Surgery Summary

Routine spay/neuter. No skin sutures. Your pet was lactating (producing milk) at the time of surgery. If she has recently given birth and is still nursing, she should be returned to her litter as soon as possible. If your pet has not recently given birth, lactation is a result of "false pregnancy." In this case the spay surgery is curative, but it can take several weeks for the clinical signs/lactation to resolve.

THANK YOU FOR CHOOSING TO SCHEDULE YOUR PET'S SPAY/NEUTER APPOINTMENT WITH THE HAWAIIAN HUMANE SOCIETY'S GINNY TIU COMMUNITY SPAY/NEUTER CENTER. PLEASE READ AND FOLLOW THESE DIRECTIONS CAREFULLY:

MICROCHIP

- If your pet received a microchip during their surgery, please remember to register your pet's microchip with 24PetWatch by visiting MYPETHEALTH.COM/START or calling (866) 597-2424. We recommend completing this online. This service with 24PetWatch is free.

TATTOO

- All animals altered receive a small, green line tattoo near the incision signifying the animal has been sterilized. This prevents unnecessary future surgery should the animal become lost, stolen or re-homed.
- The tattoo is recognized by veterinarians and shelters alike.

MEDICATION

- Your pet received an injection of Meloxicam for 24-hour pain management.
- Do not administer any medication intended for human use.

FREE-ROAMING CATS

- It is recommended to keep free-roaming cats in their trap or in a secured area for 24 hours after surgery before release.
- Your free-roaming cat may still be recovering from anesthesia when you pick him/her up.
- Keep your free-roaming cat covered in a warm, quiet, protected space away from the elements (wind, rain, excessive noise).
- If your free-roaming cat is alert and responsive, you may offer a small meal ($\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ of a standard meal) after surgery.
- Free access to drinking water is permitted.
- Please ensure that your free-roaming cat is sternal (back facing upwards) prior to providing food and/or water.
- Unless told otherwise, your pet has no external sutures (stitches) that need to be removed. Any sutures applied are internal and will dissolve within the next few weeks.
- If your free-roaming cat was lactating, please release her the same evening as the procedure, permitted she is sternal (back facing upwards), so that she may provide milk and care for her litter.

FOOD & WATER

- As a result of receiving an anesthetic agent, it is recommended that your pet receive only a small meal ($\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ the standard size) after the procedure to reduce any risk of aspiration. You may resume standard feeding beginning the morning following the procedure. Please allow free access to drinking water.

E-COLLARS (If Applicable)

- To minimize stress for your cat, please only place the e-collar on if you observe licking or chewing behavior.
- If an e-collar is necessary, always keep this on your pet for the duration of the next 14 days, especially when sleeping. This is to prevent your pet from licking or chewing their incision, which can cause it to become infected or to reopen. This can require antibiotics and at times, additional surgery. Ensure that the e-collar extends beyond the end of your pet's snout, even if it is pushed to the base of the neck. Strong plastic e-collars provide the best protection.

ACTIVITY

- Restrict your pet's exercise level for the next 14 days.
- If your pet is not quietly relaxing with you, keep he/she in a crate or small room, such as a bathroom, laundry room or small bedroom.
- If there are other animals or young children in the household, separate them from one another to limit activity.
- No running or jumping, including on and off furniture. No time spent outdoors and limited stairs.

VACCINATION

- If your pet was vaccinated today and has not previously had a full series of vaccines, a booster vaccine should be administered in 3-4 weeks by your primary care veterinarian.

LACTATING AND/OR IN-HEAT

- If your pet was lactating, you may release her to be with her litter on the same day as her surgery.

- If your pet was in-heat, keep her separated from any male cat for the next 14 days.

INCISION CARE

- Keep the incision clean and dry for 14 days.
- Monitor the incision daily to ensure proper healing.
- No baths and do not apply anything topically to the incision, including antibiotics, ointments or water.
- Unless told otherwise, your pet has no external sutures (stitches) that need to be removed. Any sutures applied are internal and will dissolve within the next few weeks. Sealed incisions are closed with a tissue adhesive that needs to remain dry.
- Do not cover the incision with anything including gauze, pet clothing and/or a spay suit.

CONCERNS

- No follow-up is necessary unless a concern should arise.
- Should a concern arise, please first reach out to the Hawaiian Humane Society.
- Should you notice any of the following, please contact us:
 - Loss of Appetite or Lethargy (Significant Decrease in Energy Level)
 - Spreading Redness of the Skin around the Incision
 - Yellow or Green Discharge from the Incision
 - Abrupt Increase in Swelling
