

Bishop Museum scientist bound for Seattle job

Bishop Museum archaeologist/anthropologist Dr. **Patrick V. Kirch** will become the director of the Thomas Burke Memorial Washington State Museum in Seattle.

Kirch, head of the museum's Division of Archaeology and assistant chairman of the Department of Anthropology, is expected to leave at the end of June. He has been associated with the local institution for 21 years.

The Seattle museum is affiliated with the University of Washington, for which Kirch will also become an associate professor of anthropology.
