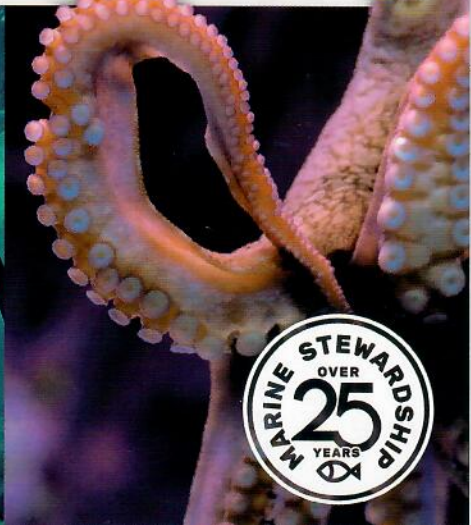

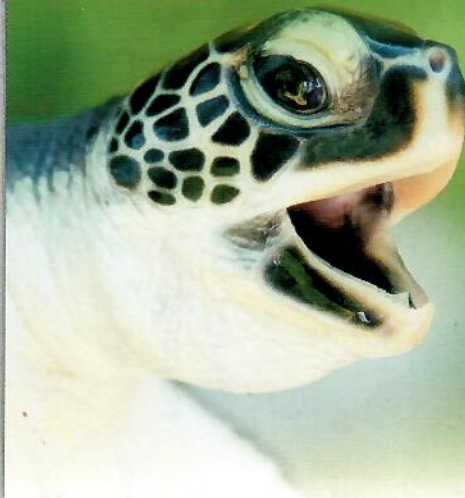

Help Save Our CORAL REEFS

- ★ Choose mineral-based sunscreen
- ★ Don't touch or stand on coral
- ★ Pick up trash & debris
- ★ Choose reusables (cups, bags, straws, utensils, etc.)
- ★ Avoid single-use plastics
- ★ Conserve water
- ★ Say no to pesticide use

TIP: If you need a break from swimming or snorkeling, find a sandy spot to stand up. Never stand on coral reefs. Corals are fragile living animals that can easily be damaged.

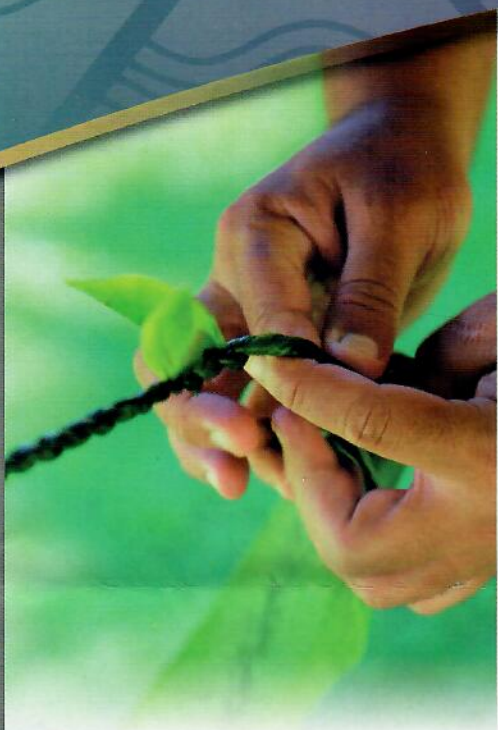
Respect the 'AINA & KAI

When Visiting HALEAKALĀ

Haleakalā is an active shield volcano that stands 10,023 feet above sea level.

When visiting Hawai'i, always respect cultural boundaries & the law.

- Sunrise viewing reservations are required. www.recreation.gov
- Keep your distance from wildlife & never approach or feed a wild animal, including Nēnē (Hawaiian goose).
- Weather & viewing conditions can be unpredictable at the summit. Be prepared for cold, wet & sun.
- Vehicles must remain on roads or in parking areas. Drive at or under the speed limit.
- Leave it the same as you found it, or better! Never litter or vandalize scenery & do not take lava rock home.

- Remove seeds from boots & gear before entering the park to avoid introducing invasive species.

House of the Sun MT. HALEAKALĀ

Hina, the demigod Maui's mother, created cloth out of pounded kapa (bark), but lamented that the sun moved across the sky too quickly for her cloth to dry. So Maui headed to the peak of Mt. Haleakalā, ("House of the Sun,") & lassoed the sun in an effort to slow it down & lengthen the day.

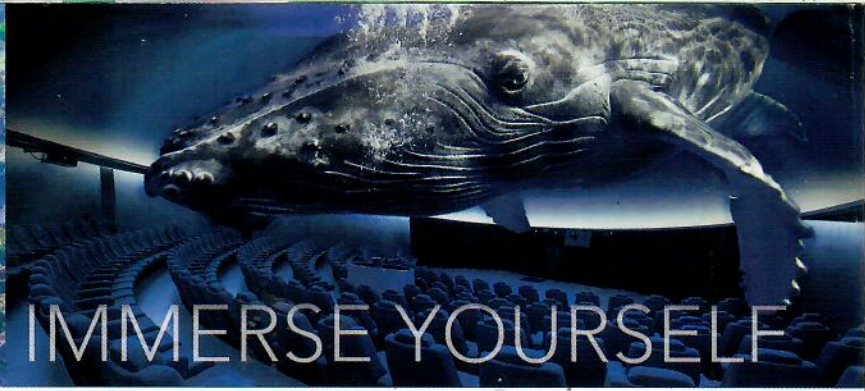
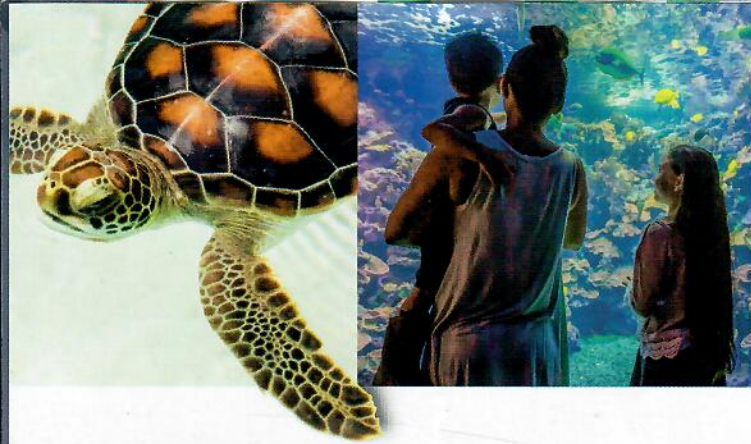
Respecting the ROAD TO HĀNA

Travelers are encouraged to book Road to Hāna travel with a professional tour company. Relax & enjoy the beauty while someone else negotiates all those curves! Plus this reduces traffic along the road to Hāna.

It is important to adhere to local cultural and lawful boundaries.

- Park only in designated parking spaces along Hāna Highway
- Respect private property signage and do not trespass or hike in these areas
- Don't double park at waterfalls or other scenic stops
- Be courteous — safely pull over to allow others to pass you when possible
- Leave it the same as you found it, or better! Do not take lava rock or sand home, and never litter or vandalize scenery
- Stay on designated roads only — no off-roading or driving to restricted locations (see map)

For the past 25 years, Maui Ocean Center's mission has been to foster wonder and respect for Hawai'i's marine life — and to preserve it for future generations.

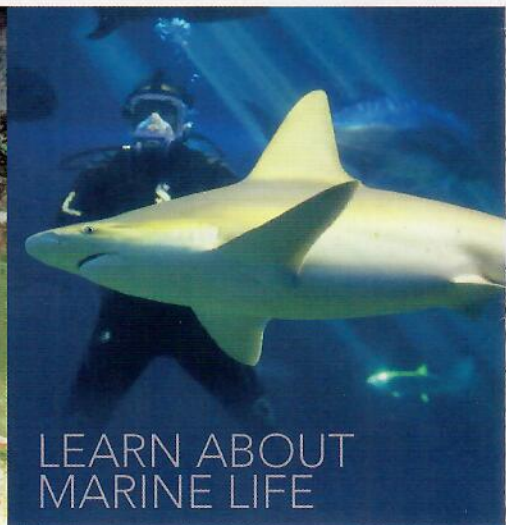
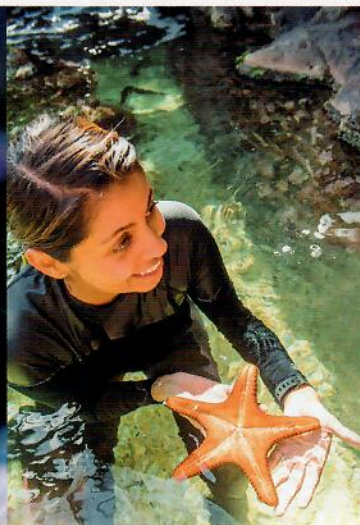
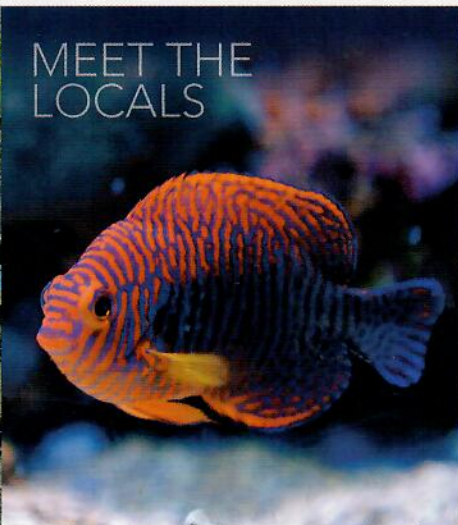
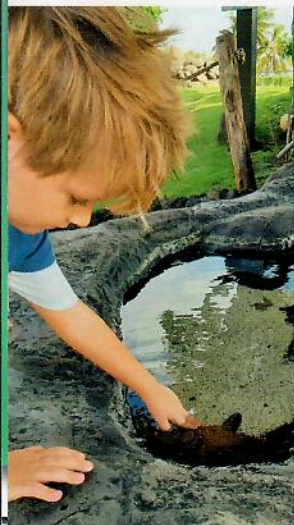

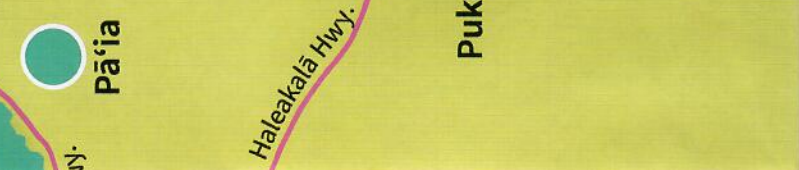
KAHULUI CAR SHUTTLE

car lot is located across from baggage claim.

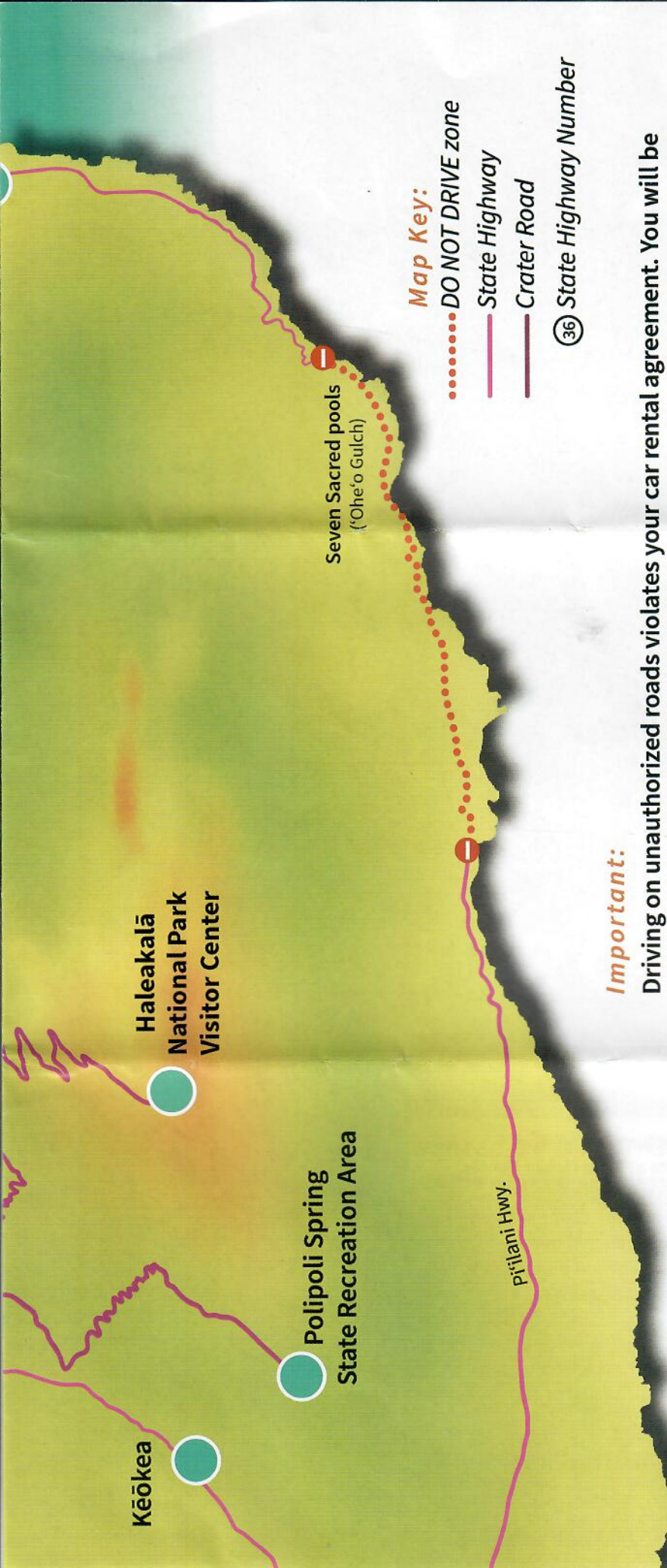
If cars are returned with excessive dirt, sand, pet hair, smoke, or other debris, or if keys are lost or stolen a charge of up to \$450 may apply.

Should your rental vehicle be broken into, you are required by the terms and conditions of the rental agreement to file a report with the Hawaii Police Department by calling: (808) 244.6400 (Maui) or dial 911.

Important:

Driving on unauthorized roads violates your car rental agreement. You will be responsible for any damages, towing or fees associated with driving in these areas.

HELPFUL TIPS:

- **Drive With Aloha**
Follow road signs (speed limit, no parking, private property, etc.) and only drive on paved, authorized roads. Rental vehicles may not be used for off-road driving/ trespassing on private property.
- **Beware of Your Surroundings**
Never leave personal belongings or valuables in an unattended vehicle.
- **Car Seat/Booster Required**
Keiki (children) under the age of 4 years **MUST** ride in a child-safety seat, and keiki ages 4-7 must ride in a child-safety booster seat while riding in a motor vehicle.

• **Cell Phone Down**

Do not use mobile devices while driving.

• **Click It or Ticket!**

All passengers in a vehicle must wear seatbelts.

• **No Smoking**

Cars returned with the smell of smoke may be fined.

• **Keep Keys Dry**

Remember to keep your car keys/fob out of the ocean.

• **Avoid Brake Failure!**

Use low gear when coming down from Haleakalā Crater.
