Notes about Islands in the Pacific.—A rock exists near Kaula (southwest of Niihau) which is not laid down on all charts, and of whose existence some are not aware. It lies in N. latitude 21° 27, west long 161° 19, about forty miles W. S. W. of Kaula Rock, fifty-five from Niihau, and 190 from Honolulu due west. It was an by Capt. Stone of the brig Kamehameha V, and also by Capt. Rickman of the same vessel two years since. In shape it resembles a sugar-loaf, and is about two hundred feet high, a peak rising apparently out of deep water. Although marked doubtful on some recent charts, there is no doubt of its existence. Its name is "Papapa Rock."
