Interesting Facts about Vucca Volley

Although Yucca Valley's many advantages for year 'round living and vacation fun can't be captured by statistics, they do serve to emphasize how this progressive community is growing so fast. In fact, only the elevation really remains constant, at an average of 3,300 feet; 1959's rainfall was 7.04 inches. This explains why days are sunny, cool, and clear. In the approximate 26 square miles included in the fire and park district, the following figures indicate the totals at press time, although Yucca Valley will hardly stand still long enough to be counted.

The population is 5,200, and the assessed valuation more than \$3,600,000. The 1959 post office receipts were \$28,947.43. More than 700 telephones, 1,220 electrical, and 2,300 liquified gas connections are in service. Approximately 1,200 water connections have been made, and all utilities are constantly being expanded to provide the necessary services.

There are 1,238 registered voters, 3 weekly area newspapers, a brand new drive-in theater, modern supermarkets, motels, and much much more that space limitations prevent listing here. The new Road Runner Route signs are emphasizing the fact that all of the major access routes to this area are now paved, with interesting alternate return routes for your enjoyment. 





Yucca Valley's inviting golf course is open to the public every day of the year. Because of the area's higher elevation and remarkable climate, playing conditions are excellent throughout the year. The course is especially popular during the summer esason, when golfers from many other localities come here to enjoy their favorite sport.

Because of its excellent facilities, flying clubs often meet for pleasant week-ends at Yucca Valley's modern airport. It is lighted for 24-hour use, and there's a restaurant right at the airport. Local motels will gladly provide transportation for visitors who wish to stay overnight. Airport elevation is 3,220 feet, and there's 80 and 100 octane gasoline available. The landing strip is 2,900 feet long.
