and Kauakea Cottages.

Though "remote" is an accurate description of Hana, getting there presents no great difficulty today. Frequent inter-island flights operate between Honolulu and Kahului, Maui. From Kahului, it's a 2½–3 hour drive to Hana — but a drive worth every minute in scenic grandeur. For the more impatient, however, there are also direct flights from Honolulu to the Hana airport.

Once there, it's up to you. Hana doesn't advertise her attractions; you simply look around and find those that appeal to you. Stroll along any of Hana's many beaches — including one of red cinder and one of black lava — and pick up fascinating pieces of driftwood. Stop at one of the innumerable tidal pools and watch minute forms of sealife perform their amazing antics. Or pause and admire the innate grace of local fishermen casting their nets or sunbrowned boys riding surfboards.

Within walking distance are the burial cave of King Kamehameha's wife, Kaahumanu; Wananalua Church, hand-built of lava rock; Hana's little shopping center; and, most particularly, the Hasegawa General Store. One cannot visit Hana without poking into the clutter, confusion and congeniality that made Hasegawa's famous and, in fact, made it the subject of a popular song written some years back. Whether you're interested in poi-pounders or papaya, maps, marbles or mistletoe, you'll find it at Hasegawa's — if you look hard enough.

Hana is the jumping off point for many other picturesque points like Kipahulu and the Seven Sacred Pools. But Hana itself has an enchantment for those who appreciate her special pleasures. Simple pleasures, to be sure — yet the kind that etch themselves in memory to be treasured and relived through the years.

That's Hana. Not gloss and glitter but the golden glow of natural, friendly, leisurely living.

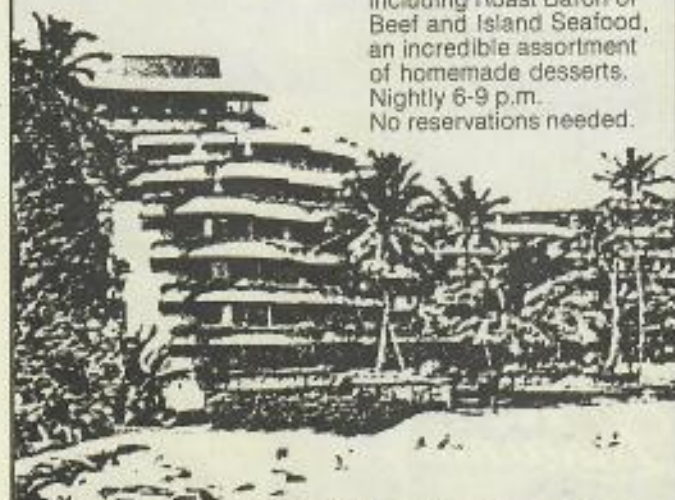

HAWAII Swing around the Big Island

It's the Orchid Island and the Volcano Island but, more important, it's the Big Island, because that's what it is...big. Hawaii is almost twice the size of all other Hawaiian islands combined and, in size as well as variety, it presents a challenge to the visitor with limited time for touring. The solution is to arrive in Hilo, on the east coast, rent a car, tour the major scenic attractions and depart from Kona on the west coast. Or conversely, make essentially the same trip from west to east, arriving in Kona and departing Hilo.

Driving is easy on the Big Island. Though distances are relatively long, major roads are good, points of interest are well marked and traffic is practically non-existent by city standards. Allow yourself two or three days, preferably more, to get acquainted with the island of Hawaii. It's worth it.



Black Sand Beach—Hawaii

If you arrive in Hilo, drive your rental car up Rte. 11 to the town of Volcano, then explore the fascinating volcano area. Kilauea Volcano, the home of legendary Madame Pele, whose destructiveness can be tamed by a bottle of Okolehao, the pride of Hawaiian Distillers. Whether there's an eruption in process or not, the environs are exotic and beautiful. Lava fields that look like desolate moonscapes alternate with luxuriant tree fern forests. You can lunch, or spend the night at famous old Volcano House on the crater's rim.

After a jaunt around the Crater Rim Drive, your next stop is Hilo itself. The city has old-fashioned charm. Two attractions which never fail to please are the nurseries which grow orchids and anthuriums, and the Lyman Museum. The largest and most interesting flowers can be found at Orchids of Hawaii, 575 Hinano St., Hilo.

For shopping, visit many interesting shops at Hilo's Waiakaa Village Market Place, quaint old downtown Hilo with its blend of old and new, and the hotels on Banyan Drive. Spend the night at one of Hilo's many fine resort hotels and next day leave for Kona via the fabulous Hamakua coast on Route 19. By all means leave early, because there are many sights to see between Hilo and Kona.

The excellent highway skirts the ocean along Hawaii's north-east shore past such gorgeous natural wonders as Akaka Falls. After the falls, Route 19 goes through miles of wonderful lush country along the Hamakua coast to Honokaa, which is called the "macadamia nut capitol of the world." The Pacific which girdles the coast is the deepest royal blue in the world, a color which will linger long in your memory.

Also, about eight miles north of Honokaa on route 24 is the Waipio Valley lookout. It is possibly the grandest vista in Hawaii, if not the world. A one hour jeep tour of the valley is a-

available from the lookout. The Waipio Valley Shuttle provides this service. Call 885-7095 for reservations.

Then, after returning to Honokaa and Route 19, it is only a short drive through lush, rolling country to quaint Kamuela. It's the headquarters for the Parker Ranch, second only to Texas' King Ranch in size. It's pleasant indeed to spend a little time driving around Kamuela. The Waimea Village Inn is a delightful place to stay and has an excellent restaurant, The Angus.

At the junction of Route 26 and Route 25 is the Kamuela Museum containing many ancient and royal Hawaiian artifacts. There the road forks, with Route 26 going down to the sea at Kawaihae. It's only 11 miles to Laurance Rockefeller's Mauna Kea Beach Hotel. *ESQUIRE* called it "one of the world's three great hotels" and every tourist passing through is cordially invited to share the pleasure of lunch, golf, or a luau.

Then continue on 7 miles south on the spanking new Queen's Highway past Hapuna Beach, which is a great favorite of the local people. You will see the main road branch off to the left, but it's worth the time to continue 1 mile to Anaeohomalu Bay, which in reality is a lovely, palm-fringed lagoon. Then go back 1 mile and turn right to start driving up to Waikoloa Village, which is part of a planned 31,000-acre community. The Village Restaurant and Club House is open to the public, as is the magnificent Robert Trent Jones, Jr. Golf Course. Additionally, there are tennis courts, a swimming pool and riding stables for the visitors' pleasure.

Continuing on from Waikoloa you reach Route 19 where you turn right and continue on to Kona. You'll travel over some of the most magnificent lava flows in the world, and perhaps out of this world, too. The vistas of the coast and of the volcanoes are equally stunning. About half way to Kona you will see the entrance to the unique Kona Village Resort, which is marked by a gate house and American and Hawaiian flags. This off-the-beaten-path hideaway takes approximately a half hour to reach and there you will find 70 thatched-roof bungalows, South Pacific outside, luxurious and modern inside. An excellent dining room is open to visitors, many of whom also arrive by commuter aircraft.

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There is an alternate route between Hilo and Kailua-Kona: route 11, along Hawaii's east coast. A side trip will lead you to the famous Black Sands Beach again in the Ka'u area. Here you will find the new Punalu'u Village Restaurant. The Polynesian fishing village-styled complex also includes the Ka'u Center of history and culture, a mini-museum. Route 11 continues on to South Point, the southernmost spot in the United States. From there Route 11 follows Hawaii's west coast to Kailua-Kona.

Where To Stop On Route 19

MAUNA KEA BEACH HOTEL—Route 26, ESQUIRE rightly calls it one of the three greatest hotels in the world. Superb buffet lunch, \$6.00.

Colonel Sam's Bar is open daily except Sun.

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Hilo - City of Rainbows

Fascinating sites and activities in the Hilo area have created a pattern of longer visitor stays.

Direct jet flights from the mainland U.S.A. have made Hilo, Hawaii's second gateway city, a visitors' playground.

This sleepy, one time plantation town, curls about a beautiful deepwater bay with inland lagoons fingering through serene Japanese Yedo type gardens named for Hawaii's last monarch, Liliuokalani.

History and legend abound in this area of the Big Island and visitor facilities provide fun-filled evenings of dining and entertainment.

Near Hilo are two of the state's best loved waterfalls - Rainbow Falls, where colored light prisms dance in the spray above the home of goddess Hina, mother of Maui, and Akaka Falls, a 420 foot ribbon of foamy white cascading amid lush natural green foliage. Rainbow Falls is on Rainbow Drive off Waiianuenue Ave., below Hilo Hospital, just a short drive from Hilo Bay resort hotels. There's a picnic area for those who would like to take a box lunch. Further up Waiianuenue Ave. turn on Peepee Falls St. and take a short hike on the trail that leads to interesting Piihouna Boiling Pots. Akaka Falls is about 15 miles north of Hilo. Take Route 19 to Honomu, then Route 22 to the falls.

The massive Naha Stone rests in front of the public library at 300 Waiuanue Ave. Legend has it that this stone could only be moved by someone the gods judged competent to rule the Big Island. Young Kamehameha I, who conquered and united all the Hawaiian Islands, not only moved the huge basalt stone, he turned it over.

Lyman House, an old missionary residence built in 1839, is completely restored and furnished with missionary antiques donated by island families throughout Hawaii. The adjacent Museum houses a rare collection of Hawaiian tapa that is the envy of curators everywhere. It is in downtown Hilo, at 276 Haili St. See map.

Hilo is often called the city of orchids. Gardens, open to the public, display a profusion of orchids and other exotic tropical flora most often seen one at a time in a lady's corsage. Orchids of Hawaii, the Big Island's largest nursery, offers a comprehensive display of orchids, anthuriums and gift items at 575 Hinano St. (See Hilo map.) Visitors are welcome. The Orchidarium at 524 Manono St. is well worth a visit. See Hilo map. It is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and there is an admission charge of 50¢. Kona's Floraleigh Gardens at 1477 Kalaniana'ole Ave. and Hirose Nurseries at 2212 Kanoehua Ave. near the Hilo Municipal Golf Course are also well worth a visit.

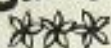
The tropical gardens and waterfowl at Waiakea Resort Village have created a favorite retreat for visitors and residents. The gardens are used by the University of Hawaii's Hilo campus for a botanical classroom. A free sampan bus from the Banyan Drive hotel area to Waiakea Resort Village leaves every half hour daily except Sunday — a short drive.

Hilo is also the home of the outer islands' only fish auction, and deep sea charter fishing boats boast an enviable record. At the Suisan Fish Market, Hilo Bay Drive at Lihikai St., there is a daily fish auction at 7:30 a.m. (for early risers). There is always a display of colorful south pacific fish. Fishermen not planning to go on to Kona can charter a deep sea fishing boat here at Suisan Harbor.

And, it's from Hilo one travels to visit the home of Madam Pele deep within Halemaumau caldera in active Kilauea volcano. This 30 minute drive from Hilo is a must. In route stop at Hale Manu Crafts Shop located at Panaewa Forest just off Volcano Highway — Follow HVB Warrior signs. Lunch at the charming Volcano House on the rim of Kilauea Crater, or spend the night.

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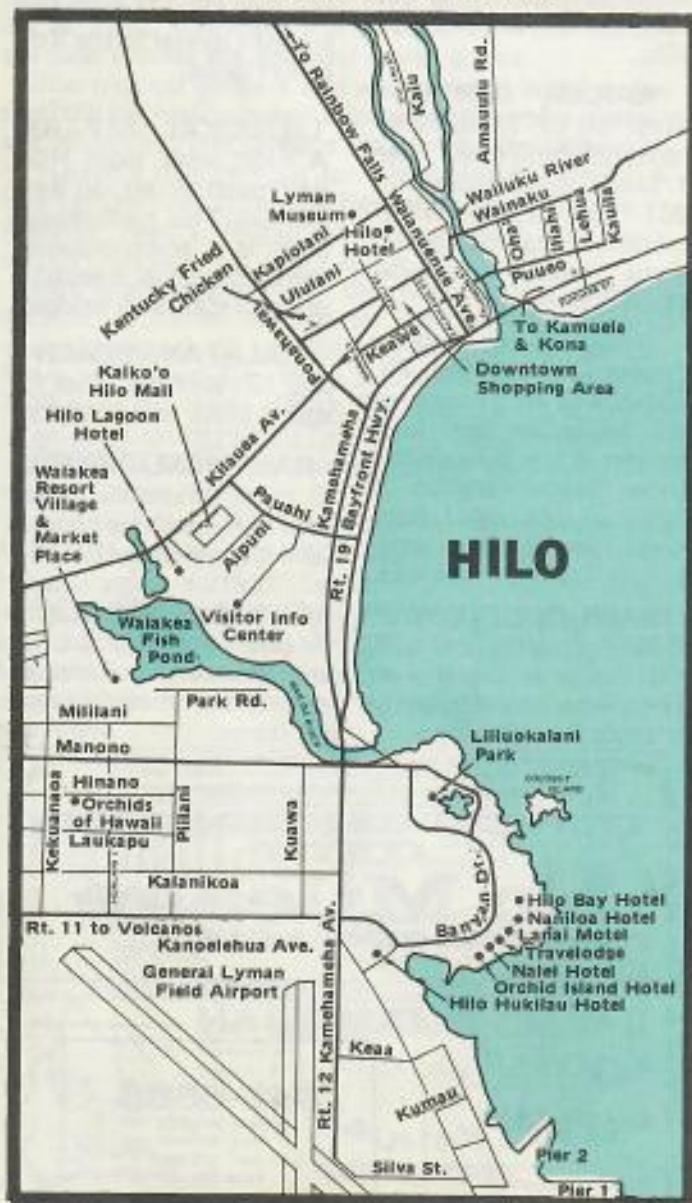

WAIKOLOA OPEN

The Great Waikoloa Open, a golf tournament with a \$2,500 purse for professionals and more than \$1,200 worth of prizes for amateurs, will be held at Waikoloa, Hawaii, on Nov. 7, 8 & 9.

The tournament will be open to professional golfers and to amateur golfers with handicaps of 18 or less. It will open with an 18-hole pro-am on Nov. 8 and will follow up with 36 holes of stroke play on Nov. 8 and 9.

The entrants will compete in three flights, a professional flight, a championship flight for amateurs with handicaps under eight, and an amateur flight for those with handicaps from 8 to 18. In amateur flights, low gross and low net prizes will be awarded, and more than \$1,200 worth of merchandise prizes will be up for grabs. Top prizes in the professional flight will be \$450, with \$300 for second, \$250 for third and diminishing cash prizes down to \$100 for 12th.

The pro-am event, scheduled for tee-off at noon on Nov. 7, will feature four-man teams consisting of three amateurs and a professional. They will play team best ball, with full handicap. A \$100 cash prize will go to the pro on the winning team, and each amateur will receive a \$25 merchandise award. Second place will produce \$75 for the pro and \$20 for each amateur.

An additional feature of the tournament will be the Waikoloa Cup. In this event, a pro and an amateur from his club will compete over the 36 holes of stroke play for the cup, which is a special award designed to give credit to the pro for developing a promising amateur golfer.

Although steaks, chops and salads are on the menu, diners at **THE HIBACHI**, on Banyan Drive, frequently turn to the Japanese menu which offers a variety of complete dinners served on a lacquer tray in typical Oriental style.

Entrees include Teriyaki beef \$5.95; Mahimahi \$5.95; Chicken Sukiyaki (tender pieces of chicken, bamboo shoots, mushrooms, burdock, yam noodles and onions cooked in a special soy flavored sauce) \$5.95; beef Sukiyaki \$5.95; Oki-Nabe, a sukiyaki with lobster, scallops, shrimp, fish, bamboo shoots, mushrooms, yam noodles and cooked onions \$5.95. Children are welcome and dinners for them are \$3.50.

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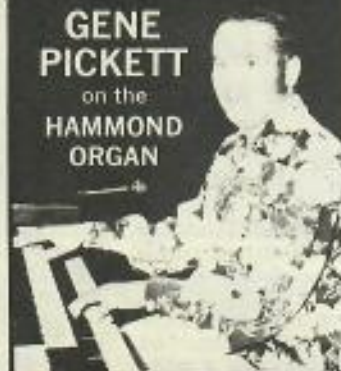

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MOLOKAI the Friendly Island

KAUAI, 'The Garden Isle'

The entry to Kauai is Lihue airport, and with two important exceptions, most hotels are either on Poipu Beach on the West Shore, or near the Wailua River on the East Shore. (The two exceptions are the Kauai Surf on Kalapaki Beach and Hanalei Plantation on Hanalei Bay.) However, almost all visitors tour the entire island, no matter where they headquarter.

Lihue itself is well worth an hour or more of exploration. The first stop might be the Lihue Shopping Center. Although most of the stores carry merchandise which can be found on the mainland, the Kauai Stores and Woolworth's carry unique tourist items. The carved effigy of a sailor with a spy glass inside the former is a survivor of the original Plantation Store, long since demolished. Across the street from the shopping center are the Haleko Shops, which are nothing more than the old plantation foremen's homes authentically and charmingly restored.

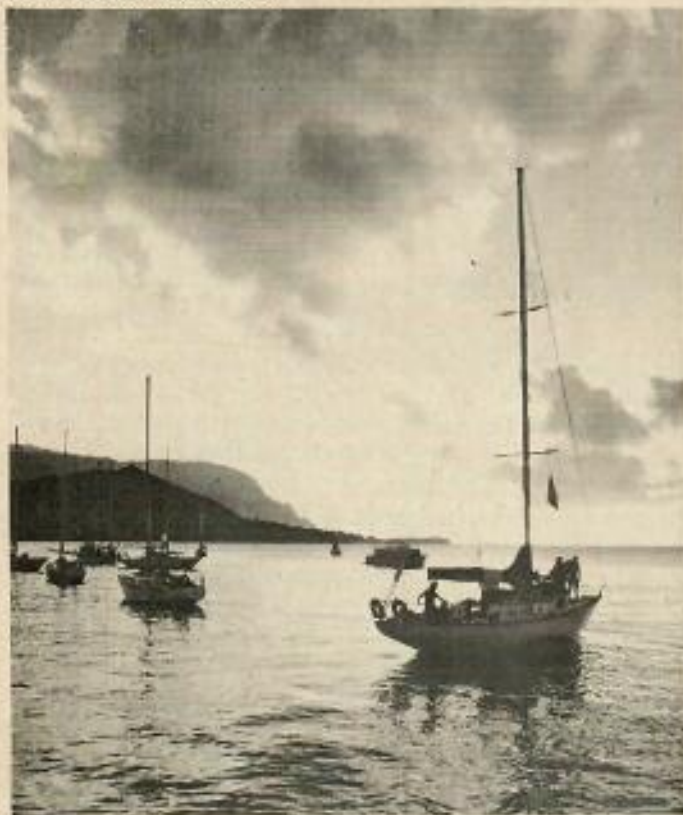


Fields of Taro Plants, Hanalei Valley, Kauai

Also, almost all visitors drive around Nawiliwili Harbor and stroll Kalapaki Beach just two miles from the center of Lihue, no matter where they stay. When one of the Matson Line Freighters loads or unloads at Nawiliwili Pier, it has a charm that all the airports in the world cannot equal.

Just outside Lihue, heading toward Wailua, is Old Hanalei Town with picturesque plantation stores, museum, shops and restaurants. The museum is free, a fascinating collection of early Hawaiiana...and sugar cane is ground daily on the antique mill. The next

stop for most visitors is at Wailua where they may make a trip up river to the fern grotto. Another attraction in the area is Kauai's Paradise Pacifica with 31 acres of tropical gardens, authentically recreated villages and "People of Paradise" evening spectacular. Proceeding along Kuhio Hwy. toward Kapaa town you will notice the complex of hotels, a shopping center and Plantation Hale condominium on the ocean side of the road. This is Coconut Plantation. The shopping center, known as The Market Place, offers a wonderful selection of treasures from around the world, including locally crafted items. Artifacts salvaged from various sugar plantations and huge photo murals of early Hawaii give The Market Place an authentic flavor. Pause for a fresh island fruit treat while you watch the free hula show or stay for a leisurely lunch or dinner. After driving past miles of sugar cane, pineapple and papaya trees, the next place of interest is Kilauea Light house. Following that is Hanalei, home of the movie South Pacific and the wet and dry caves of Haena where the road ends. This round trip through paradise takes from four to six hours.

On the West Shore trip, you take Kaumualii Highway (Rt. 50) through miles of sugar cane and quaint small towns until you reach Waimea. Except for the state of Alaska, this is the only spot of land in the United States where Russia and our own country have had a direct confrontation. Here in 1817 a Russian fur company built a fort near the mouth of the Waimea River in hopes of winning Hawaii for the Czar. The next stop is usually Waimea Canyon lookout. It is as astonishing as the Grand Canyon of the Colorado. More than a view, it is an experience! Its grandeur and jewel-tone colors will linger in your memory. This trip takes four to six hours.

CRUISING KAUAI'S RIVER

Cruising down the river on a sunlit afternoon has a very special flavor if the river is the Wailua and the island is Kauai. As mellow Hawaiian voices sing to the accompaniment of strummed ukuleles, you glide between banks of dense tropical foliage on the placid river to your Fern Grotto destination.

But your Wailua River cruise really starts in Lihue, arrival point on the Garden Island. Kauai's county seat, though one of the oldest plantation towns in the islands, retains something of a frontier outpost look. There's the old Plantation Store with its trademark, a carved wooden sailor with a spy glass; the Lihue horse trough cast in marble and shipped around Cape Horn in 1909; the old cemetery with its stately monument to the Rice family, island pioneers. And there's much that's modern in Lihue, too. The Lihue Shopping Center includes gardens and carp ponds as well as fine shops and dining spots. The Kauai Surf Hotel, fronting Kalapaki Beach, rises in gleaming splendor just a few miles out of Lihue.

At the mouth of the Wailua River are new and lovely Kauai Resort Hotel and the Coco Palms Resort, a cluster of cottages in a tropical grove of ponds and coconut palms. At the Wailua Marina, you'll find a restaurant, shops and the docks from which your river boat departs.

Launches leave at frequent intervals all day and there are even night trips complete with dinner and

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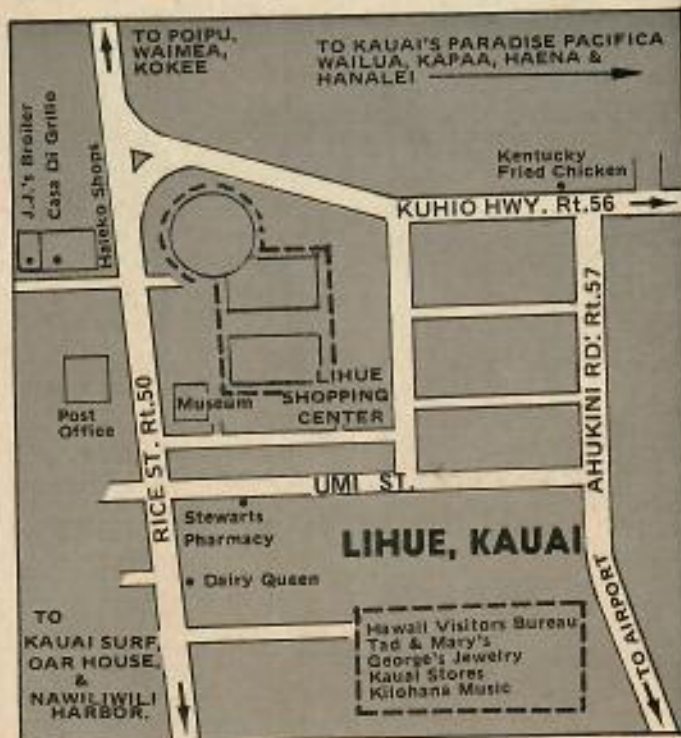


SMITH'S BOATS ENTERTAINERS: These happy Hawaiians will sing and play for your cruise up river to the Fern Grotto.

colorful pageantry. The 3-mile cruise takes about 1½ hours as you follow the gently winding course past forests of hau and pandanus. Once seven sacred heiaus lined the river banks, giving it its name, Wailua, or Sacred Water.

At a landing upstream, you disembark for a short walk along a well-cleared trail through tangled jungle. Then you are at Fern Grotto—a cool, secluded cave, its entrance draped, as though by a supreme decorator, with giant, graceful fishtail ferns. Inside, thousands of ferns fall in cascades from high above. As your boat captain tells you the myths and legends of the cave, a chorus of voices rises in a melodic Hawaiian song. In this amphitheater with its incredible natural acoustics, the voices swell to magnificence you will remember.

And now the peaceful river wends its way back to the Marina to end your cruise. Certainly one of the high points of your visit will be the cruise of Kauai's Wailua River and the grandeur of Fern Grotto.

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WAIMEA CANYON

As you begin the climb to Waimea Canyon be sure to stop just above the town of Waimea, where the whole valley sweeps out before you in a vast panorama of green fields, tiny houses tucked under the palms, the river flowing to the sea, a brilliant contrast of blue and white. Along this portion of the road you will be surprised to see various forms of cactus and terrain that is reminiscent of Southern California. Several mi. above Waimea Town, the road emerges into a forest of silver green koa trees, used by the ancient Hawaiians for canoe building, and prized by present day islanders for its beautifully grained rich red color and high polish when made into furniture.

About 1½ miles beyond the entrance to Waimea Canyon State Park, the Kukui Trail begins its descent to the canyon floor. Well worth exploring for experienced hikers, this trail drops over 2000 ft. in 2½ miles, ending in a State campsite on the Waimea River. From there, you may follow the course of the river up the canyon to the junction of Koaie gorge. Five mi. into the gorge is the legendary pool of Kamalii at the base of Koaie Falls. The Illiau Loop Trail, at the entrance to Kukui Trail, is a nature walk of about ¼ mi. among plants native to the dry western slope of Waimea Canyon.

The road climbs still higher through the koa forest and tall silk oaks with clusters of feathery orange-gold blossoms. Waimea Canyon Lookout offers a spectacular view of the canyon and Koaie gorge, which enters the canyon just opposite the lookout. Against the backdrop of ever-changing colors, birds soar in the updraft from the river, and if you're lucky you may see a flock of wild goats grazing on a grassy slope among the cliffs.

Puu Hina Hina Lookout offers another magnificent view of the canyon, and from the highest platform the island of Niihau is visible. The drive continues through tropical forests, lush with ferns, ginger, orange tritonia, wild blackberries, passion fruit and Kokee plums. The blackberries, introduced originally in the gardens of the mountain cabins, grow rampant, and although delicious to eat have become a threat to native vegetation. The road takes you past Kokee State Park Headquarters where you may rent a cabin, picnic in the pavillion or take a short hike on one of the many trails behind the Lodge, or visit Kokee Museum.

Kalalau Lookout is the culmination of the trip to Waimea Canyon and Kokee. Words are insufficient to describe the magnificent view as the earth sweeps away in a 4000 ft. rush to the sea. Constantly changing shadows accentuate the deeply carved slopes...dragonflies shimmer in the sunlight...koa trees are outlined in stark beauty against the early morning mist...distant waterfalls spill from sheer green cliffs...and far below, the sea, incredibly clear, reflects the brilliance of the sky.

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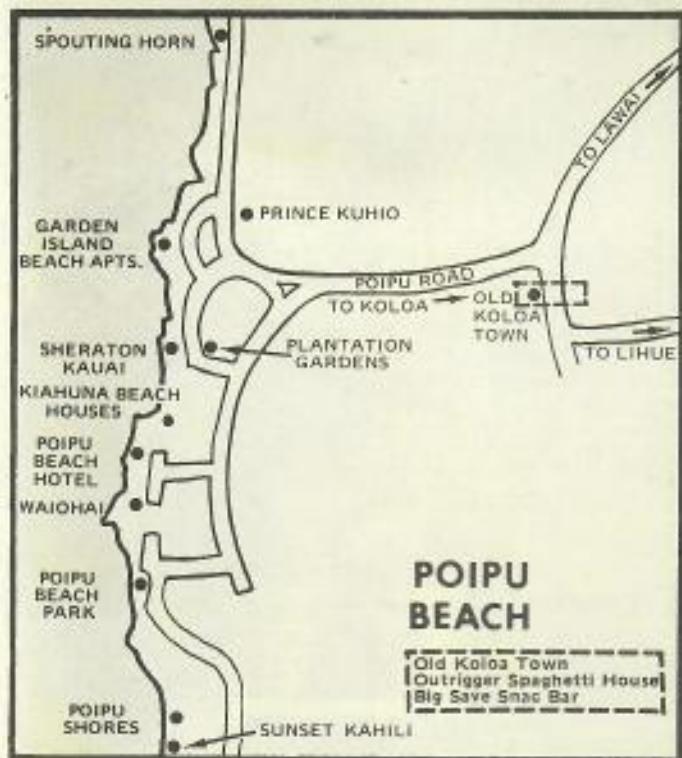

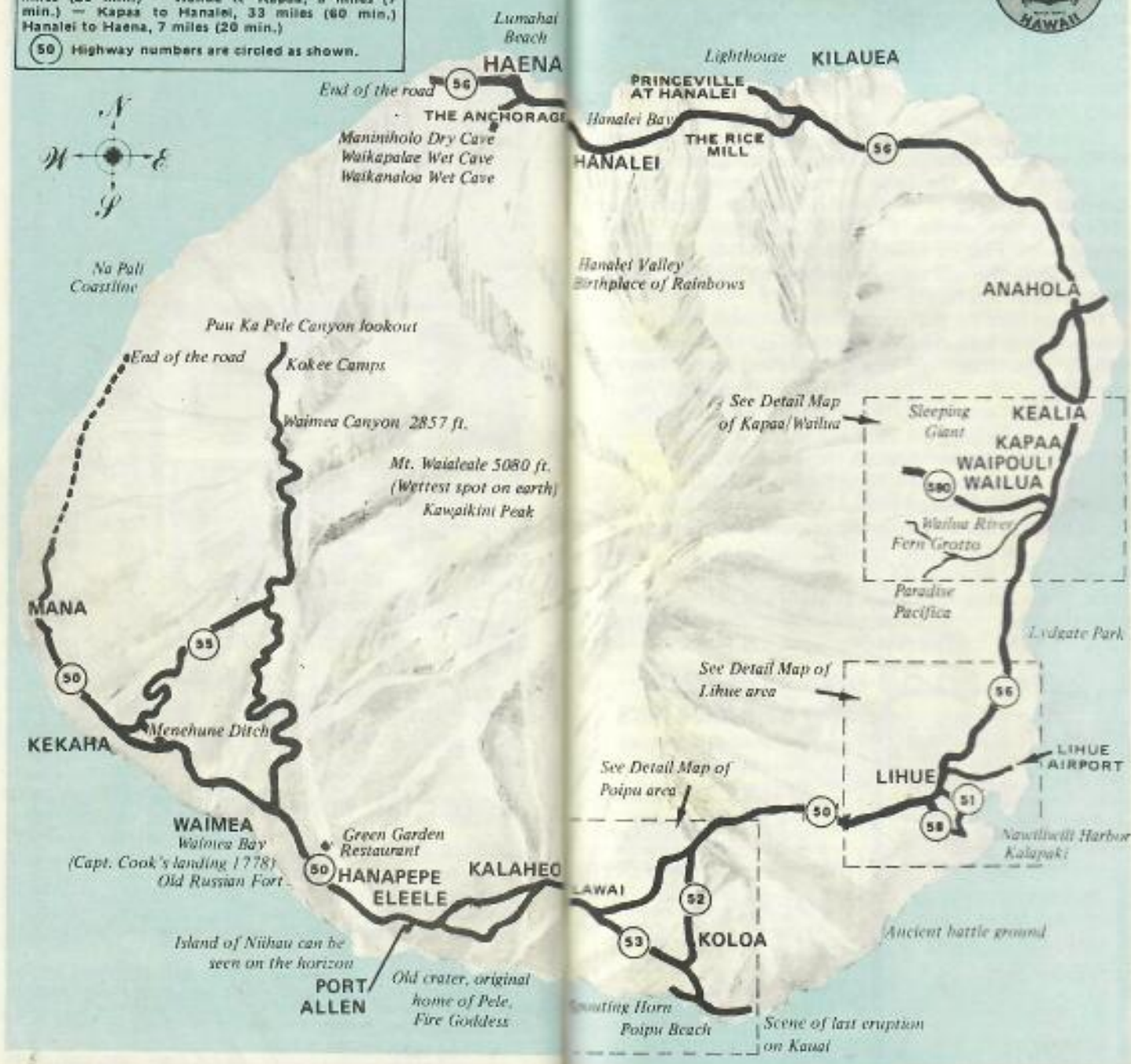

Waterfall Tour To Haena

Waterfalls surrounded by tropical greenery, hidden pools golden with leafy reflections, silver green rivers winding through mist shrouded valleys, awesome black cliffs rising abruptly from the sand, a perfect crescent of beach with one set of footprints...your own. Who hasn't dreamed these dreams of Hawaii? For the visitor with a sense of adventure and a desire to escape the well-traveled highway, the Northeast side of Kauai has such delights to offer.

Wailua Falls, just outside of Lihue, is a good place to begin your tour. Turn left at the sign and follow the cane road for about 4 miles, bearing to the right. The Falls are beautiful any time, but winter is best. In ancient times the Hawaiian chiefs dived over the falls to prove their courage.

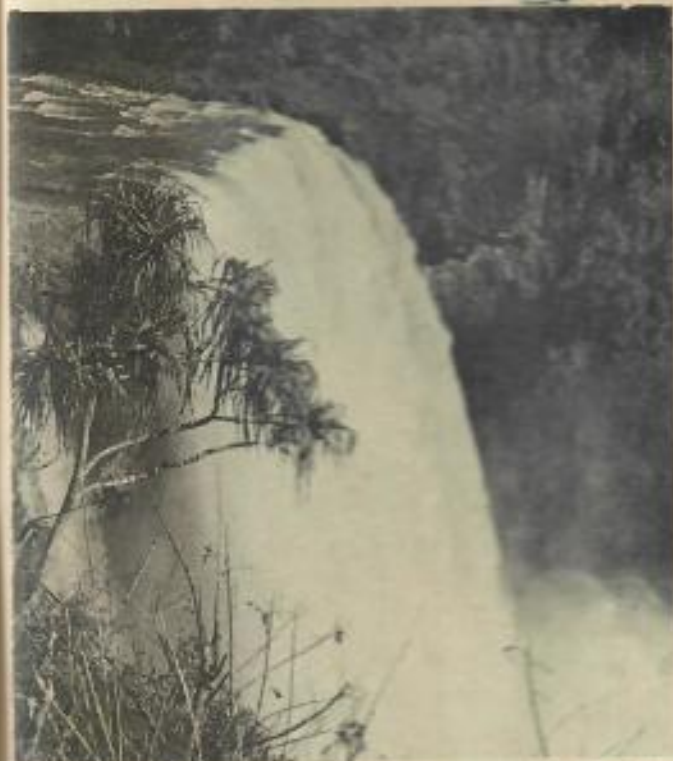
Returning to the main highway, continue on to the Wailua River. The excursion to the Fern Grotto is a good way to see the river and at the same time enjoy

the legends of the area, as told by the entertaining guides on the tour. Just past the river, a left turn on highway 58 will take you to Opaekaa Falls. If you continue on 58 past the Falls, you'll soon find yourself in the magnificent valley behind Sleeping Giant. After a heavy rain as many as a dozen waterfalls are visible cascading down the purple mountains. You'll also have a view of Hawaiian country life, where sleek horses and cattle graze on green rolling pastures that slope away to the sea, and carefully tended vegetable gardens and pineapple fields are in abundance. If you get lost, almost any little road will lead you back to highway 58 and eventually you'll wind through the hills to Kapaa.

Following the main highway again, you'll soon come to the picturesque Filipino plantation camp at Kealia, across the road from a wide unspoiled beach. If you wish to explore Waipahee Slide, turn left at the Kealia gas station and follow the cane road to the

right for about 4 miles. From there, a beautiful hike along a fern-shaded forest path takes you to Waipahee Slide. Here, a mountain stream cascades over the natural lava tube into a deep cold pool surrounded by steep cliffs. The slide into the pool is fast and thrilling. One word of caution: This area is dangerous in very rainy weather.

After you slide into the cold water of Waipahee, the warm beaches of Anahola will be welcome. Follow the road down by the river to the ocean. On weekdays you'll probably have the long curve of sand to yourself, to hunt for driftwood or just float in the lagoon.

From Anahola, you'll drive past miles of cultivated fields and groves of papaya trees. The waterfall slide at Kilauea may be reached by turning right just past the bridge. About a hundred yards on the dirt road a branch goes out to the right. Park here and walk down the trail to the Falls. Unlike Waipahee Slide, the Kilauea Slide shoots you out in front of the falls about 10' and you have the exhilarating sensation of flying. The pool is large and enjoyable for swimming. This was the site for the "Happy Talk" scene in the movie *South Pacific*.

From here on, the scenery grows increasingly more beautiful. Almost any side road will be worth exploring as new vistas continually unfold. Roads to the right of the highway invariably lead back to the beach...sometimes rocky with pounding surf, sometimes a shallow reef with a lone fisherman casting his net, perhaps the idyllic hidden beach you've always dreamed of. The roads to the left of the highway will take you back into lush green valleys where wild chickens scurry under houses on stilts and the smoke from outdoor fires rises in thin spirals to the sky. The main highway ends just past the wet and dry caves at Haina. If you park here and walk back along the beach at sunset, you'll never want to leave Kauai.

Big Island "Spectaculars"

When the curtain goes up on a Big Island "spectacular," the star of the show is always tempestuous Madame Pele, Hawaiian fire goddess and keeper of the flame. According to ancient legend, it is Pele who turns Hawaii's volcanoes on and off. Though frequently temperamental, she is seldom vindictive, normally performing her fiery theatricals in convenient natural amphitheaters where visitors can watch in comfort and safety.

But in return for her dramatic displays, Pele expects some tribute. Hawaiians who know her ways say she is particularly fond of gin, so prudent Islanders toss bottles of the liquor into the flaming volcano pit—not to stop the show, but to encourage Pele to continue the fun and keep her shooting geysers under control.



The eruptions of Mauna Loa and Kilauea volcanoes are not of the highly destructive Hollywood type, but glowing flows of fiery lava. Recently these flows cut the Chain of Craters scenic drive.

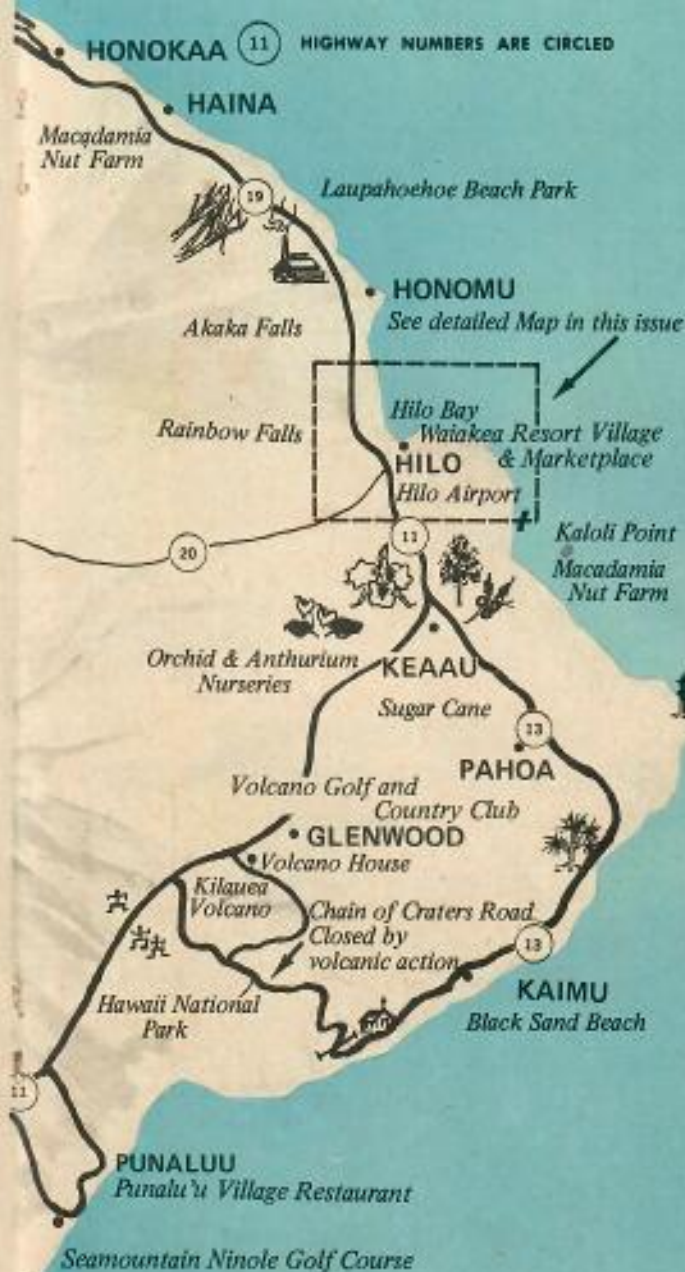
For many years the late owner and founder of the Volcano House, "Uncle George" Lycurgus, who was over 100 years old when he died, ritually donated a bottle of gin to Pele whenever an eruption seemed imminent. And Pele responded by scheduling many of her performances in Kilauea crater—in perfect line of sight from the Volcano House which sits on the crater rim in Hawaii Volcanoes National Park.

Would-be volcano watchers can enjoy Pele's antics from sites other than the Volcano House, if they choose. Inter-island airlines and local air service offer special volcano flights for a panoramic view of the natural phenomenon—especially exciting at night when red-hot geysers soar hundreds of feet into the air and send molten gold lava flows down the sides of steep cinder cones.
